## Associations of "Devastatingly" (30 Words)

<b>aftershock</b>	A tremor (or one of a series of tremors) occurring after the main shock of an earthquake.
<b>avalanche</b>	Undergo a rapid increase in conductivity due to an avalanche process. <i>An <b>avalanche</b> of mud.</i>
<b>calamitous</b>	(of events) having extremely unfortunate or dire consequences; bringing ruin. <i>A <b>calamitous</b> defeat.</i>
<b><u>catastrophic</u></b>	Relating to geological catastrophism. <i><b>Catastrophic</b> illness.</i>
<b><u>conflagration</u></b>	A very intense and uncontrolled fire. <i>Tinder dry conditions sparked fears of a <b>conflagration</b> in many drought devastated communities.</i>
<b>crushing</b>	Forceful prevention; putting down by power or authority. <i>Bone <b>crushing</b>.</i>
<b>damage</b>	Inflict damage upon. <i>The car was badly <b>damaged</b> in the accident.</i>
<b>deadly</b>	(of a disease) having a rapid course and violent effect. <i>A series of <b>deadly</b> attacks.</i>
<b><u>destructive</u></b>	Causing destruction or much damage. <i><b>Destructive</b> criticism.</i>
<b><u>detrimental</u></b>	(sometimes followed by `to') causing harm or injury. <i>Moving her could have a <b>detrimental</b> effect on her health.</i>
<b>devastate</b>	Cause (someone) severe and overwhelming shock or grief. <i>She was <b>devastated</b> by the loss of Damian.</i>
<b><u>earthquake</u></b>	Shaking and vibration at the surface of the earth resulting from underground movement along a fault plane or from volcanic activity. <i>A political <b>earthquake</b>.</i>

<b><u>epicenter</u></b>	The point on the Earth's surface directly above the focus of an earthquake.
<b><u>fatal</u></b>	Having momentous consequences; of decisive importance- Saturday Rev. A <b><i>fatal</i></b> accident.
<b><u>harmful</u></b>	Causing or capable of causing harm. <i>Too much sun is <b>harmful</b> to the skin.</i>
<b><u>hazard</u></b>	An obstacle on a golf course. He <b>hazarded</b> a guess.
<b>incapacitate</b>	Deprive (someone) of their legal capacity. He was <b>incapacitated</b> by a heart attack.
<b>injurious</b>	(of language) maliciously insulting; libellous. <i>Food which is <b>injurious</b> to health.</i>
<b>landslide</b>	An overwhelming electoral victory. <i>The road was blocked by a <b>landslide</b>.</i>
<b><u>lethal</u></b>	Of an instrument of certain death. A <b>lethal</b> cocktail of drink and pills.
<b>mortal</b>	A person contrasted with others regarded as being of higher status or ability. <i>The coffin held the <b>mortal</b> remains of her uncle.</i>
<b><u>pernicious</u></b>	Exceedingly harmful. <i>The <b>pernicious</b> influences of the mass media.</i>
<b>ruinous</b>	Extremely harmful; bringing physical or financial ruin. <i>The castle is <b>ruinous</b>.</i>
<b>seismograph</b>	An instrument that measures and records details of earthquakes, such as force and duration.
<b>slayer</b>	Someone who kills a person or animal in a violent way. <i>A dragon <b>slayer</b>.</i>
<b><u>stifling</u></b>	(of heat, air, or a room) very hot and causing difficulties in breathing; suffocating. <b>Stifling</b> heat.
<b>suppression</b>	The absence or non-development of a part or organ that is normally present. <i>The <b>suppression</b> of heresy.</i>
<b><u>toxicity</u></b>	Grave harmfulness or deadliness. <i>She went public with allegations of workplace <b>toxicity</b> and sexism.</i>
