<b>confirmation</b>	Information that confirms or verifies. <i>High unemployment figures were further <b>confirmation</b> that the economy was in recession.</i>
<b>decision</b>	The ability or tendency to make decisions quickly decisiveness. <i>I ll make the <b>decision</b> on my own.</i>
<u><b>deduction</b></u>	Something that is inferred (deduced or entailed or implied). <i>The dividend will be paid without <b>deduction</b> of tax.</i>
<u><b>designation</b></u>	The act of putting a person into a non-elective position. <i>A leader s <b>designation</b> of his own successor.</i>
<b>diagnosis</b>	The identification of the nature of an illness or other problem by examination of the symptoms. <i>Early <b>diagnosis</b> and treatment are essential.</i>
<u><b>discernment</b></u>	The ability to judge well. <i>An astonishing lack of <b>discernment</b>.</i>
<u><b>discovery</b></u>	Something that is discovered. <i>The drug is not a new <b>discovery</b>.</i>
<b>divination</b>	The art or gift of prophecy (or the pretense of prophecy) by supernatural means. <i>The mediums are hired to perform <b>divinations</b>.</i>
<b>establishment</b>	The action of establishing something or being established. <i>Hotels or catering <b>establishments</b>.</i>
<b>finding</b>	The action of finding someone or something. <i>A local doctor reported the <b>finding</b> of numerous dead rats.</i>
<b>fixing</b>	The action of mending or repairing something. <i>Have all the <b>fixings</b> ready before starting.</i>
<b>naming</b>	The verbal act of naming. <i>The part he failed was the <b>naming</b> of state capitals.</i>
<b>nomination</b>	The condition of having been proposed as a suitable candidate for appointment or election. <i>Send your <b>nominations</b> in by 30th November.</i>
<b>prescription</b>	The authoritative recommendation of an action or procedure. <i>I ve got to pick up my <b>prescription</b> from the chemist s.</i>
<b>purpose</b>	The quality of being determined to do or achieve something firmness of purpose. <i>State pensions are considered as earned income for tax <b>purposes</b>.</i>

<b>resoluteness</b>	The trait of being resolute. <i>His <b>resoluteness</b> carried him through the battle.</i>
<b>resolution</b>	Computer science the number of pixels per square inch on a computer generated display the greater the resolution the better the picture. <i>A New Year s <b>resolution</b>.</i>
<b>resolve</b>	A formal resolution by a legislative body or public meeting. <i>She received information that strengthened her <b>resolve</b>.</i>
<b>setting</b>	A piece of metal in which a precious stone or gem is fixed to form a piece of jewellery. <i>A <b>setting</b> of Yevtushenko s bleak poem.</i>
<b>settlement</b>	The process of establishing a settlement or settlements. <i>Most suppliers will offer early <b>settlement</b> discounts.</i>

<b>resourcefulness</b>	The ability to find quick and clever ways to overcome difficulties. <i>A man of great <b>resourcefulness</b>.</i>

*She **selected** a pair of shoes from among the dozen the salesgirl had shown her.*
- unflinching** Not showing fear or hesitation in the face of danger or difficulty.  
*He has shown **unflinching** determination throughout the campaign.*
- valor** The qualities of a hero or heroine; exceptional or heroic courage when facing danger (especially in battle).  
*He received a medal for **valor**.*
- virility** The masculine property of being capable of copulation and procreation.
