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| <b>conflicting</b>            | In disagreement- John Morley.<br><i>There are <b>conflicting</b> accounts of what occurred.</i>   |
| <b><u>contradiction</u></b>   | The statement of a position opposite to one already made.<br><i>The proposed new system suffers from a set of internal <b>contradictions</b>.</i>                                     |
| <b><u>contradictory</u></b>   | A contradictory proposition.<br><i>The two studies came to <b>contradictory</b> conclusions.</i>  |
| <b>contrast</b>               | The opposition or dissimilarity of things that are compared.<br><i>People <b>contrasted</b> her with her sister.</i>  |
| <b>contrastingly</b>          | In a contrasting manner.  |
| <b>convert</b>                | A person who has been converted to another religious or political belief.<br><i>Could you <b>convert</b> my dollars into pounds.</i>  |
| <b>diametrical</b>            | Related to or along a diameter.<br><i>He s the <b>diametrical</b> opposite of Gabriel.</i>  |
| <b>difference</b>             | A disagreement, quarrel, or dispute.<br><i>There are many <b>differences</b> between jazz and rock.</i>   |
| <b>different</b>              | Distinctly separate from the first.<br><i>Each interviewed <b>different</b> members of the community.</i>   |
| <b><u>differential</u></b>    | A set of gears allowing a motor vehicle's driven wheels to revolve at different speeds when going around corners.<br><i>The <b>differential</b> between petrol and diesel prices.</i> |
| <b><u>differentiation</u></b> | (biology) the structural adaptation of some body part for a particular function.<br><i>Cell <b>differentiation</b> in the developing embryo.</i>                                      |
| <b><u>disagree</u></b>        | (of food, climate, or an experience) have an adverse effect on.<br><i>She <b>disagrees</b> with her husband on many questions.</i>  |
| <b><u>disagreement</u></b>    | The speech act of disagreeing or arguing or disputing.<br><i><b>Disagreements</b> between parents and adolescents.</i>  |

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| <b><u>discord</u></b>      | Lack of harmony between notes sounding together.<br><i>The music faded in <b>discord</b>.</i>  |
| <b><u>discordant</u></b>   | (of sounds) harsh and jarring because of a lack of harmony.<br><i>A study of children in <b>discordant</b> homes.</i>  |
| <b>discrepant</b>          | Not in accord.<br><i>The reasons for these <b>discrepant</b> results are unclear.</i>  |
| <b>dissonant</b>           | Unsuitable or unusual in combination; clashing.<br><i>Irregular <b>dissonant</b> chords.</i>   |
| <b><u>distinction</u></b>  | A grade in an examination denoting excellence.<br><i>It is necessary to make a <b>distinction</b> between love and infatuation.</i>  |
| <b><u>erratic</u></b>      | Not even or regular in pattern or movement; unpredictable.<br><i><b>Erratic</b> behavior.</i>  |
| <b>factionous</b>          | Relating or inclined to dissension.<br><i>A <b>factionous</b> country.</i>   |
| <b>gap</b>                 | Make an opening or gap in.<br><i>There are many <b>gaps</b> in our understanding of what happened.</i>   |
| <b><u>incompatible</u></b> | Not suitable to your tastes or needs.<br><i>Long hours are simply <b>incompatible</b> with family life.</i>  |
| <b><u>incongruous</u></b>  | Not in harmony or keeping with the surroundings or other aspects of something.<br><i>The duffel coat looked <b>incongruous</b> with the black dress she wore underneath.</i> |
| <b>inconsistent</b>        | Acting at variance with one's own principles or former behaviour.<br><i><b>Inconsistent</b> statements cannot both be true at the same time.</i>                             |
| <b>inharmonious</b>        | Not in harmony.<br><i>An <b>inharmonious</b> negative state of mind.</i>   |
| <b>inhospitable</b>        | Not hospitable.<br><i>The barren <b>inhospitable</b> desert.</i>   |
| <b><u>irony</u></b>        | Witty language used to convey insults or scorn-Jonathan Swif.<br><i>Don't go overboard with the gratitude he rejoined with heavy <b>irony</b>.</i>                           |
| <b><u>opposition</u></b>   | An armed adversary (especially a member of an opposing military force).<br><i>The invaders encountered stiff <b>opposition</b>.</i>  |
| <b><u>unlike</u></b>       | Dissimilar or different from each other.<br><i>They seemed utterly <b>unlike</b> despite being twins.</i>  |
| <b><u>variance</u></b>     | The quality of being subject to variation.<br><i>They were at <b>variance</b> with all their previous allies.</i>  |
