The police laid the **blame** on the driver.

An outcome (good or bad) that is well deserved and fitting. comeuppance

He got his **comeuppance** in the end.

Present as suitable for approval or acceptance recommend. commend

Commend me to my son and bid him rule better than I.

Deserving praise.

commendable A commendable sense of purpose.

Express respect or esteem for. **compliment**

Carry my compliments to your kinsmen.

As deserved. deservedly

They are top of the league and **deservedly** so.

(often used ironically) worthy of being treated in a particular way.

deserving The **deserving** poor.

A desirable person or thing. desirable

A **desirable** outcome.

Praise, glorify, or honor. exalt

The party will continue to **exalt** their hero.



Praise, glorify, or honor. extol

He **extol**led the virtues of the Russian peoples.

Praise glorify or honor. glorify

You are **glorify**ing a rather mediocre building.

justly We can **justly** be proud of our achievements.

Praise and honour received for an achievement. **kudos**

She was looking for **kudos** rather than profit.

All glory **laud** and honour to Thee Redeemer King.

(of an action, idea, or aim) deserving praise and commendation. laudable

Laudable motives of improving housing conditions.

Any admirable quality or attribute. merit

The results have been encouraging enough to **merit** further investigation.

Properly deserved.

(of an action or claim) likely to succeed on the merits of the case. meritorious

A lifetime of **meritorious** service.

Express warm approval or admiration of.

praise The parents **praise**d their children for their academic performance.

Deserving approval and admiration. praiseworthy

The government s **praiseworthy** efforts.

Of high worth or cost. precious

Children are **precious**.

Having incalculable monetary, intellectual, or spiritual worth. priceless

Darling you re **priceless**.

Characterized by socially or conventionally acceptable morals. respectable

A perfectly **respectable** pair of pyjamas.

In accordance with justice or what is morally right. rightly
