gastric	Of the stomach. Gastric ulcer.
gastritis	Inflammation of the lining of the stomach; nausea and loss of appetite and discomfort after eating.
gastrointestinal	Relating to the stomach and the intestines. <i>Ginger soothes the gastrointestinal tract.</i>
gut	Remove the guts of. <i>Trusting his gut instinct he went ahead and made the call.</i>
hernia	Rupture in smooth muscle tissue through which a bodily structure protrudes. <i>A hernia operation.</i>
indigestion	A disorder of digestive function characterized by discomfort or heartburn or nausea. <i>You know crisps give me indigestion.</i>
intestinal	Relating to or affecting the intestine. <i>The intestinal tract.</i>
intestine	(especially in invertebrates) the whole alimentary canal from the mouth downward. <i>The contents of the intestine.</i>
liver	The flesh of an animal's liver as food. <i>A high liver.</i>
<u>nausea</u>	A feeling of loathing or disgust. <i>The stories will launch a wave of public nausea and outrage.</i>
offal	The entrails and internal organs of an animal used as food. <i>The packing plant dumped its offal into the stream.</i>
organs	Edible viscera of a butchered animal.
pancreas	A large gland behind the stomach which secretes digestive enzymes into the duodenum. Embedded in the pancreas are the islets of Langerhans which secrete into the blood the hormones insulin and glucagon.
respiratory	Relating to or affecting respiration or the organs of respiration. Respiratory disease.

spleen	A large dark-red oval organ on the left side of the body between the stomach and the diaphragm; produces cells involved in immune responses. <i>He could vent his spleen on the institutions which had duped him.</i>
stomach	Any of a number of organs analogous to the stomach in lower animals. <i>Blake hit him in the stomach.</i>
ulcer	A moral blemish or corrupting influence. <i>He s a conman with an incurable ulcer called gambling.</i>
ventral	On or relating to the underside of an animal or plant; abdominal. <i>The ventral part of the head.</i>
vomiting	The reflex act of ejecting the contents of the stomach through the mouth.
