- *Arrange by systematic planning and united effort.*
- *Come up with (an idea, plan, explanation, theory, or principle) after a mental effort.*

cede	Give up (power or territory). <i>In 1874 the islands were ceded to Britain.</i>
<u>coin</u>	Make coins by stamping metal. <i>The company was coining it in at the rate of 90 a second.</i>
come up with	Come to one's mind; suggest itself.
<u>commit</u>	Refer a parliamentary or legislative bill to a committee. <i>You guys would have had me committed.</i>
<u>compose</u>	Form the substance of. <i>She tried to compose herself.</i>
<u>conceive</u>	Become pregnant; undergo conception. <i>Without society an individual cannot be conceived as having rights.</i>
<u>concoct</u>	Make a concoction of by mixing. <i>She began to concoct a dinner likely to appeal to him.</i>

<u>consign</u>	Deliver (something) to a person's keeping. <i>He consigned three paintings to Sotheby's.</i>
construct	Draw with suitable instruments and under specified conditions. <i>A company that constructs oil rigs.</i>
contrive	Put or send forth. <i>They contrived to murder their boss.</i>
<u>convey</u>	Transport or carry to a place. <i>Mr Harvey and his daughter have asked me to convey their very kind regards.</i>
create	Create or manufacture a man made product. <i>He was created a baronet.</i>
design	Create designs. <i>Dupont designs for the house of Chanel.</i>
develop	Cause to grow and differentiate in ways conforming to its natural development. <i>Enabling individuals to develop their personal skills.</i>
draw up	Contract.
dream up	Have a daydream; indulge in a fantasy.
entrust	Put into the care or protection of someone. <i>The messenger was entrusted with the general's secret.</i>
evolve	(with reference to an organism or biological feature) develop over successive generations as a result of natural selection. <i>Each school must evolve its own way of working.</i>
excogitate	Come up with (an idea, plan, explanation, theory, or principle) after a mental effort. <i>All the rubrics forms and functions remained to be excogitated.</i>
fabricate	Invent (something) in order to deceive. <i>You will have to fabricate an exhaust system.</i>
<u>forge</u>	Make a copy of with the intent to deceive. <i>He forged a great suit of black armour.</i>
form	Make or be made into a specific shape or form. <i>Form the dough into balls.</i>
<u>formulate</u>	Create or prepare methodically. <i>Use special effects paints that are formulated for the task.</i>
<u>frame</u>	Enclose in a frame as of a picture. <i>He had had the photo framed.</i>
get up	Evoke an emotional response.

grant	Give as judged due or on the basis of merit. <i>They will grant you asylum.</i>
hand down	Guide or conduct or usher somewhere.
hand on	Guide or conduct or usher somewhere.
<u>invent</u>	Concoct something artificial or untrue. <i>I did not have to invent any tales about my past.</i>
leave	Leave behind unintentionally. <i>The ship leaves at midnight.</i>
leave in one's will	Go and leave behind, either intentionally or by neglect or forgetfulness.
machinate	Engage in plots; scheme. <i>Machinate a plot.</i>
make over	Perform or carry out.
make up	Proceed along a path.
organise	Cause to be structured or ordered or operating according to some principle or idea.
<u>organize</u>	Arrange or form into a living being or tissue. <i>Organize lessons in a planned way.</i>
<u>originate</u>	Come into existence; take on form or shape. <i>A new religious movement originated in that country.</i>
pass on	Be superior or better than some standard.
<u>prepare</u>	To prepare verbally either for written or spoken delivery. <i>Schools should prepare children for life.</i>
produce	Come to have or undergo a change of (physical features and attributes). <i>These chemicals produce a noxious vapor.</i>
put together	Estimate.
think up	Focus one's attention on a certain state.
transfer	Transfer somebody to a different position or location of work. <i>She transferred to the Physics Department.</i>
<u>will</u>	Leave or give by will after one's death. <i>This action was willed and intended.</i>
work out	Provoke or excite.

abstraction	A general concept formed by extracting common features from specific examples. <i>The question cannot be considered in abstraction from the historical context in which it was raised.</i>
artfully	In a disingenuous manner. <i>A dish of artfully arranged fruit.</i>
artwork	Photographs or other visual representations in a printed publication. <i>A collection of artwork from tribal cultures.</i>
begin	Have a beginning of a temporal event. <i>Begin a new chapter in your life.</i>
build	Be engaged in building. <i>Build a defense on nothing but the accused person's reputation.</i>
concept	An idea or mental image which corresponds to some distinct entity or class of entities, or to its essential features, or determines the application of a term (especially a predicate), and thus plays a part in the use of reason or language. <i>A concept car for next month's Geneva motor show.</i>
conception	The way in which something is perceived or regarded. <i>An unfertilized egg before conception.</i>
contrive	Manage to do something foolish or create an undesirable situation. <i>They contrived to murder their boss.</i>
create	Create or manufacture a man-made product. <i>The company was created 25 years ago.</i>
creation	The action or process of bringing something into existence. <i>From its creation the plan was doomed to failure.</i>
creativity	The use of imagination or original ideas to create something; inventiveness. <i>Firms are keen to encourage creativity.</i>
design	Make a design of plan out in systematic often graphic form. <i>The design of a building.</i>
establish	Build or establish something abstract. <i>The right plan would be to establish dummy diamonds.</i>
fabricate	Concoct something artificial or untrue. <i>The company fabricates plastic chairs.</i>

forge	Come up with (an idea, plan, explanation, theory, or principle) after a mental effort. <i>The two women forged a close bond.</i>
formulate	Put into words or an expression. <i>The argument is sufficiently clear that it can be formulated mathematically.</i>
found	Set up or found. <i>The ship was well found and seaworthy.</i>
generate	Give or supply. <i>We can't generate enough power for the entire city.</i>
idea	A personal view. <i>Our menu list will give you some idea of how interesting a low fat diet can be.</i>
innovate	Introduce (something new, especially a product). <i>We continue to innovate new products.</i>
innovation	A creation (a new device or process) resulting from study and experimentation. <i>Innovation is crucial to the continuing success of any organization.</i>
invent	Make up something artificial or untrue. <i>He invented an improved form of the steam engine.</i>
invention	Creative ability. <i>His powers of invention were rather limited.</i>
inventor	Someone who is the first to think of or make something.
make	Make formulate or derive in the mind. <i>Make him an offer he can't refuse.</i>
making	The components needed for making or doing something. <i>She had the makings of a great teacher.</i>
manufacture	Manufactured articles. <i>The manufacture of armoured vehicles.</i>
productive	Relating to or engaged in the production of goods, crops, or other commodities. <i>Many suffixes are common and productive.</i>
reconstruction	A thing that has been rebuilt after being damaged or destroyed. <i>The economic reconstruction of Russia.</i>
scientist	A person who is studying or has expert knowledge of one or more of the natural or physical sciences. <i>A research scientist.</i>
