### Definitions of "Devoted" as an adjective

- *(followed by `to')* dedicated exclusively to a purpose or use.
- *Dedicated exclusively to a purpose or use.*
- *Given over to the display, study, or discussion of.*
- *Zealous in devotion or affection.*
- *Very loving or loyal.*



## Synonyms of "Devoted" as an adjective (9 Words)

<b>committed</b>	In or denoting a long-term emotional relationship. A <b>committed</b> Marxist.
<b>constant</b>	Unvarying in nature. A <b>constant</b> lover.
<b>dedicated</b>	Solemnly dedicated to or set apart for a high purpose. A <b>dedicated</b> high speed rail link from the Channel Tunnel.
<b>devout</b>	Sincerely earnest. She was a <b>devout</b> Catholic.
<b>faithful</b>	True to the facts or the original. <b>Faithful</b> employees.
<b>loyal</b>	Steadfast in allegiance or duty. He remained <b>loyal</b> to the government.
<b>staunch</b>	Firm and dependable especially in loyalty. A <b>staunch</b> Catholic.
<b>steadfast</b>	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. A <b>steadfast</b> ally.
<b>true</b>	Of a compass bearing measured relative to true north. Pythagoras was the first <b>true</b> mathematician.



## Usage Examples of "Devoted" as an adjective

- A life devoted to poetry.
- Devoted friends.
- A devoted husband and father.
- He was a devoted husband.

- *Leo was devoted to his job.*
- *Large sums devoted to the care of the poor.*
- *There is a museum devoted to her work.*



## Associations of "Devoted" (30 Words)

- allegiance** The loyalty that citizens owe to their country (or subjects to their sovereign.  
*Those wishing to receive citizenship must swear **allegiance** to the republic.*
- allegiant** Steadfast in devotion (especially to your lawful monarch or government.  
*It is impossible to be **allegiant** to two opposing forces.*
- chauvinism** Exaggerated or aggressive patriotism.  
*We stand together to stamp out **chauvinism** and bigotry.*
- chauvinistic** Feeling or displaying aggressive or exaggerated patriotism.  
*A **chauvinistic** aggressive brand of nationalism.*
- dedicated** Solemnly dedicated to or set apart for a high purpose.  
***Dedicated** teachers.*

<b>dote</b>	Lavish (someone) with affection or gifts. <i>Having an older brother who <b>dotes</b> you a lot is the best thing ever.</i>
<b>dutiful</b>	Willingly obedient out of a sense of duty and respect. <i>A <b>dutiful</b> citizen.</i>
<b>epigone</b>	An inferior imitator of some distinguished writer, artist, or musician. <i>The humdrum compositions of some of Beethoven's <b>epigones</b>.</i>
<b>exclusively</b>	To the exclusion of others; only. <i>He works for Mr Smith <b>exclusively</b>.</i>
<b><u>faithful</u></b>	Those who are faithful to a particular religion or political party. <i>Employees who had notched up decades of <b>faithful</b> service.</i>
<b>faithfully</b>	In a loyal manner. <i>She translated the novel as <b>faithfully</b> as possible.</i>
<b>follower</b>	A person who takes an active interest in a particular activity. <i>He is a keen <b>follower</b> of football.</i>
<b>henchman</b>	A squire or page of honour to a person of rank. <i>The dictator's <b>henchman</b>.</i>
<b>jingoisism</b>	An appeal intended to arouse patriotic emotions. <i>The popular <b>jingoisism</b> that swept the lower middle classes.</i>
<b>liege</b>	A person holding a fief; a person who owes allegiance and service to a feudal lord. <i>The Scots obeyed him as their <b>liege</b> lord.</i>
<b><u>loyal</u></b>	Inspired by love for your country. <i><b>Loyal</b> subjects.</i>
<b><u>minion</u></b>	A follower or underling of a powerful person, especially a servile or unimportant one. <i>He gets oppressed <b>minions</b> like me to fob them off.</i>
<b>nationalist</b>	Relating to nationalists or nationalism. <i>He was a staunch <b>nationalist</b> during his 22 years in power.</i>
<b><u>patriot</u></b>	An automated surface-to-air missile designed for early detection and interception of incoming missiles or aircraft. <i>A true <b>patriot</b>.</i>
<b>patriotic</b>	Having or expressing devotion to and vigorous support for one's country. <i>Today's game will be played before a fiercely <b>patriotic</b> crowd.</i>
<b>reliable</b>	A reliable person or thing. <i>The supporting cast includes old <b>reliables</b> like Mitchell.</i>
<b><u>solely</u></b>	Without any others being included or involved. <i>Did it <b>solely</b> for money.</i>

- staunch** (of a wall) of strong or firm construction.  
*A **staunch** supporter of the anti nuclear lobby.*
- toady** A pufferfish.  
*She imagined him **toadying** to his rich clients.*
- trusted** Worthy of trust or confidence.  
*A **trusted** adviser.*
- trustful** Inclined to believe or confide readily; full of trust- Nordhoff & Hall.  
*Great brown eye true and **trustful**.*
- trusting** Inclined to believe or confide readily; full of trust.  
*A shy and **trusting** child.*
- trustworthy** Worthy of trust or belief.  
*A **trustworthy** report.*
- underling** A person lower in status or rank.  
*She was shouting orders at **underlings** between gulps of coffee.*
