Integrity was a **desideratum**.

Fans of the show are **eagerly** awaiting the new season.

Showing extreme cupidity; painfully desirous of another's advantages.

Envious of their art collection.

grasping Avaricious; greedy.

The lecture was beyond his most strenuous **grasping**s.

greedy

Ardently or excessively desirous.

He s scoffed the lot the greedy pig.

hankering A yearning for something or to do something.

He had a **hankering** to return to Scotland.

homesickness A longing to return home.

I lived four years in London without a single pang of **homesickness**.

Of a person having an insatiable appetite or desire for something

<u>insatiable</u> especially sex.

So **insatiable** a gourmand as myself.

jealous Showing extreme cupidity; painfully desirous of another's advantages.

A **jealous** husband.

Jealous Zealous vigilance-Paul Blanshard.

A sharp pang of **jealousy**.

A long sound such as a long signal in Morse code or a long vowel or

long syllable.

Took a **long** view of the geopolitical issues.

Prolonged unfulfilled desire or need.

longing Her longing eyes.

Having a keen intellect.

prehensile Many monkeys have long **prehensile** tails which they use in swinging

through the trees.

rapacious Aggressively greedy or grasping.

A **rapacious** divorcee on the prowl.

ravening (of a ferocious wild animal) extremely hungry and hunting for prey.

They turned on each other like **ravening** wolves.



Suffer or die or cause to suffer or die from hunger. **starve**

The engine was **starve**d of fuel.

Not able to be quenched.

unquenchable

His enthusiasm was unquenchable.

Engaging in an activity with great eagerness or enthusiasm. voracious

She s a **voracious** reader.

Feel or have a desire for want strongly. want

Tony **want**s me in the studio.
