<b>eviscerate</b>	Take away a vital or essential part of. <i>Myriad little concessions that would <b>eviscerate</b> the project.</i>
<b>gastric</b>	Of the stomach. <b>Gastric ulcer.</b>
<b>gastritis</b>	Inflammation of the lining of the stomach; nausea and loss of appetite and discomfort after eating.
<b>gastrointestinal</b>	Relating to the stomach and the intestines. <i>Ginger soothes the <b>gastrointestinal</b> tract.</i>
<b>gut</b>	Remove the guts of. <i>Trusting his <b>gut</b> instinct he went ahead and made the call.</i>
<b>hernia</b>	Rupture in smooth muscle tissue through which a bodily structure protrudes. <i>A <b>hernia</b> operation.</i>
<b>indigestion</b>	A disorder of digestive function characterized by discomfort or heartburn or nausea. <i>You know crisps give me <b>indigestion</b>.</i>
<b>intestinal</b>	Relating to or affecting the intestine. <i>The <b>intestinal</b> tract.</i>
<b>intestine</b>	(especially in invertebrates) the whole alimentary canal from the mouth downward. <i>The contents of the <b>intestine</b>.</i>
<b>liver</b>	The flesh of an animal's liver as food. <i>A high <b>liver</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>nausea</u></a>	A feeling of loathing or disgust. <i>The stories will launch a wave of public <b>nausea</b> and outrage.</i>
<b>offal</b>	The entrails and internal organs of an animal used as food. <i>The packing plant dumped its <b>offal</b> into the stream.</i>
<b>organs</b>	Edible viscera of a butchered animal.
<b>pancreas</b>	A large gland behind the stomach which secretes digestive enzymes into the duodenum. Embedded in the pancreas are the islets of Langerhans which secrete into the blood the hormones insulin and glucagon.
<b>respiratory</b>	Relating to or affecting respiration or the organs of respiration. <b>Respiratory disease.</b>

<b>spleen</b>	A large dark-red oval organ on the left side of the body between the stomach and the diaphragm; produces cells involved in immune responses. <i>He could vent his <b>spleen</b> on the institutions which had duped him.</i>
<b>stomach</b>	Any of a number of organs analogous to the stomach in lower animals. <i>Blake hit him in the <b>stomach</b>.</i>
<b>ulcer</b>	A moral blemish or corrupting influence. <i>He s a conman with an incurable <b>ulcer</b> called gambling.</i>
<b>ventral</b>	On or relating to the underside of an animal or plant; abdominal. <i>The <b>ventral</b> part of the head.</i>
<b>vomiting</b>	The reflex act of ejecting the contents of the stomach through the mouth.
