## Denotes as a Verb

### Definitions of "Denotes" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “denotes” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Make known; make an announcement.*
- *Be a sign or indication of.*
- *Have as a meaning.*

### Synonyms of "Denotes" as a verb (2 Words)

**announce** Make known make an announcement.  
*I have a confession to make she **announced**.*

**refer** Of a word phrase or symbol describe or denote have as a referent.  
*Her mother never **referred** to him again.*

### Usage Examples of "Denotes" as a verb

- *She denoted her feelings clearly.*
- *`multi-' denotes `many.*
- *Her smile denoted that she agreed.*

## Associations of "Denotes" (30 Words)

<b>advert</b>	An advertisement.
<b>allude</b>	Suggest or call attention to indirectly; hint at. <i>The photographs <b>allude</b> to Italian Baroque painting.</i>
<b>announce</b>	Announce publicly or officially. <i>He <b>announced</b> the winners of the spelling bee.</i>
<b>asterisk</b>	Mark a word or piece of text with an asterisk. <i>He had <b>asterisked</b> the things about the case that still bothered him.</i>
<b>caret</b>	A mark used by an author or editor to indicate where something is to be inserted into a text.
<b>definition</b>	The capacity of a device to make images distinct in outline. <i>A dictionary <b>definition</b> of the verb.</i>
<b>display</b>	Attract attention by displaying some body part or posing of animals. <i>Made a <b>display</b> of strength.</i>
<b>explain</b>	Make plain and comprehensible. <i>He makes athletes <b>explain</b> why they made a mistake.</i>
<b>express</b>	Give expression to. <i>An <b>express</b> shipment.</i>
<b>figuratively</b>	In a figurative sense. <i>I did bump into <b>figuratively</b> speaking quite a few interesting people.</i>
<b>gesticulate</b>	Use gestures, especially dramatic ones, instead of speaking or to emphasize one's words. <i>They were shouting and <b>gesticulating</b> frantically at drivers who did not slow down.</i>
<b>imply</b>	Have as a necessary feature. <i>Salesmen who use jargon to <b>imply</b> superior knowledge.</i>
<b>indicant</b>	A number or ratio (a value on a scale of measurement) derived from a series of observed facts; can reveal relative changes as a function of time. <i>Symptoms are the prime <b>indicants</b> of disease.</i>
<b>indicate</b>	Indicate a place direction person or thing either spatially or figuratively. <i>Tetracycline is <b>indicated</b> in such cases.</i>
<b>insinuate</b>	Slide (oneself or a thing) slowly and smoothly into a particular place. <i>He <b>insinuated</b> himself into the king's confidence.</i>
<b>intend</b>	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>What do his words <b>intend</b>.</i>

<b>mark</b>	Insert punctuation marks into. <i>Mark my words.</i>
<b>mean</b>	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>An example sentence would show what this word <b>means</b>.</i>
<b>mention</b>	Make mention of. <i>She made no <b>mention</b> of her disastrous trip to Paris.</i>
<b>notation</b>	A note or annotation. <i>New terminologies and <b>notations</b>.</i>
<b>note</b>	A banknote. <i>He <b>noted</b> down her address on a piece of paper.</i>
<b>quotation</b>	A price offered by a market-maker for the sale or purchase of a stock or other security. <i>A great argument with much <b>quotation</b> of Darwin.</i>
<b>quote</b>	Put quote marks around. <i>He <b>quoted</b> the Bible to her.</i>
<b>refer</b>	Of a word phrase or symbol describe or denote have as a referent. <i>This plant can be <b>referred</b> to a known species.</i>
<b>remark</b>	Regard with attention; notice. <i>I decided to ignore his rude <b>remarks</b>.</i>
<b>saying</b>	A collection of short, pithy expressions identified with a particular person, especially a political or religious leader. <i>This is stated in the <b>sayings</b> of the Prophet.</i>
<b>signify</b>	Be an indication of. <i>I wasn't <b>signifying</b> at her.</i>
<b>symbolic</b>	Significant purely in terms of what is being represented or implied. <i><b>Symbolic</b> thinking.</i>
<b>tell</b>	Perceive (the difference between one person or thing and another). <i>He's <b>telling</b> the truth.</i>
<b>verbalize</b>	Be verbose. <i>This lawyer <b>verbalizes</b> and is rather tedious.</i>
