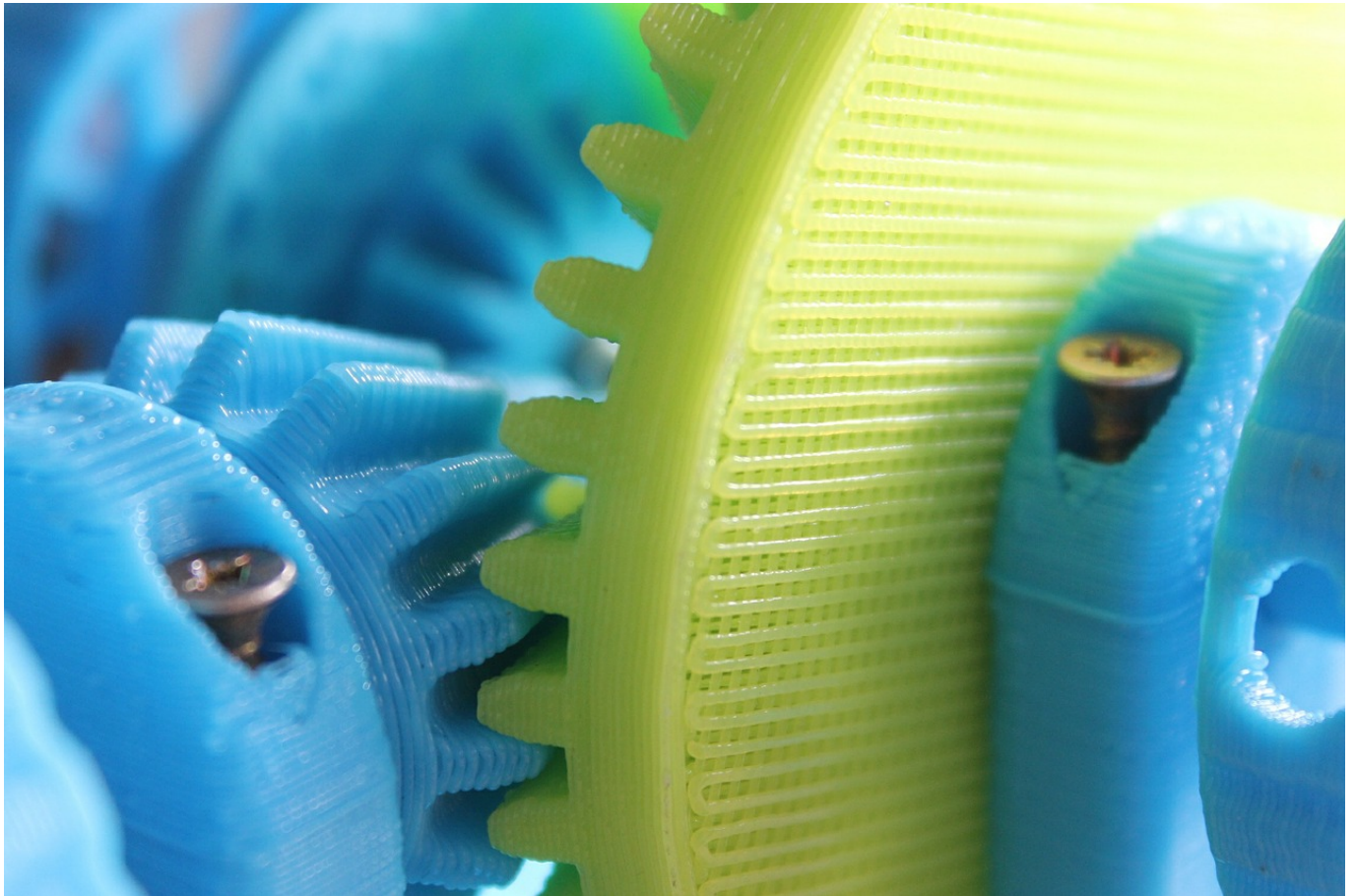

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “differentiation” as a noun can have the following definitions:

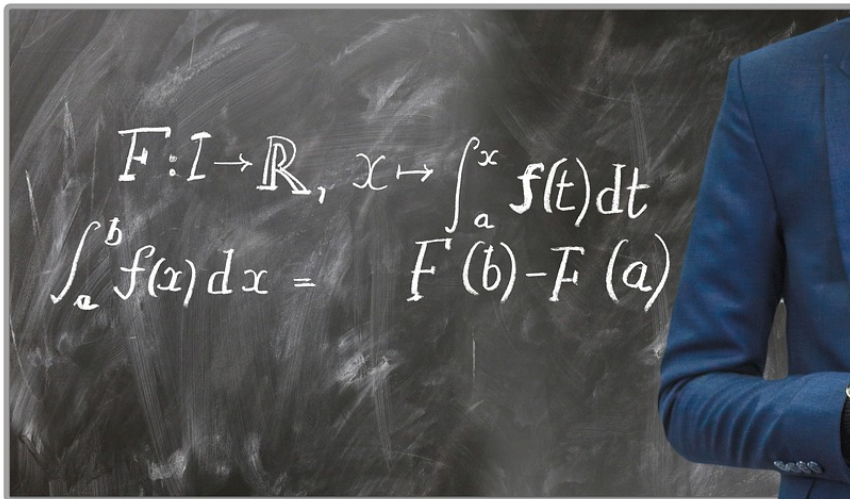
- *A discrimination between things as different and distinct.*

- *The process by which cells, tissue, and organs acquire specialized features, especially during embryonic development.*
- *The mathematical process of obtaining the derivative of a function.*
- *The action or process of differentiating or distinguishing between two or more things or people.*
- *(biology) the structural adaptation of some body part for a particular function.*

<b>desegregation</b>	The action of incorporating a racial or religious group into a community. <i>He wrote editorials calling for the <b>desegregation</b> of schools.</i>
<u>differ</u>	Be of different opinions. <i>These two tests <b>differ</b> in only one respect.</i>
<b>difference</b>	A point or way in which people or things are dissimilar. <i>There are many <b>differences</b> between jazz and rock.</i>
<u>differential</u>	Involving or containing one or more derivatives. <i>The <b>differential</b> between petrol and diesel prices.</i>
<b>differently</b>	In another and different manner. <i>Very soon you will know <b>differently</b>.</i>
<u>distinction</u>	A distinguishing quality. <i>High interest rates strike down without <b>distinction</b> small businesses and the unemployed.</i>
<u>distinguish</u>	Manage to discern (something barely perceptible). <i>Many <b>distinguished</b> themselves in the fight against Hitler.</i>
<u>flux</u>	Treat a metal object with a flux to promote melting. <i>The <b>flux</b> of ions across the membrane.</i>
<b>gap</b>	Make an opening or gap in. <i>He peeped through the <b>gap</b> in the curtains.</i>
<b>individuation</b>	Discriminating the individual from the generic group or species.
<b>integrate</b>	Become one become integrated. <i>The protest forced the bus companies to <b>integrate</b> the buses.</i>
<b>integration</b>	The finding of an integral or integrals. <i>Mathematical <b>integrations</b>.</i>
<b>irregularity</b>	The state or quality of being irregular. <i>The <b>irregularity</b> of his breathing.</i>
<b>joint</b>	Provide with a joint. <i>Seal the <b>joint</b> between the roof and the house wall.</i>

<u>merge</u>	Absorb (a title or estate) in another. <i>He agreed to <b>merge</b> his broadcasting company with a multinational concern.</i>
<b>merger</b>	An occurrence that involves the production of a union. <i><b>Merger</b> can be applied for when the freehold and leasehold estates become vested in the same person.</i>
<b>sensorimotor</b>	Of or relating to the sensory and motor coordination of an organism or to the controlling nerves.
<b>specialization</b>	The process of concentrating on and becoming expert in a particular subject or skill. <i>Bats show elegant physiological <b>specializations</b> in the auditory sphere.</i>
<b>strikingly</b>	In a way that attracts attention by reason of being unusual, extreme, or prominent. <i>Their methods of work differed <b>strikingly</b>.</i>
<u>union</u>	A part of a flag with an emblem symbolizing national union typically occupying the upper corner next to the staff. <i>The <b>union</b> of opposing factions.</i>
<u>united</u>	Characterized by unity; being or joined into a single entity. <i>Women acting together in a <b>united</b> way.</i>
