Definitions of "Derogation" as a noun

- *An exemption from or relaxation of a rule or law.*
- *(law) the partial taking away of the effectiveness of a law; a partial repeal or abolition of a law.*
- *The perception or treatment of someone or something as being of little worth.*
- *The partial taking away of the effectiveness of a law; a partial repeal or abolition of a law.*



Synonyms of "Derogation" as a noun (12 Words)

absolution	Formal release from guilt, obligation, or punishment. <i>Absolution from the sentence.</i>
depreciation	A communication that belittles somebody or something. <i>A currency depreciation.</i>
disparagement	A communication that belittles somebody or something.
dispensation	The action of distributing or supplying something. <i>He received papal dispensation to hold a number of benefices.</i>
exception	A deliberate act of omission. <i>He always plays top tunes and tonight was no exception.</i>
<u>exclusion</u>	The process of excluding or the state of being excluded. <i>Exclusions can be added to your policy.</i>

exoneration	The action of officially absolving someone from blame; vindication. <i>The defendants eventual exoneration.</i>
<u>freedom</u>	The state of not being subject to or affected by (something undesirable). <i>He was a champion of Irish freedom.</i>
immunity	The ability of an organism to resist a particular infection or toxin by the action of specific antibodies or sensitized white blood cells. <i>He was granted immunity from prosecution.</i>
indemnity	Legal exemption from liability for damages. <i>A deed of indemnity.</i>
release	A document effecting a release of property money etc. <i>A new release from the London Symphony Orchestra.</i>
relief	A representation of relief given by an arrangement of line or colour or shading. <i>The contributions provided some relief for the victims.</i>
