## The Forms of Difficultate

Infinitive	<b>to difficultate</b>
Present Tense	<b>difficultate / difficultates</b>
Past Tense	<b>difficultated</b>
Present Participle	<b>difficultating</b>
Past Participle	<b>difficultated</b>

## Conjugate Difficultate

**Difficultate in Present Simple (Indefinite) Tense**

**Singular****Plural**

I <b>difficultate</b>	We <b>difficultate</b>
You <b>difficultate</b>	You <b>difficultate</b>
He/She/It <b>difficultates</b>	They <b>difficultate</b>

**Difficultate in Present Continuous (Progressive) Tense****Singular****Plural**

I <b>am difficultating</b>	We <b>are difficultating</b>
You <b>are difficultating</b>	You <b>are difficultating</b>
He/She/It <b>is difficultating</b>	They <b>are difficultating</b>

**Difficultate in Present Perfect Tense****Singular****Plural**

I <b>have difficultated</b>	We <b>have difficultated</b>
You <b>have difficultated</b>	You <b>have difficultated</b>
He/She/It <b>has difficultated</b>	They <b>have difficultated</b>

**Difficultate in Present Perfect Continuous Tense****Singular****Plural**

I <b>have been difficultating</b>	We <b>have been difficultating</b>
You <b>have been difficultating</b>	You <b>have been difficultating</b>
He/She/It <b>has been difficultating</b>	They <b>have been difficultating</b>

**Difficultate in Past Simple (Indefinite) Tense****Singular****Plural**

I <b>difficultated</b>	We <b>difficultated</b>
You <b>difficultated</b>	You <b>difficultated</b>
He/She/It <b>difficultated</b>	They <b>difficultated</b>

**Difficultate in Past Continuous (Progressive) Tense**

<b>You were difficultating</b>	<b>You were difficultating</b>
<b>He/She/It was difficultating</b>	<b>They were difficultating</b>

<b>I had difficultated</b>	<b>We had difficultated</b>
<b>You had difficultated</b>	<b>You had difficultated</b>
<b>He/She/It had difficultated</b>	<b>They had difficultated</b>

## **Difficultate in Past Perfect Continuous Tense**

<b>I had been difficultating</b>	<b>We had been difficultating</b>
<b>You had been difficultating</b>	<b>You had been difficultating</b>
<b>He/She/It had been difficultating</b>	<b>They had been difficultating</b>

<b>I will difficultate</b>	<b>We will difficultate</b>
<b>You will difficultate</b>	<b>You will difficultate</b>
<b>He/She/It will difficultate</b>	<b>They will difficultate</b>

<b>I will be difficultating</b>	<b>We will be difficultating</b>
<b>You will be difficultating</b>	<b>You will be difficultating</b>
<b>He/She/It will be difficultating</b>	<b>They will be difficultating</b>

**We will have difficultated**

**You will have difficultated**

**You will have difficultated**

**He/She/It will have difficultated**

**They will have difficultated**

**We will have been difficultating**

**You will have been difficultating**

**He/She/It will have been difficultating**

**They will have been difficultating**
