announce	Make known make an announcement. <i>I have a confession to make she announced.</i>
be a mark of	Spend or use time.
be a sign of	Spend or use time.
be a symbol of	Happen, occur, take place.
be evidence of	Form or compose.

betray	Reveal unintentionally. <i>The men who have betrayed British people s trust.</i>
bring to mind	Cause to come into a particular state or condition.
conjure up	Engage in plotting or enter into a conspiracy, swear together.
connote	(of a fact) imply as a consequence or condition. <i>Spinsterhood connoted failure.</i>
<u>convey</u>	Transfer to another. <i>Pipes were laid to convey water to the house.</i>
demonstrate	Establish the validity of something, as by an example, explanation or experiment. <i>Their shameful silence demonstrates their ineptitude.</i>
<u>designate</u>	Decree or designate beforehand. <i>The Wye Valley is designated an area of outstanding natural beauty.</i>
<u>exemplify</u>	Illustrate or clarify by giving an example. <i>He exemplified his point with an anecdote.</i>
give away	Give food to.
<u>imply</u>	Suggest that someone is guilty. <i>Salesmen who use jargon to imply superior knowledge.</i>
indicate	Indicate a place direction person or thing either spatially or figuratively. <i>He indicated his opponents.</i>
intimate	Give to understand.
mean	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>I don t know what you mean.</i>
point to	Give a point to.
<u>refer</u>	Of a word phrase or symbol describe or denote have as a referent. <i>The Royal Navy is referred to as the Senior Service.</i>
represent	Be representative or typical for. <i>Abstraction is well represented in this exhibition.</i>
reveal	Make (previously unknown or secret information) known to others. <i>God rarely reveal his plans for Mankind.</i>
show	Show in or as in a picture. <i>I showed the customer the glove section.</i>
signal	Communicate silently and non verbally by signals or signs. <i>The diner signaled the waiters to bring the menu.</i>
<u>signify</u>	Be an indication of. <i>What does his strange behavior signify.</i>

stand for	Occupy a place or location, also metaphorically.
suggest	Suggest the necessity of an intervention in medicine. <i>The temperature wasn't as tropical as the bright sunlight may have suggested.</i>
symbolize	Express indirectly by an image, form, or model; be a symbol. <i>A tendency to symbolize the father as the sun.</i>

Usage Examples of "Denote" as a verb

- 'multi-' denotes 'many.'
- Her smile denoted that she agreed.
- The level of output per firm is denoted by X.
- She denoted her feelings clearly.
- This mark denotes purity and quality.

advert	An advertisement.
allude	(of an artist or a work of art) recall (an earlier work or style) in such a way as to suggest a relationship with it. <i>The photographs allude to Italian Baroque painting.</i>
announce	Announce publicly or officially. <i>I have a confession to make she announced.</i>
asterisk	Mark a word or piece of text with an asterisk. <i>He had asterisked the things about the case that still bothered him.</i>
caret	A mark (, □) placed below the line to indicate a proposed insertion in a text.
definition	Clarity of outline. <i>A question of definition.</i>
display	Attract attention by displaying some body part or posing of animals. <i>She photographed the peacock which chose that moment to display.</i>
explain	Minimize the significance of an embarrassing fact or action by giving an excuse or justification. <i>They explained that their lives centred on the religious rituals.</i>
express	By express. <i>He expressed complete satisfaction.</i>
figuratively	Used to indicate a departure from a literal use of words; metaphorically. <i>We left a lot of people literally and figuratively in the dark.</i>

gesticulate	Use gestures, especially dramatic ones, instead of speaking or to emphasize one's words. <i>They were shouting and gesticulating frantically at drivers who did not slow down.</i>
imply	Have as a necessary feature. <i>Salesmen who use jargon to imply superior knowledge.</i>
indicant	Something that serves to indicate or suggest. <i>Symptoms are the prime indicants of disease.</i>
indicate	Indicate a place direction person or thing either spatially or figuratively. <i>Indicated his wishes in a letter.</i>
insinuate	Introduce or insert (oneself) in a subtle manner. <i>I insinuated my shoulder in the gap.</i>
intend	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>What do his words intend.</i>
mark	A figure or letter representing the total number of marks awarded in an examination or competition and signifying a person's score. <i>It was in London that he made his mark.</i>
mean	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>This one meant to be priceless.</i>
mention	An instance of being mentioned in dispatches. <i>She made no mention of her disastrous trip to Paris.</i>
notation	A note or annotation. <i>New terminologies and notations.</i>
note	Make a written note of. <i>There was a note of uncertainty in his voice.</i>
quotation	A short musical passage or visual image taken from one piece of music or work of art and used in another. <i>The company is being refused a quotation on the New York Stock Exchange.</i>
quote	A passage or expression that is quoted or cited. <i>A garage quoted him 30.</i>
refer	Make reference to. <i>The star refers to items which are intended for the advanced learner.</i>
remark	Say something as a comment; mention. <i>Tom's looking peaky she remarked.</i>
saying	A collection of short, pithy expressions identified with a particular person, especially a political or religious leader. <i>This is stated in the sayings of the Prophet.</i>

- signify** Be an indication of.
*I wasn't **signifying** at her.*
- symbolic** Involving the use of symbols or symbolism.
Symbolic *thinking.*
- tell** Inform positively and with certainty and confidence.
*I couldn't **tell** if he believed me.*
- verbalize** Express in speech.
*This lawyer **verbalizes** and is rather tedious.*
