- Very loving or loyal.








Synonyms of "Devoted" as an adjective (9 Words)

committed	In or denoting a long-term emotional relationship. A committed Marxist.
constant	Unvarying in nature. A constant lover.
dedicated	Solemnly dedicated to or set apart for a high purpose. A dedicated high speed rail link from the Channel Tunnel.
<u>devout</u>	Sincerely earnest. She was a devout Catholic.
<u>faithful</u>	True to the facts or the original. <i>Faithful</i> employees.
<u>loyal</u>	Steadfast in allegiance or duty. <i>He remained loyal to the government.</i>
<u>staunch</u>	Firm and dependable especially in loyalty. A staunch Catholic.
steadfast	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. A steadfast ally.
true	Of a compass bearing measured relative to true north. <i>Pythagoras was the first true mathematician.</i>

- Large sums devoted to the care of the poor.

Associations of "Devoted" (30 Words)

<u>allegiance</u>	The loyalty that citizens owe to their country (or subjects to their sovereign. <i>Those wishing to receive citizenship must swear allegiance</i> to the republic.
allegiant	Steadfast in devotion (especially to your lawful monarch or government. It is impossible to be allegiant to two opposing forces.
<u>chauvinism</u>	Exaggerated or aggressive patriotism. We stand together to stamp out chauvinism and bigotry.
chauvinistic	Feeling or displaying aggressive or exaggerated patriotism. A chauvinistic aggressive brand of nationalism.
dedicated	Solemnly dedicated to or set apart for a high purpose. Dedicated teachers.



dote	Lavish (someone) with affection or gifts. <i>Having an older brother who dotes you a lot is the best thing ever.</i>
dutiful	Willingly obedient out of a sense of duty and respect. A dutiful citizen.
epigone	An inferior imitator of some distinguished writer, artist, or musician. <i>The humdrum compositions of some of Beethoven s</i> epigone s.
exclusively	To the exclusion of others; only. <i>He works for Mr Smith exclusively.</i>
<u>faithful</u>	Those who are faithful to a particular religion or political party. Employees who had notched up decades of faithful service.
faithfully	In a loyal manner. She translated the novel as faithfully as possible.
follower	A person who takes an active interest in a particular activity. <i>He is a keen follower of football.</i>
henchman	A squire or page of honour to a person of rank. <i>The dictator s henchman</i> .
jingoism	An appeal intended to arouse patriotic emotions. The popular jingoism that swept the lower middle classes.
liege	A person holding a fief; a person who owes allegiance and service to a feudal lord. The Scots obeyed him as their liege lord.
<u>loyal</u>	Inspired by love for your country. <i>Loyal subjects.</i>
<u>minion</u>	A follower or underling of a powerful person, especially a servile or unimportant one. <i>He gets oppressed minions like me to fob them off.</i>
nationalist	Relating to nationalists or nationalism. He was a staunch nationalist during his 22 years in power.
<u>patriot</u>	An automated surface-to-air missile designed for early detection and interception of incoming missiles or aircraft. <i>A true patriot</i> .
patriotic	Having or expressing devotion to and vigorous support for one's country. Today s game will be played before a fiercely patriotic crowd.
reliable	A reliable person or thing. The supporting cast includes old reliable s like Mitchell.
<u>solely</u>	Without any others being included or involved. Did it solely for money.



<u>staunch</u>	(of a wall) of strong or firm construction. A staunch supporter of the anti nuclear lobby.
toady	A pufferfish. She imagined him toady ing to his rich clients.
<u>trusted</u>	Worthy of trust or confidence. A trusted adviser.
trustful	Inclined to believe or confide readily; full of trust- Nordhoff & Hall. <i>Great brown eye true and trustful</i> .
trusting	Inclined to believe or confide readily; full of trust. A shy and trusting child.
<u>trustworthy</u>	Worthy of trust or belief. A trustworthy report.
underling	A person lower in status or rank.

underling She was shouting orders at **underling**s between gulps of coffee.
