Definitions of "Desired" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “desired” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Wanted intensely.*
- *Strongly wished for or intended.*



Synonyms of "Desired" as an adjective (1 Word)

craved Wanted intensely.

*The child could no longer resist taking one of the **craved** cookies.*



Usage Examples of "Desired" as an adjective

- *It produced the desired effect.*
- *The bribe had its desired effect.*



Associations of "Desired" (30 Words)

- acquisitive** Excessively interested in acquiring money or material things.
*An **acquisitive** society in which the craving for material things seems never satisfied.*
- aspiration** A manner of articulation involving an audible release of breath.
*Bathing solutions were changed by careful **aspiration**.*
- aspire** Have an ambitious plan or a lofty goal.
*Other people will **aspire** to be like you.*
- covet** Wish, long, or crave for (something, especially the property of another person).
*She **covets** her sister's house.*
- covetous** Showing extreme cupidity; painfully desirous of another's advantages.
*Casting **covetous** eyes on his neighbor's fields.*
- crave** Feel a powerful desire for (something).
*If only she had shown her daughter the love she **craved**.*

<u>craving</u>	A powerful desire for something. <i>A craving for chocolate.</i>
desideratum	Something that is needed or wanted. <i>Integrity was a desideratum.</i>
desirous	Having or expressing desire for something. <i>The Pope was desirous of peace in Europe.</i>
<u>eagerly</u>	Used to emphasize a strong desire to do or have something. <i>Fans of the show are eagerly awaiting the new season.</i>
<u>envious</u>	Showing extreme cupidity; painfully desirous of another's advantages. <i>Envious of their art collection.</i>
grasping	Avaricious; greedy. <i>The lecture was beyond his most strenuous graspings.</i>
greedy	Ardently or excessively desirous. <i>He scoffed the lot the greedy pig.</i>
hankering	A yearning for something or to do something. <i>He had a hankering to return to Scotland.</i>
homesickness	A longing to return home. <i>I lived four years in London without a single pang of homesickness.</i>
<u>insatiable</u>	Of a person having an insatiable appetite or desire for something especially sex. <i>So insatiable a gourmand as myself.</i>
<u>jealous</u>	Showing extreme cupidity; painfully desirous of another's advantages. <i>A jealous husband.</i>
jealousy	Zealous vigilance-Paul Blanshard. <i>A sharp pang of jealousy.</i>
<u>long</u>	A long sound such as a long signal in Morse code or a long vowel or syllable. <i>Took a long view of the geopolitical issues.</i>
<u>longing</u>	Prolonged unfulfilled desire or need. <i>Her longing eyes.</i>
prehensile	Having a keen intellect. <i>Many monkeys have long prehensile tails which they use in swinging through the trees.</i>
rapacious	Aggressively greedy or grasping. <i>A rapacious divorcee on the prowl.</i>
ravening	(of a ferocious wild animal) extremely hungry and hunting for prey. <i>They turned on each other like ravening wolves.</i>

<u>starve</u>	Suffer or die or cause to suffer or die from hunger. <i>The engine was starved of fuel.</i>
<u>unquenchable</u>	Not able to be quenched. <i>His enthusiasm was unquenchable.</i>
<u>voracious</u>	Engaging in an activity with great eagerness or enthusiasm. <i>She s a voracious reader.</i>
want	Feel or have a desire for want strongly. <i>Tony wants me in the studio.</i>
<u>wish</u>	Order politely express a wish for. <i>They wish her every success.</i>
<u>yearn</u>	Have a desire for something or someone who is not present. <i>They yearned to go home.</i>
yearning	Involving or expressing yearning. <i>He felt a yearning for the mountains.</i>
