<u>contradictory</u>	A contradictory proposition. The two studies came to contradictory conclusions.
contrast	The opposition or dissimilarity of things that are compared. <i>People contrasted her with her sister.</i>
contrastingly	In a contrasting manner.
convert	A person who has been converted to another religious or political belief. <i>Could you</i> convert my dollars into pounds.
diametrical	Related to or along a diameter. He s the diametrical opposite of Gabriel.
difference	A disagreement, quarrel, or dispute. There are many difference s between jazz and rock.
different	Distinctly separate from the first. Each interviewed different members of the community.
<u>differential</u>	A set of gears allowing a motor vehicle's driven wheels to revolve at different speeds when going around corners. The differential between petrol and diesel prices.
<u>differentiation</u>	(biology) the structural adaptation of some body part for a particular function. <i>Cell differentiation in the developing embryo.</i>
<u>disagree</u>	(of food, climate, or an experience) have an adverse effect on. She disagree s with her husband on many questions.
<u>disagreement</u>	The speech act of disagreeing or arguing or disputing. Disagreement s between parents and adolescents.



<u>discord</u>	Lack of harmony between notes sounding together. <i>The music faded in discord.</i>
<u>discordant</u>	(of sounds) harsh and jarring because of a lack of harmony. A study of children in discordant homes.
discrepant	Not in accord. The reasons for these discrepant results are unclear.
dissonant	Unsuitable or unusual in combination; clashing. Irregular dissonant chords.
<u>distinction</u>	A grade in an examination denoting excellence. It is necessary to make a distinction between love and infatuation.
<u>erratic</u>	Not even or regular in pattern or movement; unpredictable. <i>Erratic</i> behavior.
factious	Relating or inclined to dissension. A factious country.
gap	Make an opening or gap in. There are many gap s in our understanding of what happened.
<u>incompatible</u>	Not suitable to your tastes or needs. Long hours are simply incompatible with family life.
<u>incongruous</u>	Not in harmony or keeping with the surroundings or other aspects of something. The duffel coat looked incongruous with the black dress she wore underneath.
inconsistent	Acting at variance with one's own principles or former behaviour. Inconsistent statements cannot both be true at the same time.
inharmonious	Not in harmony. An inharmonious negative state of mind.
inhospitable	Not hospitable. The barren inhospitable desert.
<u>irony</u>	Witty language used to convey insults or scorn-Jonathan Swif. Don t go overboard with the gratitude he rejoined with heavy irony .
opposition	An armed adversary (especially a member of an opposing military force. <i>The invaders encountered stiff</i> opposition .
<u>unlike</u>	Dissimilar or different from each other. They seemed utterly unlike despite being twins.
<u>variance</u>	The quality of being subject to variation. They were at variance with all their previous allies.
