- *An excellent or very special person or thing.*
- *A transparent piece of diamond that has been cut and polished and is valued as a precious gem.*
- *A precious stone consisting of a clear and colourless crystalline form of pure carbon, the hardest naturally occurring substance.*
- *A tool with a small diamond for cutting glass.*
- *The area delimited by the four bases of a baseball field, forming a square shape.*
- *A playing card in the minor suit that has one or more red rhombuses on it.*
- *A parallelogram with four equal sides; an oblique-angled equilateral parallelogram.*
- *A card of the suit of diamonds.*
- *The baseball playing field.*
- *One of the four suits in a conventional pack of playing cards, denoted by a red*

*diamond.*

### Synonyms of "Diamond" as a noun (9 Words)

<b><u>adamant</u></b>	Very hard native crystalline carbon valued as a gem.
<b>ball field</b>	A pitch that is not in the strike zone.
<b>baseball diamond</b>	A ball game played with a bat and ball between two teams of nine players; teams take turns at bat trying to score runs.
<b>baseball field</b>	A ball game played with a bat and ball between two teams of nine players; teams take turns at bat trying to score runs.
<b>diamond shape</b>	Very hard native crystalline carbon valued as a gem.
<b>infield</b>	The players stationed in the infield collectively. <i>The <b>infield</b> is demarcated by corn ditches.</i>
<b><u>jewel</u></b>	An ornament or piece of jewellery containing a precious stone or stones. <i>She loved dressing up in her <b>jewels</b>.</i>
<b>rhomb</b>	A rhombus.

A parallelogram with four equal sides; an oblique-angled equilateral parallelogram.

<b>amber</b>	A honey yellow colour typical of amber. <i>Amber</i> eyes.
<b>amethyst</b>	Of a moderate purple color. <i>Amethyst</i> earrings.
<b>betrothal</b>	The act of becoming betrothed or engaged.
<b>bracelet</b>	An ornamental band, hoop, or chain worn on the wrist or arm.
<b>brooch</b>	Fasten with or as if with a brooch.
<b>carat</b>	A measure of the purity of gold pure gold being 24 carats. <i>A half carat diamond ring.</i>
<b>circlet</b>	Decorated metal band worn around the head.
<b>earring</b>	A piece of jewellery worn on the lobe or edge of the ear.

<b>gem</b>	Decorate with or as with gems. <i>This architectural <b>gem</b> of a palace.</i>
<b>gemstone</b>	A precious or semi-precious stone, especially one cut, polished, and used in a piece of jewellery.
<b>gold</b>	Made of or coloured like gold. <i>He proved to be a rabid seeker for <b>gold</b> and power.</i>
<b>golden</b>	Coloured or shining like gold. <i><b>Golden</b> lads and girls all must like chimney sweepers come to dust.</i>
<b>invaluable</b>	Having incalculable monetary, intellectual, or spiritual worth. <i>An <b>invaluable</b> source of information.</i>
<b>jade</b>	Of something having the color of jade especially varying from bluish green to yellowish green. <i>A silk blouse in a vivid <b>jade</b> green.</i>
<b>jadeite</b>	A green, blue, or white mineral which is one of the forms of jade. It is a silicate of sodium, aluminium, and iron and belongs to the pyroxene group.
<b>jewellery</b>	Personal ornaments, such as necklaces, rings, or bracelets, that are typically made from or contain jewels and precious metal. <i>She had silver hair and chunky gold <b>jewellery</b>.</i>
<b>jewelry</b>	An adornment (as a bracelet or ring or necklace) made of precious metals and set with gems (or imitation gems).
<b>medallion</b>	Any of various large ancient Greek coins. <i><b>Medallions</b> of veal.</i>
<b>miner</b>	A person who works in a mine. <i>The <b>miners</b> were freed after spending four days trapped underground.</i>
<b>mineshaft</b>	Excavation consisting of a vertical or sloping passageway for finding or mining ore or for ventilating a mine. <i>One member of this party almost vanished down a hidden disused <b>mineshaft</b>.</i>
<b>necklace</b>	In South Africa kill someone with a tyre necklace. <i>The harbour with its <b>necklace</b> of lights.</i>
<b>nephrite</b>	An amphibole mineral consisting of calcium magnesium silicate in monoclinic crystalline form; a source of jade that is less valuable than from jadeite; once believed to cure kidney disorders.
<b>pearl</b>	A very pale bluish grey or white colour like that of a pearl. <i>Sunset <b>pearled</b> the sky above the hills.</i>
<b>platinum</b>	Greyish white or silvery like platinum. <i>A <b>platinum</b> wig.</i>

- precious** Held in great esteem for admirable qualities especially of an intrinsic nature.  
*An insufferably **precious** performance.*
- quartz** A hard glossy mineral consisting of silicon dioxide in crystal form present in most rocks especially sandstone and granite yellow sand is quartz with iron oxide impurities.
- rhinestone** An imitation diamond, used in cheap jewellery and to decorate clothes.  
*A canary yellow suit studded with **rhinestones**.*
- ring** Attach a ring to the foot of in order to identify.  
*In the mid 1850s there were fines for not **ringing** swine.*
- silver** Having the white lustrous sheen of silver.  
*George dipped his hand into his pocket and brought out some small **silver**.*
- turquoise** A blue to grey green mineral consisting of copper aluminum phosphate.  
*The **turquoise** waters of the bay.*
