- *(of a place) empty of people.*



Synonyms of "Deserted" as an adjective (2 Words)

abandoned Free from constraint- Liam O'Flaherty.
*Weed grown yard of an **abandoned** farmhouse.*

derelict Forsaken by owner or inhabitants.
*A **derelict** Georgian mansion.*



Usage Examples of "Deserted" as an adjective

- *Deserted beaches of soft sand.*



Associations of "Deserted" (30 Words)

- abandoned** Forsaken by owner or inhabitants.
*An **abandoned** car.*
- countermand** An order revoking a previous one.
*I forthwith mounted and went off lest I should receive a **countermand**.*
- derelict** A ship or other piece of property abandoned by the owner and in poor condition.
*He was **derelict** in his duty to his country.*
- dilapidated** (of a building or object) in a state of disrepair or ruin as a result of age or neglect.
*The tank was now rather **dilapidated**.*
- disrepair** Poor condition of a building or structure due to neglect.
*The station gradually fell into **disrepair**.*

drain	Empty of liquid drain the liquid from. <i>A drain of young talent by emigration.</i>
<u>emptiness</u>	The quality of having no value or purpose; futility. <i>Feelings of emptiness and loneliness.</i>
<u>empty</u>	Become empty or void of its content. <i>Her life felt empty and meaningless.</i>
famish	Die of food deprivation. <i>They had famished the city into surrender.</i>
<u>forlorn</u>	Pitifully sad and abandoned or lonely. <i>A forlorn cause.</i>
hollow	A depression hollowed out of solid matter. <i>A hollow metal tube.</i>
<u>island</u>	A zone or area resembling an island. <i>This island nation.</i>
isolated	Marked by separation of or from usually contiguous elements. <i>An isolated pawn.</i>
lave	Wash or flow against. <i>The sea below laved the shore with small agitated waves.</i>
lonely	Without companions; solitary. <i>A lonely crossroads.</i>
med	Medicine medication. <i>He d forgotten to take his meds.</i>
<u>nerd</u>	Be or become extremely excited or enthusiastic about a subject, typically one of specialist or minority interest. <i>A computer nerd.</i>
<u>outcast</u>	Excluded from a society. <i>She went from trusted pal to ostracized outcast overnight.</i>
<u>outsider</u>	A competitor, applicant, etc. thought to have little chance of success. <i>The winner was Beech Road a fifty to one outsider.</i>
pariah	A person who is rejected (from society or home). <i>They were treated as social pariahs.</i>
ramshackle	In deplorable condition. <i>A ramshackle cottage.</i>
ruined	(of a building or place) reduced to a state of decay, collapse, or disintegration. <i>The nation s ruined economy.</i>

tatterdemalion	Worn to shreds; or wearing torn or ragged clothing. <i>A tatterdemalion prince.</i>
unoccupied	Not leased to or occupied by a tenant. <i>Unoccupied hours.</i>
vacancy	Being unoccupied. <i>A vacancy for a shorthand typist.</i>
<u>vacant</u>	Without an occupant or incumbent. <i>The President resigned and the post was left vacant.</i>
<u>vacate</u>	Leave (a job, post, or position) voluntarily. <i>Rooms must be vacated by noon on the last day of your holiday.</i>
vacuum	Clean with a vacuum cleaner. <i>The room needs to be vacuumed.</i>
<u>vagrant</u>	Relating to or living the life of a vagrant. <i>Vagrant whales.</i>
<u>void</u>	Declare that (something) is not valid or legally binding. <i>Void spaces surround the tanks.</i>
