- Lower the value or quality of.
- Lose in value.
- Reduce the official value of (a currency) in relation to other currencies.
- Remove the value from; deprive of its value.
- Reduce or underestimate the worth or importance of.







## Synonyms of "Devalue" as a verb (21 Words)

<u>belittle</u>	Cause to seem less serious; play down. She <b>belittle</b> d Amy s riding skills whenever she could.
<u>decry</u>	Publicly denounce. They decried human rights abuses.
<u>defame</u>	Charge falsely or with malicious intent; attack the good name and reputation of someone. <i>He claimed that the article <b>defame</b>d his family.</i>
deflate	Become deflated or flaccid as by losing air. <b>Deflate</b> a balloon.
denigrate	Cause to seem less serious; play down. Doom and gloom merchants who <b>denigrate</b> their own country.
deprecate	(chiefly of a software feature) be usable but regarded as obsolete and best avoided, typically because it has been superseded. <i>This feature is <b>deprecate</b>d and will be removed in later versions.</i>
<u>depreciate</u>	Lose in value. The latest cars will <b>depreciate</b> heavily in the first year.
detract from	Take away a part from; diminish.
devaluate	Reduce or underestimate the worth or importance of. The pound was <b>devaluate</b> d further during the year.
diminish	Cause to seem less impressive or valuable. The pain will gradually <b>diminish</b> .
<u>discredit</u>	Cause (an idea or account) to seem false or unreliable. <i>This newspaper story</i> <b>discredit</b> s the politicians.
disparage	Regard or represent as being of little worth. She <b>disparage</b> d her student s efforts.
make light of	Achieve a point or goal.
<u>minimize</u>	Make small or insignificant. The aim is to <b>minimize</b> costs.
run down	Change from one state to another.
traduce	Speak badly of or tell lies about (someone) so as to damage their reputation. It was regarded as respectable political tactics to <b>traduce</b> him.
treat lightly	Engage in negotiations in order to reach an agreement.



trivialize	Make (something) seem less important, significant, or complex than it really is. The problem was either <b>trivialize</b> d or ignored by teachers.
<u>underestimate</u>	Make too low an estimate of. Don t <b>underestimate</b> the danger of such a raft trip on this river.
underrate	Make too low an estimate of. They vastly <b>underrate</b> their own players.
undervalue	Esteem lightly. The company s assets were <b>undervalue</b> d in its balance sheet.
