
Derogation as a Noun

exoneration The action of officially absolving someone from blame; vindication.

The defendants eventual **exoneration**.

freedom The state of not being subject to or affected by (something undesirable.

He was a champion of Irish freedom.

The ability of an organism to resist a particular infection or toxin by the

immunity action of specific antibodies or sensitized white blood cells.

He was granted **immunity** from prosecution.

indemnity Legal exemption from liability for damages.

A deed of **indemnity**.

release A document effecting a release of property money etc. A new release from the London Symphony Orchestra.

A representation of relief given by an arrangement of line or colour or

relief shading.

The contributions provided some **relief** for the victims.
