Associations of "Digital" (30 Words)

ammeter	A meter that measures the flow of electrical current in amperes.
cable	Send a message to someone by cablegram. <i>Steel cables held the convoy together.</i>
calibrate	Mark (the scale of a measuring instrument) so that it can be read in the desired units. <i>He calibrated the thermometer for the Celsius scale.</i>
clock	A person’s face. <i>The tower operators clocked a gust at 185 mph.</i>
computer	An electronic device for storing and processing data, typically in binary form, according to instructions given to it in a variable program.
dashboard	Protective covering consisting of a panel to protect people from the splashing water or mud etc. <i>The main line graph in the dashboard shows daily traffic to our site over the past 30 days.</i>
desktop	The working area of a computer screen regarded as a representation of a notional desktop and containing icons representing items such as files. <i>You can now have multiple overlapping windows on the desktop.</i>
dial	Operate a dial to select a telephone number. <i>She dialled 999.</i>
doorbell	A push button at an outer door that gives a ringing or buzzing signal when pushed. <i>Charlotte rang the doorbell.</i>
electricity	A form of energy resulting from the existence of charged particles (such as electrons or protons), either statically as an accumulation of charge or dynamically as a current. <i>They built a car that runs on electricity.</i>
gauge	Measure the dimensions of an object with a gauge. <i>It is difficult to gauge how effective the ban was.</i>

intercom	An electrical device allowing one-way or two-way communication. <i>A special intercom linking the theatre with the pathology lab.</i>
laptop	A computer that is portable and suitable for use while travelling.
measure	Determine the measurements of something or somebody take measurements of. <i>Tables of weights and measures.</i>
measurement	The size, length, or amount of something, as established by measuring. <i>Accurate measurement is essential.</i>
microphone	Device for converting sound waves into electrical energy.
mileage	The ratio of the number of miles traveled to the number of gallons of gasoline burned. <i>The car is in good condition considering its mileage.</i>
modem	Send data by modem. <i>Iva and Bill were modeming new programs to New Orleans.</i>
odometer	An instrument for measuring the distance travelled by a wheeled vehicle.
portable	A small transportable building used as a classroom. <i>The notes had been typed on an old portable with a faded ribbon.</i>
simulated	Imitating the conditions of something, especially as a training exercise. <i>Under simulated combat conditions.</i>
speedometer	A meter fixed to a vehicle that measures and displays its speed.
synthetic	A synthetic material or chemical especially a textile fibre. <i>Limnology is essentially a synthetic science composed of elements that extend well beyond the limits of biology.</i>
tachometer	Measuring instrument for indicating speed of rotation.
telephone	Make a telephone call. <i>Barbara had telephoned the news.</i>
velocity	Distance travelled per unit time. <i>The tank shot backwards at an incredible velocity.</i>
voltmeter	Meter that measures the potential difference between two points.
wireless	Medium for communication. <i>Wireless broadband.</i>
workstation	An area where work of a particular nature is carried out, such as a specific location on an assembly line.
wristwatch	A watch that is worn strapped to the wrist.
