<u>fervent</u>	Hot, burning, or glowing. <i>A fervent supporter of the revolution.</i>
firm	Marked by firm determination or resolution not shakable. <i>His voice was firm and confident.</i>
<u>genuine</u>	Being or reflecting the essential or genuine character of something G K Chesterton. <i>A genuine attempt to put things right.</i>
god-fearing	Deeply religious H.L.Mencken.
godly	Emanating from God. <i>Everything is black or white satanic or godly.</i>
heartfelt	Sincerely earnest. <i>Heartfelt condolences.</i>
holy	Dedicated or consecrated to God or a religious purpose; sacred. <i>The holy month of Ramadan.</i>
intense	Extremely sharp or intense. <i>Intense pain.</i>
keen	Excellent. <i>Keen winds.</i>
<u>loyal</u>	Unwavering in devotion to friend or vow or cause. <i>Loyal service.</i>
orthodox	(of a person) not independent-minded; conventional and unoriginal. <i>Orthodox Hindus.</i>
passionate	Having or expressing strong emotions. <i>Passionate pleas for help.</i>
<u>pious</u>	Devoutly religious. <i>Pious readings.</i>
pledged	Bound by or as if by an oath.
prayerful	(of a person) given to praying; devout. <i>The church has a prayerful atmosphere.</i>

religious	Relating to or believing in a religion. Religious texts.
<u>resolute</u>	Admirably purposeful, determined, and unwavering. <i>Faced with a resolute opposition.</i>
<u>reverent</u>	Showing great reverence for god. <i>Maintained a reverent silence.</i>
<u>righteous</u>	Morally justified. Righteous eggs man.
saintly	Relating to a saint. <i>A saintly concern for his fellow men.</i>
<u>sincere</u>	Characterized by a firm and humorless belief in the validity of your opinions. <i>Felt sincere regret that they were leaving.</i>
<u>spiritual</u>	Relating to or affecting the human spirit or soul as opposed to material or physical things. Spiritual fulfillment.
<u>staunch</u>	Very loyal and committed in attitude. <i>A staunch Catholic.</i>
steadfast	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i>A steadfast ally.</i>
sworn	Determined to remain in the role or condition specified. <i>According to an early tradition became his sworn brother.</i>
<u>unwavering</u>	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i>She fixed him with an unwavering stare.</i>
<u>vehement</u>	Characterized by great force or energy. Vehement clapping.
wholehearted	With unconditional and enthusiastic devotion. Wholehearted commitment.
<u>zealous</u>	Marked by active interest and enthusiasm. <i>The council was extremely zealous in the application of the regulations.</i>

angelic	Marked by utter benignity; resembling or befitting an angel or saint. <i>An angelic smile.</i>
beatific	Feeling or expressing blissful happiness. <i>Beatific peace.</i>
bible	A book regarded as authoritative in its field.
blessed	Roman Catholic proclaimed one of the blessed and thus worthy of veneration. <i>He felt blessed fortunate to be in her company.</i>
buddhist	One who follows the teachings of Buddha.
dedicated	Solemnly dedicated to or set apart for a high purpose. <i>Dedicated teachers.</i>
deist	Of or relating to deism.
divine	Resulting from divine providence. <i>Divine judgment.</i>
ecclesiastic	Of or associated with a church (especially a Christian Church). <i>Ecclesiastic history.</i>
fanatically	In a passionately fanatic manner.
godly	Emanating from God. <i>Everything is black or white satanic or godly.</i>
hallowed	Worthy of religious veneration. <i>The band will be in some hallowed and historic surroundings.</i>
heresy	Belief or opinion contrary to orthodox religious (especially Christian) doctrine. <i>The doctrine was denounced as a heresy by the Pope.</i>
holy	Morally and spiritually excellent. <i>I do not lead a holy life.</i>
liturgy	A religious service conducted according to a liturgy. <i>The Church of England liturgy.</i>
pharisaic	Excessively or hypocritically pious.
pilgrim	Travel or wander like a pilgrim. <i>We should recognize our status as mere pilgrims in this world.</i>
pilgrimage	Go on a pilgrimage. <i>He wanted to go on a pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela.</i>
pious	Dutiful or loyal, especially towards one's parents. <i>Pious readings.</i>

<u>reverent</u>	Showing great reverence for god. <i>A reverent silence.</i>
rite	An established ceremony prescribed by a religion. <i>Pagan fertility rites.</i>
sacrament	A formal religious ceremony conferring a specific grace on those who receive it; the two Protestant ceremonies are baptism and the Lord's Supper; in the Roman Catholic Church and the Eastern Orthodox Church there are seven traditional r. <i>He heard Mass and received the sacrament.</i>
sacred	Religious rather than secular. <i>The sacred name of Jesus.</i>
sacrilege	Blasphemous behavior; the act of depriving something of its sacred character. <i>Putting ecclesiastical vestments to secular use was considered sacrilege.</i>
saintly	Relating to a saint. <i>A truly saintly woman.</i>
<u>sanctity</u>	The state or quality of being holy, sacred, or saintly. <i>The sanctity of human life.</i>
scripture	The sacred writings of the Christian religions. <i>Passages of scripture.</i>
<u>shrine</u>	Enclose in a shrine. <i>A Hindu shrine at which offerings are placed twice a day.</i>
<u>synagogue</u>	(Judaism) the place of worship for a Jewish congregation.
votive	Dedicated in fulfillment of a vow. <i>Votive offerings.</i>
