## Synonyms of "Deserted" as an adjective (2 Words)

**abandoned** Free from constraint- Liam O'Flaherty.  
*Weed grown yard of an **abandoned** farmhouse.*

**derelict** Forsaken by owner or inhabitants.  
*A **derelict** Georgian mansion.*



## Usage Examples of "Deserted" as an adjective

- *Deserted beaches of soft sand.*



## Associations of "Deserted" (30 Words)

- abandoned** Forsaken by owner or inhabitants.  
*An **abandoned** car.*
- countermand** An order revoking a previous one.  
*I forthwith mounted and went off lest I should receive a **countermand**.*
- derelict** A ship or other piece of property abandoned by the owner and in poor condition.  
*He was **derelict** in his duty to his country.*
- dilapidated** (of a building or object) in a state of disrepair or ruin as a result of age or neglect.  
*The tank was now rather **dilapidated**.*
- disrepair** Poor condition of a building or structure due to neglect.  
*The station gradually fell into **disrepair**.*

<b>drain</b>	Empty of liquid drain the liquid from. <i>A <b>drain</b> of young talent by emigration.</i>
<b><u>emptiness</u></b>	The quality of having no value or purpose; futility. <i>Feelings of <b>emptiness</b> and loneliness.</i>
<b><u>empty</u></b>	Become empty or void of its content. <i>Her life felt <b>empty</b> and meaningless.</i>
<b>famish</b>	Die of food deprivation. <i>They had <b>famished</b> the city into surrender.</i>
<b><u>forlorn</u></b>	Pitifully sad and abandoned or lonely. <i>A <b>forlorn</b> cause.</i>
<b>hollow</b>	A depression hollowed out of solid matter. <i>A <b>hollow</b> metal tube.</i>
<b><u>island</u></b>	A zone or area resembling an island. <i>This <b>island</b> nation.</i>
<b>isolated</b>	Marked by separation of or from usually contiguous elements. <i>An <b>isolated</b> pawn.</i>
<b>lave</b>	Wash or flow against. <i>The sea below <b>laved</b> the shore with small agitated waves.</i>
<b>lonely</b>	Without companions; solitary. <i>A <b>lonely</b> crossroads.</i>
<b>med</b>	Medicine medication. <i>He d forgotten to take his <b>meds</b>.</i>
<b><u>nerd</u></b>	Be or become extremely excited or enthusiastic about a subject, typically one of specialist or minority interest. <i>A computer <b>nerd</b>.</i>
<b><u>outcast</u></b>	Excluded from a society. <i>She went from trusted pal to ostracized <b>outcast</b> overnight.</i>
<b><u>outsider</u></b>	A competitor, applicant, etc. thought to have little chance of success. <i>The winner was Beech Road a fifty to one <b>outsider</b>.</i>
<b>pariah</b>	A person who is rejected (from society or home). <i>They were treated as social <b>pariahs</b>.</i>
<b>ramshackle</b>	In deplorable condition. <i>A <b>ramshackle</b> cottage.</i>
<b>ruined</b>	(of a building or place) reduced to a state of decay, collapse, or disintegration. <i>The nation s <b>ruined</b> economy.</i>

<b>tatterdemalion</b>	Worn to shreds; or wearing torn or ragged clothing. <i>A <b>tatterdemalion</b> prince.</i>
<b>unoccupied</b>	Not leased to or occupied by a tenant. <i><b>Unoccupied</b> hours.</i>
<b>vacancy</b>	Being unoccupied. <i>A <b>vacancy</b> for a shorthand typist.</i>
<b><u>vacant</u></b>	Without an occupant or incumbent. <i>The President resigned and the post was left <b>vacant</b>.</i>
<b><u>vacate</u></b>	Leave (a job, post, or position) voluntarily. <i>Rooms must be <b>vacated</b> by noon on the last day of your holiday.</i>
<b>vacuum</b>	Clean with a vacuum cleaner. <i>The room needs to be <b>vacuumed</b>.</i>
<b><u>vagrant</u></b>	Relating to or living the life of a vagrant. <i><b>Vagrant</b> whales.</i>
<b><u>void</u></b>	Declare that (something) is not valid or legally binding. <i><b>Void</b> spaces surround the tanks.</i>
