## Associations of "Depended" (30 Words)

<b>addicted</b>	Physically and mentally dependent on a particular substance. <i><b>Addicted</b> to cocaine.</i>
<b><a href="#">beholden</a></b>	Under a moral obligation to someone. <i>I don't like to be <b>beholden</b> to anybody.</i>
<b>believe</b>	Follow a credo have a faith be a believer. <i>I <b>believe</b> we've already met.</i>
<b>centrality</b>	The state of being accessible from a variety of places. <i>The <b>centrality</b> and sovereignty of the state.</i>
<b>condition</b>	Apply a conditioner to the hair. <i>I <b>condition</b> my hair regularly.</i>
<b>confidence</b>	The telling of private matters or secrets with mutual trust. <i>She's brimming with <b>confidence</b>.</i>
<b>confiding</b>	Willing to tell someone about a secret or private matter and trust them not to repeat it to others. <i>She was in a <b>confiding</b> mood.</i>
<b>constitutive</b>	Forming a part or constituent of something. <i>Poverty is a <b>constitutive</b> element of a particular form of economic growth.</i>
<b>context</b>	The circumstances that form the setting for an event, statement, or idea, and in terms of which it can be fully understood. <i>The proposals need to be considered in the <b>context</b> of new European directives.</i>
<b>credibility</b>	The quality of being trusted and believed in. <i>The book's anecdotes have scant regard for <b>credibility</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">credible</a></b>	Able to be believed; convincing. <i>She was not the <b>credible</b> fool he expected.</i>
<b>credit</b>	The money lent or borrowed under a credit arrangement. <i>We <b>credited</b> her for saving our jobs.</i>

<u>credulity</u>	A tendency to be too ready to believe that something is real or true. <i>Moneylenders prey upon their <b>credulity</b> and inexperience.</i>
<b>crucially</b>	With decisive or vital importance. <i>Both movies are <b>crucially</b> dependent on the performance of the male lead.</i>
<u>dependence</u>	Being abnormally tolerant to and dependent on something that is psychologically or physically habit-forming (especially alcohol or narcotic drugs). <i>The <b>dependence</b> of our medical schools on grant funds.</i>
<b>dependent</b>	Held from above. <i>An economy heavily <b>dependent</b> on oil exports.</i>
<b>entirely</b>	Completely (often used for emphasis). <i><b>Entirely</b> satisfied with the meal.</i>
<u>factor</u>	Be a contributing factor. <i>His skill was a <b>factor</b> in ensuring that so much was achieved.</i>
<u>interdependent</u>	Mutually dependent. <i>We in Europe are all increasingly <b>interdependent</b>.</i>
<b>mutually</b>	With mutual action; in a mutual relationship. <i>Adoption and fostering are not necessarily <b>mutually</b> exclusive alternatives.</i>
<b>pendent</b>	Held from above and hanging down. <i>The use of jurisdiction to decide <b>pendent</b> claims.</i>
<u>recourse</u>	Something or someone turned to for assistance or security. <i>The bank has <b>recourse</b> against the exporter for losses incurred.</i>
<u>reliance</u>	A person or thing on which someone depends. <i>The farmer s <b>reliance</b> on pesticides.</i>
<b>reliant</b>	Dependent on someone or something. <i>The company is heavily <b>reliant</b> on the baby market.</i>
<u>rely</u>	Depend on with full trust or confidence. <i>The charity has to <b>rely</b> <b>entirely</b> on public donations.</i>
<b>symbiotic</b>	Denoting a mutually beneficial relationship between different people or groups. <i>The reader can have a <b>symbiotic</b> relationship with the writer.</i>
<b>trust</b>	An organization or company managed by trustees. <i>He betrayed their <b>trust</b>.</i>
<b>trustful</b>	Having or marked by a total belief in the reliability, truth, or ability of someone. <i>A <b>trustful</b> acceptance of authority.</i>

**trusting**

Inclined to believe or confide readily; full of trust.  
*It is foolish to be too **trusting** of other people.*

**uncritical**

Marked by disregard for critical standards or procedures.  
***Uncritical** reasoning.*
