Derivatives as a Noun

Definitions of "Derivatives" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “derivatives” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A financial instrument whose value is based on another security.*
- *The result of mathematical differentiation; the instantaneous change of one quantity relative to another; $df(x)/dx$.*
- *A compound obtained from, or regarded as derived from, another compound.*
- *A word that is derived from another word.*
- *(linguistics) a word that is derived from another word.*



Synonyms of "Derivatives" as a noun (4 Words)

derivative instrument A word that is derived from another word.

differential

A difference in wages between industries or between categories of employees in the same industry.

*Regional **differentials** in pay.*

differential coefficient A quality that differentiates between similar things.

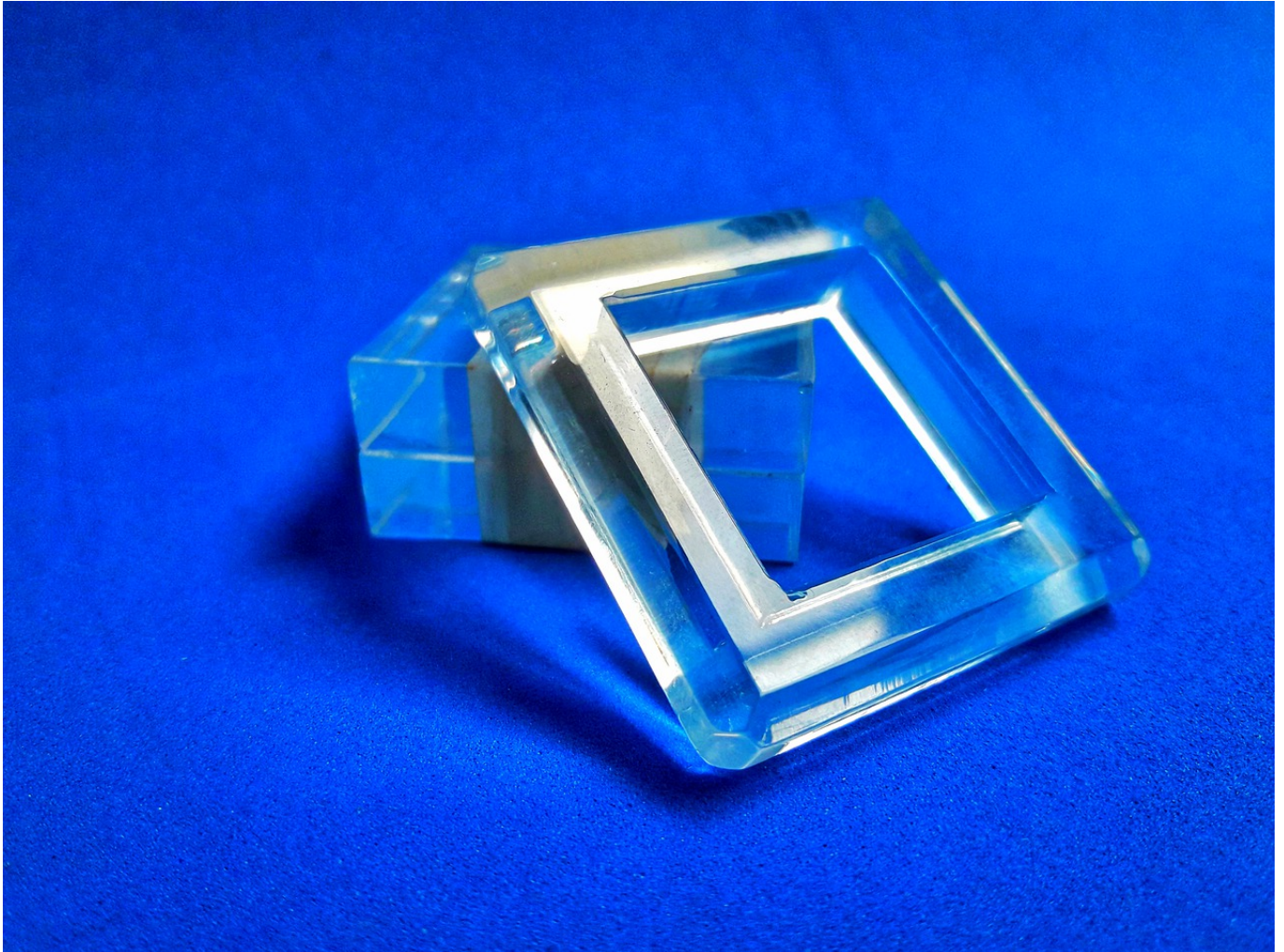
first derivative

Associations of "Derivatives" (30 Words)

- adjective** Of or relating to or functioning as an adjective.
Adjective law.
- adverb** A word or phrase that modifies or qualifies an adjective verb or other adverb or a word group expressing a relation of place time circumstance manner cause degree etc e g gently quite then there.
- alphabet** The elementary stages of any subject (usually plural).
*DNA s 4 letter **alphabet**.*
- antonym** A word that expresses a meaning opposed to the meaning of another word in which case the two words are antonyms of each other.
*To him the **antonym** of gay was depressed.*

append	Add (something) to the end of a written document. <i>He appended a glossary to his novel where he used an invented language.</i>
archaism	The use or conscious imitation of archaic styles or features in language or art. <i>Mozart s use of archaism.</i>
capitalize	Write or print (a word or letter) in capital letters. <i>People should have the right to capitalize part of the value of these benefits.</i>
clause	A unit of grammatical organization next below the sentence in rank and in traditional grammar said to consist of a subject and predicate.
conjunction	The grammatical relation between linguistic units words or phrases or clauses that are connected by a conjunction. <i>The planet reached conjunction with the sun.</i>
derivation	A line of reasoning that shows how a conclusion follows logically from accepted propositions. <i>The derivation of scientific laws from observation.</i>
determiner	An argument that is conclusive.
grammatical	Conforming to the rules of grammar or usage accepted by native speakers. <i>Grammatical rules.</i>
homograph	Two words are homographs if they are spelled the same way but differ in meaning e g fair.
indicative	The indicative mood. <i>Indicative mood.</i>
infinitive	Having or involving the basic form of a verb. <i>Infinitive clauses.</i>
inflect	Of a word or language undergo inflection. <i>Arabic verbs are inflected for person number and gender.</i>
lexicon	The complete set of meaningful units in a language. <i>A Greek Latin lexicon.</i>
noun	A word other than a pronoun used to identify any of a class of people places or things common noun or to name a particular one of these proper noun.
paragraph	Arrange a piece of writing in paragraphs. <i>All her friends were paragraphed in last Monday s paper.</i>
participle	A word formed from a verb e g going gone being been and used as an adjective e g working woman burnt toast or a noun e g good breeding In English participles are also used to make compound verb forms e g is going has been.

phrase	Divide combine or mark into phrases. <i>It s important to phrase the question correctly.</i>
predicate	What is predicated of the subject of a proposition the second term in a proposition is predicated of the first term by means of the copula. <i>Aggression is predicated of those who act aggressively.</i>
prefix	Add something at the beginning as a prefix or introduction. <i>A preface is prefixed to the book.</i>
pronoun	A function word that is used in place of a noun or noun phrase.
suffix	Append something especially as a suffix. <i>Suffix words.</i>
suggestive	Tending to suggest an idea. <i>Artifacts suggestive of an ancient society.</i>
verb	Use a word that is not conventionally used as a verb typically a noun as a verb. <i>Any English noun can be verbed but some are more resistant than others.</i>
vocabulary	A list of difficult or unfamiliar words with an explanation of their meanings, accompanying a piece of specialist or foreign-language text. <i>The term became part of business vocabulary.</i>
vowel	A letter of the alphabet standing for a spoken vowel.
word	A word is a string of bits stored in computer memory. <i>I don t like the word unofficial.</i>
