- *The usual food and drink consumed by an organism (person or animal).*
- *(of food or drink) with reduced fat or sugar content.*
- *A prescribed selection of foods.*
- *A special course of food to which a person restricts themselves, either to lose weight or for medical reasons.*
- *The kinds of food that a person, animal, or community habitually eats.*
- *The activities, pastimes, etc. in which a person or group habitually engages.*

Definitions of "Diet" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "diet" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Restrict oneself to small amounts or special kinds of food in order to lose weight.*
- *Eat sparingly, for health reasons or to lose weight.*
- *Follow a regimen or a diet, as for health reasons.*
- *Put (a person or animal) on a special diet.*



Synonyms of "Diet" as a verb (6 Words)

<u>abstain</u>	Restrain oneself from doing or enjoying something. <i>Most pregnant women abstain or drink very little.</i>
be on a diet	Be priced at.
eat selectively	Use up (resources or materials).
eat sparingly	Use up (resources or materials).
fast	Abstain from certain foods, as for religious or medical reasons. <i>Before the medical exam you must fast.</i>
follow a diet	Grasp the meaning.



Usage Examples of "Diet" as a verb

- *I began dieting again.*
- *He has high blood pressure and must stick to a low-salt diet.*

calorie	The energy needed to raise the temperature of 1 kilogram of water through 1 C equal to one thousand small calories and often used to measure the energy value of foods.
carbohydrate	Food consisting of or containing a lot of carbohydrates. <i>Make sure you feed them lots of carbohydrate.</i>
carnivorous	Relating to or characteristic of carnivores. <i>Carnivorous plants are capable of trapping and digesting small animals especially insects.</i>
commissariat	A department for the supply of food and equipment.
dietitian	A specialist in the study of diet and nutrition.
feed	An actor who gives a feed to a fellow performer. <i>I could feed my melancholy by reading Romantic poetry.</i>

healthy	Promoting health; healthful. <i>The healthy attitude of French laws.</i>
herbivore	An animal that feeds on plants. <i>Horses are herbivores.</i>
intake	The people taken into an organization at a particular time. <i>His alcohol intake.</i>
nourish	Provide with nourishment. <i>He has long nourished an ambition to bring the show to Broadway.</i>
nourishing	(of food) containing substances necessary for growth, health, and good condition. <i>Good nourishing stew.</i>
nourishment	A source of materials to nourish the body. <i>She was starved of emotional nourishment.</i>
nutrient	Any substance (such as a chemical element or inorganic compound) that can be taken in by a green plant and used in organic synthesis. <i>Fish is a source of many important nutrients including protein vitamins and minerals.</i>
nutriment	Nourishment; sustenance. <i>He took the Bible for spiritual nutriment.</i>
nutrition	The branch of science that deals with nutrients and nutrition particularly in humans. <i>A feeding tube gives her nutrition and water.</i>
nutritional	Relating to the process of providing or obtaining the food necessary for health and growth. <i>Nutritional information.</i>
nutritionist	A specialist in the study of nutrition.
nutritious	Of or providing nourishment. <i>Home cooked burgers make a nutritious meal.</i>
nutritive	Relating to nutrition. <i>Nutritive food.</i>
omnivorous	Feeding on both plants and animals. <i>An omnivorous reader.</i>
protein	Proteins collectively especially as a dietary component. <i>A protein found in wheat.</i>
provender	Animal fodder. <i>To raise the prices of provender for cattle importation has been severely curtailed.</i>

reducing	Any process in which electrons are added to an atom or ion as by removing oxygen or adding hydrogen always occurs accompanied by oxidation of the reducing agent. <i>A doctor supervised her reducing.</i>
starch	Food containing starch. <i>Starch clothes.</i>
vegetarian	Relating to vegetarians or vegetarianism. <i>A vegetarian restaurant.</i>
veggie	A vegetable. <i>16 per cent of US households are buying veggie burgers.</i>
victuals	A stock or supply of foods.
<u>wholesome</u>	Sound or exhibiting soundness in body or mind. <i>A grin on his ugly wholesome face.</i>
wholesomeness	The quality of being beneficial and generally good for you.
