- *A difference between amounts of things.*
- *A quality that differentiates between similar things.*
- *A set of gears allowing a motor vehicle's driven wheels to revolve at different speeds*

*when going around corners.*

- *An infinitesimal difference between successive values of a variable.*

<b><u>distinction</u></b>	An honor awarded to someone in recognition of achievement or superiority. <i>I was completely unaware of class <b>distinctions</b>.</i>
<b><u>divergence</u></b>	A difference in opinions, interests, etc. <i>An angle is formed by the <b>divergence</b> of two straight lines.</i>
<b>first derivative</b>	The fielding position of the player on a baseball team who is stationed at first of the bases in the infield (counting counterclockwise from home plate.
<b>gap</b>	A narrow opening. <b>Gap</b> between income and outgo.
<b>gulf</b>	An arm of a sea or ocean partly enclosed by land; larger than a bay. <i>The widening <b>gulf</b> between the rich and the poor.</i>
<b><u>imbalance</u></b>	(mathematics) a lack of symmetry. <i>A hormonal <b>imbalance</b>.</i>

**inconsistency**

The quality of being inconsistent and lacking a harmonious uniformity among things or parts.

*The **inconsistency** between his expressed attitudes and his actual behaviour.*

**inequality**

Difference in size, degree, circumstances, etc.; lack of equality.

*The growing **inequality** between rich and poor.*

**inequity**

Lack of fairness or justice.

*Policies aimed at redressing racial **inequity**.*

**unevenness**

The quality of being unbalanced.

**variability**

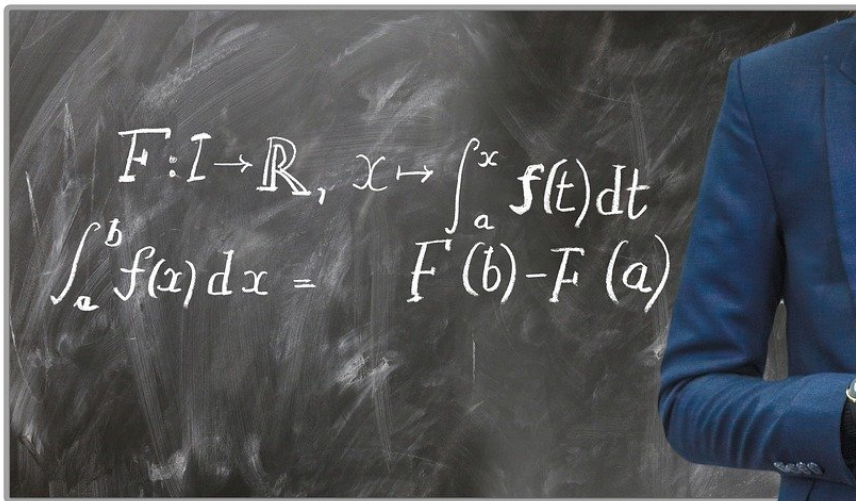
The quality of being uneven and lacking uniformity.

*A great deal of **variability** in quality.*

**variation**

Something a little different from others of the same type.

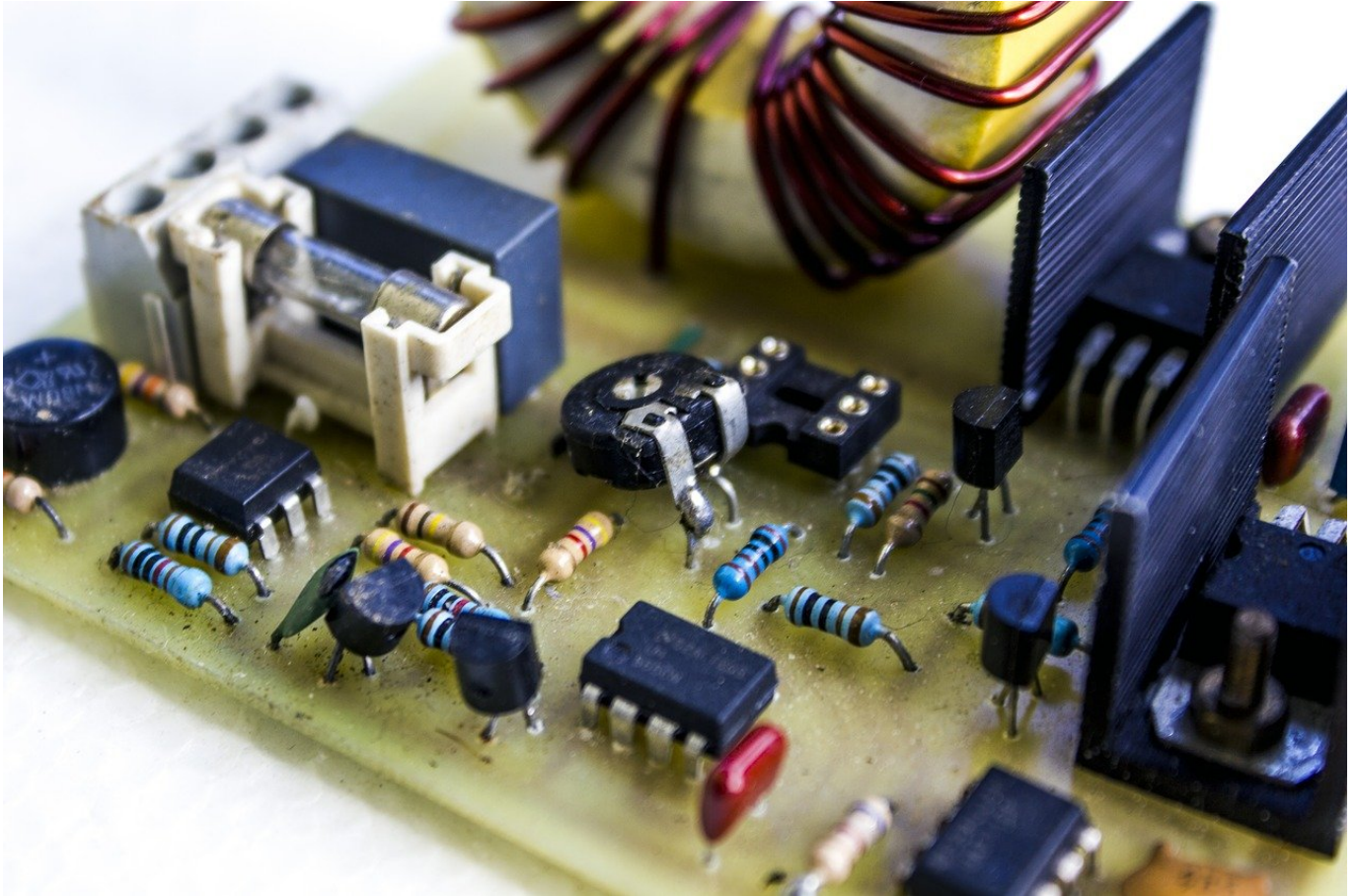
*He patented a **variation** on the sandal.*

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "differential" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

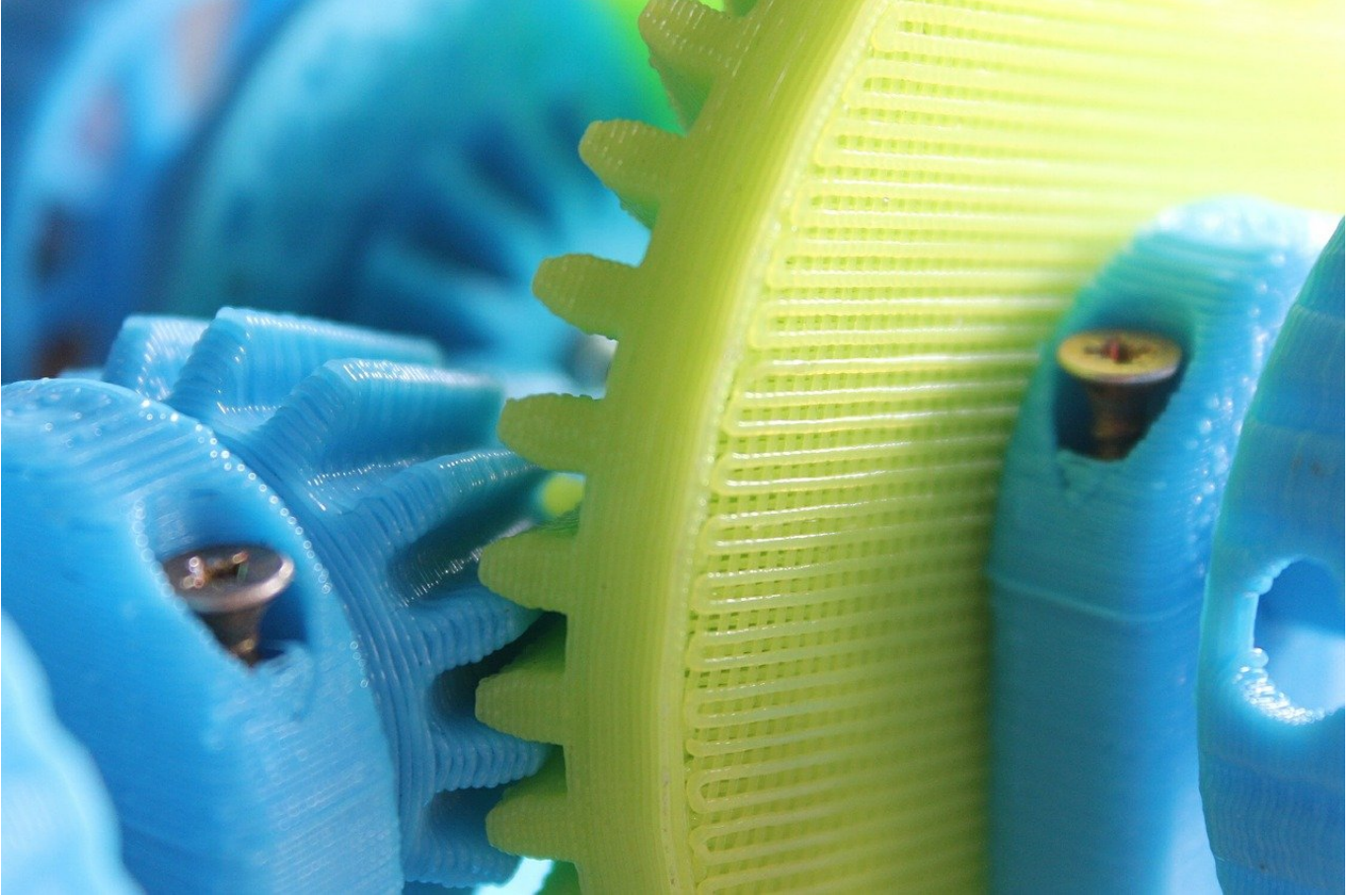
- *Of, showing, or depending on a difference; varying according to circumstances or relevant factors.*
