Associations of "Devastatingly" (30 Words)

aftershock	A tremor (or one of a series of tremors) occurring after the main shock of an earthquake.
avalanche	Undergo a rapid increase in conductivity due to an avalanche process. <i>An avalanche of mud.</i>
calamitous	(of events) having extremely unfortunate or dire consequences; bringing ruin. <i>A calamitous defeat.</i>
<u>catastrophic</u>	Relating to geological catastrophism. <i>Catastrophic illness.</i>
<u>conflagration</u>	A very intense and uncontrolled fire. <i>Tinder dry conditions sparked fears of a conflagration in many drought devastated communities.</i>
crushing	Forceful prevention; putting down by power or authority. <i>Bone crushing.</i>
damage	Inflict damage upon. <i>The car was badly damaged in the accident.</i>
deadly	(of a disease) having a rapid course and violent effect. <i>A series of deadly attacks.</i>
<u>destructive</u>	Causing destruction or much damage. <i>Destructive criticism.</i>
<u>detrimental</u>	(sometimes followed by `to') causing harm or injury. <i>Moving her could have a detrimental effect on her health.</i>
devastate	Cause (someone) severe and overwhelming shock or grief. <i>She was devastated by the loss of Damian.</i>
<u>earthquake</u>	Shaking and vibration at the surface of the earth resulting from underground movement along a fault plane or from volcanic activity. <i>A political earthquake.</i>

<u>epicenter</u>	The point on the Earth's surface directly above the focus of an earthquake.
<u>fatal</u>	Having momentous consequences; of decisive importance- Saturday Rev. A <i>fatal</i> accident.
<u>harmful</u>	Causing or capable of causing harm. <i>Too much sun is harmful to the skin.</i>
<u>hazard</u>	An obstacle on a golf course. <i>He hazarded a guess.</i>
incapacitate	Deprive (someone) of their legal capacity. <i>He was incapacitated by a heart attack.</i>
injurious	(of language) maliciously insulting; libellous. <i>Food which is injurious to health.</i>
landslide	An overwhelming electoral victory. <i>The road was blocked by a landslide.</i>
<u>lethal</u>	Of an instrument of certain death. <i>A lethal cocktail of drink and pills.</i>
mortal	A person contrasted with others regarded as being of higher status or ability. <i>The coffin held the mortal remains of her uncle.</i>
<u>pernicious</u>	Exceedingly harmful. <i>The pernicious influences of the mass media.</i>
ruinous	Extremely harmful; bringing physical or financial ruin. <i>The castle is ruinous.</i>
seismograph	An instrument that measures and records details of earthquakes, such as force and duration.
slayer	Someone who kills a person or animal in a violent way. <i>A dragon slayer.</i>
<u>stifling</u>	(of heat, air, or a room) very hot and causing difficulties in breathing; suffocating. <i>Stifling</i> heat.
suppression	The absence or non-development of a part or organ that is normally present. <i>The suppression of heresy.</i>
<u>toxicity</u>	Grave harmfulness or deadliness. <i>She went public with allegations of workplace toxicity and sexism.</i>
