characterisation A graphic or vivid verbal description.

Acting the part of a character on stage; dramatically representing the character by speech and action and gesture.

characterization *She rejected that **characterization** of her film.*

delineation A graphic or vivid verbal description.

*The artist s exquisite **delineation** of costume and jewellery.*

depicting A representation by picture or portraiture.

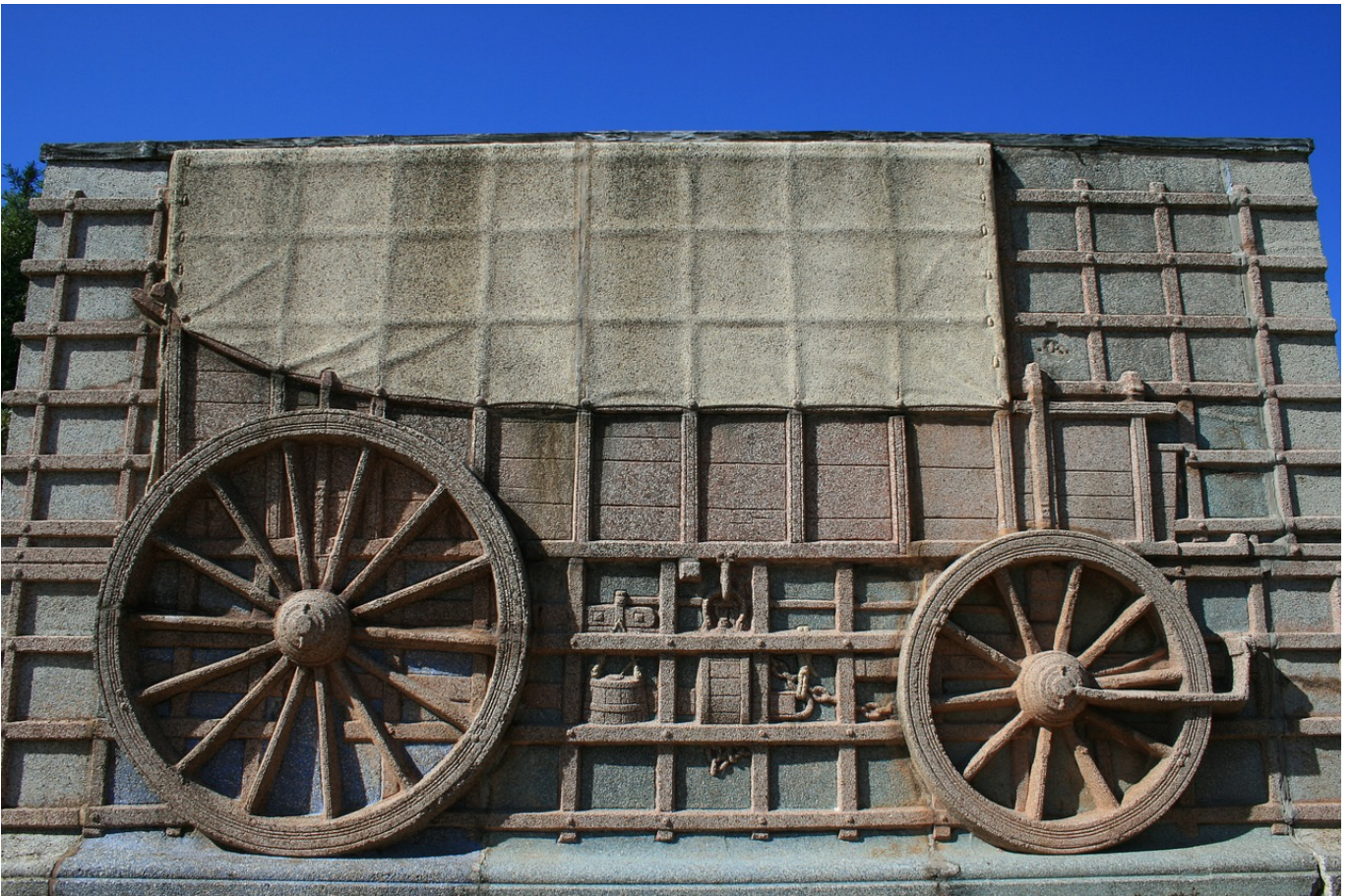
limning A drawing of the outlines of forms or objects.

line drawing A mark that is long relative to its width.

A visual representation (of an object or scene or person or abstraction) produced on a surface.

picture *They could still receive the sound but the **picture** was gone.*

portrayal	A description of someone or something in a particular way; a representation. <i>The media portrayal of immigration.</i>
portraying	A representation by picture or portraiture.
word picture	The divine word of God; the second person in the Trinity (incarnate in Jesus).
word-painting	A graphic or vivid verbal description.

<u>characterization</u>	A description of the distinctive nature or features of someone or something. <i>The pamphlet contained brief characterizations of famous Vermonters.</i>
cinematic	Having qualities characteristic of films. <i>The cinematic feel of their video.</i>

daguerreotype	A photograph made by an early photographic process; the image was produced on a silver plate sensitized to iodine and developed in mercury vapor.
define	Give the meaning of (a word or phrase), especially in a dictionary. <i>The river defines the park s boundary.</i>
delineate	Indicate the exact position of (a border or boundary). <i>His finger found a precisely outlined section delineated in red marker.</i>
delineation	A graphic or vivid verbal description. <i>The artist s exquisite delineation of costume and jewellery.</i>
depict	Make a portrait of. <i>These equations may be depicted on a graph.</i>
describe	Give a detailed account in words of. <i>Discreet Italian police described it in a manner typically continental.</i>
description	Sort or variety. <i>It is laughably easy to buy drugs of all descriptions.</i>
draw	Represent by making a drawing of as with a pencil chalk etc on a surface. <i>David she whispered drawing him aside.</i>
elucidate	Make free from confusion or ambiguity; make clear. <i>Work such as theirs will help to elucidate this matter.</i>
expatiate	Add details, as to an account or idea; clarify the meaning of and discourse in a learned way, usually in writing. <i>She expatiated on working class novelists.</i>
explain	Serve as a reason or cause or justification of. <i>The committee explained their plan for fund raising to the Dean.</i>
explanation	A statement that makes something comprehensible by describing the relevant structure or operation or circumstances etc. <i>The explanation was very simple.</i>
exposition	A large public exhibition of art or trade goods. <i>The exposition will feature exhibits by 165 companies.</i>
expository	Serving to expound or set forth. <i>Clean expository writing.</i>
expound	Present and explain (a theory or idea) in detail. <i>The abbess expounded the scriptures to her nuns.</i>
gallery	A covered corridor (especially one extending along the wall of a building and supported with arches or columns). <i>An art gallery.</i>

<u>illustrate</u>	Provide (a book, newspaper, etc.) with pictures. <i>Illustrate a book with drawings.</i>
illustration	A picture illustrating a book, newspaper, etc. <i>By way of illustration I refer to the following case.</i>
<u>interpret</u>	Give an interpretation or explanation to. <i>I agreed to interpret for Jean Claude.</i>
<u>interpretation</u>	A mental representation of the meaning or significance of something. <i>This action is open to a number of interpretations.</i>
<u>narrative</u>	In the form of or concerned with narration. <i>A narrative poem.</i>
painter	An artist who paints pictures. <i>A German landscape painter.</i>
photography	The occupation of taking and printing photographs or making movies.
picture	Show in or as in a picture. <i>She had her picture painted.</i>
portraiture	A word picture of a person's appearance and character. <i>Ingres is a master of portraiture.</i>
portray	Portray in words. <i>The book portrayed him as a self serving careerist.</i>
portrayal	A description of someone or something in a particular way; a representation. <i>The media portrayal of immigration.</i>
<u>snapshot</u>	A record of the contents of a storage location or data file at a given time. <i>My snapshots haven't been developed yet.</i>
