The action of giving a name to someone or something.

### **appellative**

A common noun, such as 'doctor', 'mother', or 'sir', used as a vocative.

### **appointment**

Law the act of disposing of property by virtue of the power of appointment.

*Government ministers and other political **appointments** are frequently replaced.*

### **assignment**

A task or piece of work allocated to someone as part of a job or course of study.

*An **assignment** of leasehold property.*

### **choice**

A range of possibilities from which one or more may be chosen.

*I had to do it I had no **choice**.*

### **classification**

The action or process of classifying something.

*The **classification** of disease according to symptoms.*

<b>classing</b>	A body of students who are taught together.
<b>defining</b>	Any process serving to define the shape of something.
<b>definition</b>	The action or process of defining something. <i>Exercise had given his muscles superior <b>definition</b>.</i>
<b><u>denomination</u></b>	The face value of a banknote, coin, or postage stamp. <i>Two cards of the same <b>denomination</b>.</i>
<b>earmarking</b>	A distinctive characteristic or attribute.
<b>election</b>	The action of electing or the fact of being elected. <i>The 1860 presidential <b>election</b>.</i>
<b>honorific</b>	An expression of respect. <i>The Japanese use many <b>honorifics</b>.</i>
<b>identification</b>	A person's sense of identity with someone or something. <i>Do you have any <b>identification</b>.</i>
<b>label</b>	A classifying phrase or name applied to a person or thing, especially one that is inaccurate or restrictive. <i>Price <b>labels</b>.</i>
<b>labelling</b>	An identifying or descriptive marker that is attached to an object.
<b>naming</b>	The verbal act of naming. <i>The part he failed was the <b>naming</b> of state capitals.</i>
<b>nomination</b>	The act of officially naming a candidate. <i>There was keen competition for the <b>nomination</b>.</i>
<b>particularization</b>	An individualized description of a particular instance.
<b>picking</b>	The act of picking crops or fruit or hops etc. <i>He sent the first <b>picking</b> of berries to the market.</i>
<b>pinpointing</b>	A very brief moment.
<b>selection</b>	A plot of land acquired by selection. <i>Blocks ranging in area from 158 to 3 102 acres have been thrown open for <b>selection</b>.</i>
<b>specification</b>	(patent law) a document drawn up by the applicant for a patent of invention that provides an explicit and detailed description of the nature and use of an invention. <i>One of the telescope s mirrors had been manufactured to incorrect <b>specifications</b>.</i>
<b><u>stipulation</u></b>	An agreement or concession made by parties in a judicial proceeding (or by their attorneys) relating to the business before the court; must be in writing unless they are part of the court record. <i>A <b>stipulation</b> of fact was made in order to avoid delay.</i>

**title**

A heading that names a statute or legislative bill; may give a brief summary of the matters it deals with.

*He looked for books with the word jazz in the **title**.*

- *Quality designations such as 'Premier Cru.'*
- *A leader's designation of his own successor.*

<b>candidate</b>	A person or thing regarded as suitable for or likely to receive a particular fate, treatment, or position. <i>She was the perfect <b>candidate</b> for a biography.</i>
<b>commissioned</b>	Given official approval to act. <i><b>Commissioned</b> broker.</i>
<b>commissioner</b>	A member of a commission. <i>A baseball <b>commissioner</b>.</i>
<b>delegate</b>	A person sent or authorized to represent others, in particular an elected representative sent to a conference. <i>Edward was <b>delegated</b> to meet new arrivals.</i>
<b>denominate</b>	(of sums of money) be expressed in a specified monetary unit. <i>Two principal types of word associates can be <b>denominated</b> paradigmatic and syntagmatic.</i>
<b><u>designate</u></b>	Decree or designate beforehand. <i>The Wye Valley is <b>designated</b> an area of outstanding natural beauty.</i>
<b>distribute</b>	Cause to be distributed. <i>The journal is <b>distributed</b> worldwide.</i>
<b>excellency</b>	An outstanding feature; something in which something or someone excels. <i>The characteristic excellencies of Wordsworth's poetry are listed.</i>
<b>inaugural</b>	An inaugural speech especially one made by an incoming US president. <i>His <b>inaugural</b> concert as Music Director.</i>
<b>mayor</b>	The head of a city government.
<b>minister</b>	Act as a minister of religion. <i>Bishops in England were faced with a loss of priests to <b>minister</b> the sacraments.</i>
<b><u>name</u></b>	Mention by name. <i>She decided to <b>name</b> the child Edward.</i>
<b>nominate</b>	Put forward nominate for appointment to an office or for an honor or position. <i>The <b>nominate</b> race and two subspecies occur.</i>
<b>ordain</b>	(of God or fate) decide (something) in advance. <i>The king <b>ordained</b> that these courts should be revived.</i>
<b>ordained</b>	Fixed or established especially by order or command. <i>An <b>ordained</b> priest.</i>

<b>president</b>	The office of the United States head of state. <i>The Irish <b>president</b>.</i>
<b>reassign</b>	Appoint (someone) to a different post or role. <i>He ordered the ministries to <b>reassign</b> the vehicles.</i>
<b>reconfirm</b>	Confirm again. <i>Berghofer resigned but was <b>reconfirmed</b> as mayor of Dresden shortly afterwards.</i>
<b>reservation</b>	A district that is reserved for particular purpose. <i>Do you have a <b>reservation</b>.</i>
<b>respectfully</b>	Used to express politeness to mitigate the effect of a refusal or disagreement. <i>I <b>respectfully</b> declined their invitation.</i>
<b>successor</b>	A thing or person that immediately replaces something or someone. <i>He was President Lincoln s <b>successor</b>.</i>
