### **Definitions of "Desired" as an adjective**

## Synonyms of "Desired" as an adjective (1 Word)

**craved** Wanted intensely.

*The child could no longer resist taking one of the **craved** cookies.*



## Usage Examples of "Desired" as an adjective

- *It produced the desired effect.*
- *The bribe had its desired effect.*



## Associations of "Desired" (30 Words)

- acquisitive** Excessively interested in acquiring money or material things.  
*An **acquisitive** society in which the craving for material things seems never satisfied.*
- aspiration** A manner of articulation involving an audible release of breath.  
*Bathing solutions were changed by careful **aspiration**.*
- aspire** Have an ambitious plan or a lofty goal.  
*Other people will **aspire** to be like you.*
- covet** Wish, long, or crave for (something, especially the property of another person).  
*She **covets** her sister's house.*
- covetous** Showing extreme cupidity; painfully desirous of another's advantages.  
*Casting **covetous** eyes on his neighbor's fields.*
- crave** Feel a powerful desire for (something).  
*If only she had shown her daughter the love she **craved**.*

<b>craving</b>	A powerful desire for something. <i>A <b>craving</b> for chocolate.</i>
<b>desideratum</b>	Something that is needed or wanted. <i>Integrity was a <b>desideratum</b>.</i>
<b>desirous</b>	Having or expressing desire for something. <i>The Pope was <b>desirous</b> of peace in Europe.</i>
<b>eagerly</b>	Used to emphasize a strong desire to do or have something. <i>Fans of the show are <b>eagerly</b> awaiting the new season.</i>
<b>envious</b>	Showing extreme cupidity; painfully desirous of another's advantages. <i><b>Envious</b> of their art collection.</i>
<b>grasping</b>	Avaricious; greedy. <i>The lecture was beyond his most strenuous <b>graspings</b>.</i>
<b>greedy</b>	Ardently or excessively desirous. <i>He scoffed the lot the <b>greedy</b> pig.</i>
<b>hankering</b>	A yearning for something or to do something. <i>He had a <b>hankering</b> to return to Scotland.</i>
<b>homesickness</b>	A longing to return home. <i>I lived four years in London without a single pang of <b>homesickness</b>.</i>
<b>insatiable</b>	Of a person having an insatiable appetite or desire for something especially sex. <i>So <b>insatiable</b> a gourmand as myself.</i>
<b>jealous</b>	Showing extreme cupidity; painfully desirous of another's advantages. <i>A <b>jealous</b> husband.</i>
<b>jealousy</b>	Zealous vigilance-Paul Blanshard. <i>A sharp pang of <b>jealousy</b>.</i>
<b>long</b>	A long sound such as a long signal in Morse code or a long vowel or syllable. <i>Took a <b>long</b> view of the geopolitical issues.</i>
<b>longing</b>	Prolonged unfulfilled desire or need. <i>Her <b>longing</b> eyes.</i>
<b>prehensile</b>	Having a keen intellect. <i>Many monkeys have long <b>prehensile</b> tails which they use in swinging through the trees.</i>
<b>rapacious</b>	Aggressively greedy or grasping. <i>A <b>rapacious</b> divorcee on the prowl.</i>
<b>ravening</b>	(of a ferocious wild animal) extremely hungry and hunting for prey. <i>They turned on each other like <b>ravening</b> wolves.</i>

<b><u>starve</u></b>	Suffer or die or cause to suffer or die from hunger. <i>The engine was <b>starved</b> of fuel.</i>
<b><u>unquenchable</u></b>	Not able to be quenched. <i>His enthusiasm was <b>unquenchable</b>.</i>
<b><u>voracious</u></b>	Engaging in an activity with great eagerness or enthusiasm. <i>She s a <b>voracious</b> reader.</i>
<b>want</b>	Feel or have a desire for want strongly. <i>Tony <b>wants</b> me in the studio.</i>
<b><u>wish</u></b>	Order politely express a wish for. <i>They <b>wish</b> her every success.</i>
<b><u>yearn</u></b>	Have a desire for something or someone who is not present. <i>They <b>yearned</b> to go home.</i>
<b>yearning</b>	Involving or expressing yearning. <i>He felt a <b>yearning</b> for the mountains.</i>
