Devouring as an Adjective

Definitions of "Devouring" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “devouring” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of an unpleasant feeling) totally absorbing.*
- *(often followed by `for') ardently or excessively desirous.*
- *Eating food or prey hungrily or quickly.*
- *(of fire or a similar force) destructively consuming.*



Synonyms of "Devouring" as an adjective (3 Words)

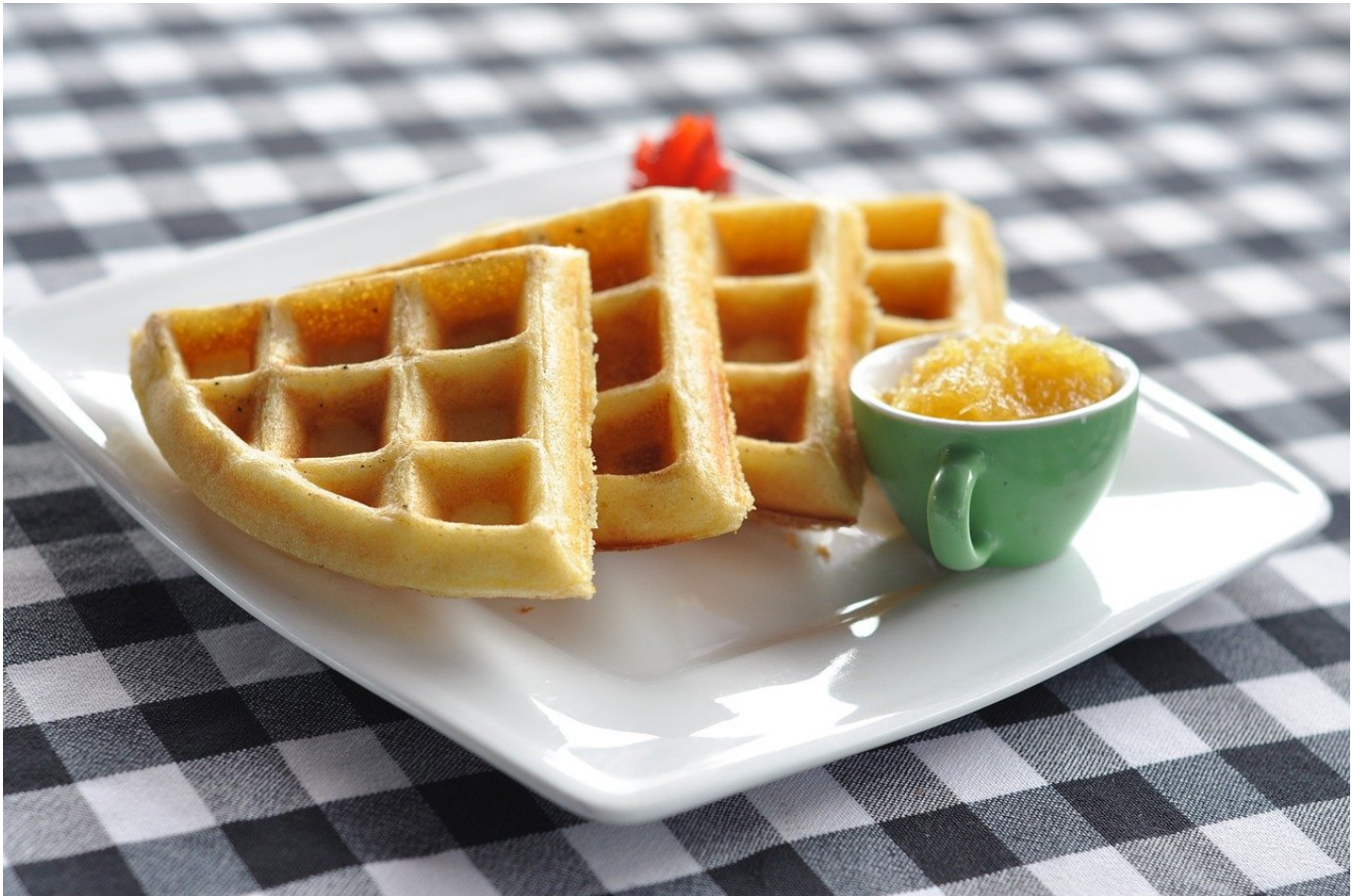
- avid** Ardently or excessively desirous.
*An **avid** ambition to succeed.*
- esurient** Devouring or craving food in great quantities.
*Fell into the **esurient** embrace of a predatory enemy.*
- greedy** Having an excessive desire or appetite for food.
***Greedy** for money and power.*



Usage Examples of "Devouring" as an adjective

- *Fierce devouring affection.*

- *A devouring sense of loneliness.*
- *Before him is a devouring fire.*
- *The wolf is a devouring beast.*



Associations of "Devouring" (30 Words)

- beverage** Any liquid suitable for drinking.
*May I take your **beverage** order.*
- buffet** A meal set out on a buffet at which guests help themselves.
*A cold **buffet** lunch.*
- chomp** The act of gripping or chewing off with the teeth and jaws.
*She **chomped** on a roll.*
- digest** A substance or mixture obtained by digestion.
*The government **digested** the entire law into a code.*
- diner** A restaurant that resembles a dining car.

drink	Drink excessive amounts of alcohol be an alcoholic. <i>The mother drinks in every word of her son on the stage.</i>
eagerly	With eagerness; in an eager manner. <i>Original illustrations are eagerly sought by collectors.</i>
eat	Eat a meal take a meal. <i>These make great party eats.</i>
flavour	A substance used to alter or enhance the taste of food or drink a flavouring. <i>The faint exasperation that had flavoured her tone.</i>
foodstuff	A substance that can be used or prepared for use as food. <i>Rationing of staple foodstuffs was introduced.</i>
glutton	An excessively greedy eater. <i>He s a glutton for adventure.</i>
gobble	Eat (something) hurriedly and noisily. <i>He gobbled up the rest of his sandwich.</i>
gourmand	A person who enjoys eating and often eats too much.
gulp	An act of gulping food or drink. <i>He finished it at a single gulp.</i>
imbibe	Take (gas, light or heat) into a solution. <i>If one does not imbibe the culture one cannot succeed.</i>
ingest	Take up mentally. <i>Lead will poison anyone if enough is ingested.</i>
liqueur	A chocolate with a liqueur filling. <i>A box of liqueurs.</i>
nip	Sever or remove by pinching or snipping. <i>I m just nipping down to the Post Office.</i>
overeat	Overeat or eat immodestly make a pig of oneself. <i>If your friends overeat you re more likely to overeat too.</i>
quaff	Drink (something, especially an alcoholic drink) heartily. <i>Porter is a dark malty quaff.</i>
quench	An act of quenching a very hot substance. <i>He only pursued her to quench an aching need.</i>
ravening	Excessively greedy and grasping. <i>Ravening wolves.</i>
savor	Derive or receive pleasure from; get enjoyment from; take pleasure in. <i>Savor the soup.</i>
sip	Drink in sips. <i>She took a sip of the red wine.</i>

- slake** Satisfy (thirst).
*Restaurants worked to **slake** the Italian obsession with food.*
- slurp** A mouthful of liquid drunk with a loud sucking sound.
*He **slurped** noisily from a wine glass.*
- sup** Take solid or liquid food into the mouth a little at a time either by drinking or by eating with a spoon.
*The latest **sup** from those blokes at the brewery.*
- swallow** The act of swallowing.
*He downed his drink in one **swallow**.*
- tang** Any of various kelps especially of the genus Laminaria.
*The clean salty **tang** of the sea.*
- thirst** A feeling of needing or wanting to drink something.
*A **thirst** for knowledge.*
