<b>enthusiastic</b>	Having or showing great excitement and interest. <i>Was <b>enthusiastic</b> about taking ballet lessons.</i>
<b><u>faithful</u></b>	Marked by fidelity to an original. <i><b>Faithful</b> employees.</i>
<b><u>fervent</u></b>	Hot, burning, or glowing. <i>A <b>fervent</b> supporter of the revolution.</i>
<b>firm</b>	Marked by firm determination or resolution not shakable. <i>His voice was <b>firm</b> and confident.</i>
<b><u>genuine</u></b>	Being or reflecting the essential or genuine character of something G K Chesterton. <i>A <b>genuine</b> attempt to put things right.</i>
<b>god-fearing</b>	Deeply religious H.L.Mencken.
<b>godly</b>	Emanating from God. <i>Everything is black or white satanic or <b>godly</b>.</i>
<b>heartfelt</b>	Sincerely earnest. <i><b>Heartfelt</b> condolences.</i>
<b>holy</b>	Dedicated or consecrated to God or a religious purpose; sacred. <i>The <b>holy</b> month of Ramadan.</i>
<b>intense</b>	Extremely sharp or intense. <i><b>Intense</b> pain.</i>
<b>keen</b>	Excellent. <i><b>Keen</b> winds.</i>
<b><u>loyal</u></b>	Unwavering in devotion to friend or vow or cause. <i><b>Loyal</b> service.</i>
<b>orthodox</b>	(of a person) not independent-minded; conventional and unoriginal. <i><b>Orthodox</b> Hindus.</i>
<b>passionate</b>	Having or expressing strong emotions. <i><b>Passionate</b> pleas for help.</i>
<b><u>pious</u></b>	Devoutly religious. <i><b>Pious</b> readings.</i>
<b>pledged</b>	Bound by or as if by an oath.
<b>prayerful</b>	(of a person) given to praying; devout. <i>The church has a <b>prayerful</b> atmosphere.</i>

<b>religious</b>	Relating to or believing in a religion. <b>Religious</b> texts.
<b>resolute</b>	Admirably purposeful, determined, and unwavering. <i>Faced with a <b>resolute</b> opposition.</i>
<b>reverent</b>	Showing great reverence for god. <i>Maintained a <b>reverent</b> silence.</i>
<b>righteous</b>	Morally justified. <b>Righteous</b> eggs man.
<b>saintly</b>	Relating to a saint. <i>A <b>saintly</b> concern for his fellow men.</i>
<b>sincere</b>	Characterized by a firm and humorless belief in the validity of your opinions. <i>Felt <b>sincere</b> regret that they were leaving.</i>
<b>spiritual</b>	Relating to or affecting the human spirit or soul as opposed to material or physical things. <b>Spiritual</b> fulfillment.
<b>staunch</b>	Very loyal and committed in attitude. <i>A <b>staunch</b> Catholic.</i>
<b>steadfast</b>	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i>A <b>steadfast</b> ally.</i>
<b>sworn</b>	Determined to remain in the role or condition specified. <i>According to an early tradition became his <b>sworn</b> brother.</i>
<b>unwavering</b>	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i>She fixed him with an <b>unwavering</b> stare.</i>
<b>vehement</b>	Characterized by great force or energy. <b>Vehement</b> clapping.
<b>wholehearted</b>	With unconditional and enthusiastic devotion. <b>Wholehearted</b> commitment.
<b>zealous</b>	Marked by active interest and enthusiasm. <i>The council was extremely <b>zealous</b> in the application of the regulations.</i>

<b>blessed</b>	Roman Catholic proclaimed one of the blessed and thus worthy of veneration. <i>He felt <b>blessed</b> fortunate to be in her company.</i>

<b>hallowed</b>	Worthy of religious veneration. <i>The band will be in some <b>hallowed</b> and historic surroundings.</i>
<a href="#">heresy</a>	Belief or opinion contrary to orthodox religious (especially Christian) doctrine. <i>The doctrine was denounced as a <b>heresy</b> by the Pope.</i>
<b>holy</b>	Morally and spiritually excellent. <i>I do not lead a <b>holy</b> life.</i>
<b>liturgy</b>	A religious service conducted according to a liturgy. <i>The Church of England <b>liturgy</b>.</i>
<b>pharisaic</b>	Excessively or hypocritically pious.
<b>pilgrim</b>	Travel or wander like a pilgrim. <i>We should recognize our status as mere <b>pilgrims</b> in this world.</i>
<a href="#">pilgrimage</a>	Go on a pilgrimage. <i>He wanted to go on a <b>pilgrimage</b> to Santiago de Compostela.</i>
<a href="#">pious</a>	Dutiful or loyal, especially towards one's parents. <i><b>Pious</b> readings.</i>

<b>reverent</b>	Showing great reverence for god. <i>A <b>reverent</b> silence.</i>
<b>rite</b>	An established ceremony prescribed by a religion. <i>Pagan fertility <b>rites</b>.</i>
<b>sacrament</b>	A formal religious ceremony conferring a specific grace on those who receive it; the two Protestant ceremonies are baptism and the Lord's Supper; in the Roman Catholic Church and the Eastern Orthodox Church there are seven traditional r. <i>He heard Mass and received the <b>sacrament</b>.</i>
<b>sacred</b>	Religious rather than secular. <i>The <b>sacred</b> name of Jesus.</i>
<b>sacrilege</b>	Blasphemous behavior; the act of depriving something of its sacred character. <i>Putting ecclesiastical vestments to secular use was considered <b>sacrilege</b>.</i>
<b>saintly</b>	Relating to a saint. <i>A truly <b>saintly</b> woman.</i>
<b>sanctity</b>	The state or quality of being holy, sacred, or saintly. <i>The <b>sanctity</b> of human life.</i>
<b>scripture</b>	The sacred writings of the Christian religions. <i>Passages of <b>scripture</b>.</i>
<b>shrine</b>	Enclose in a shrine. <i>A Hindu <b>shrine</b> at which offerings are placed twice a day.</i>
<b>synagogue</b>	(Judaism) the place of worship for a Jewish congregation.
<b>votive</b>	Dedicated in fulfillment of a vow. <i><b>Votive</b> offerings.</i>
