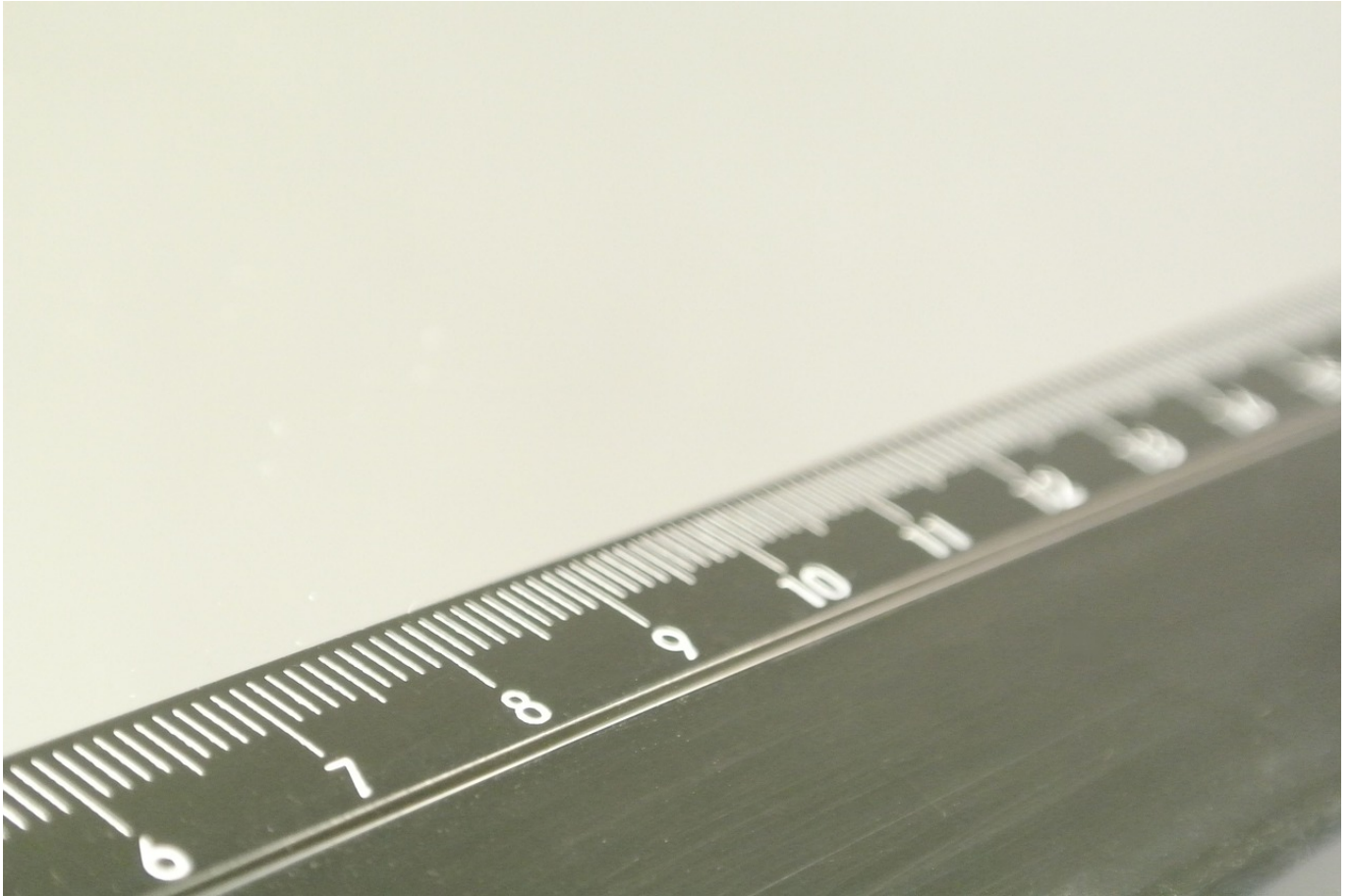

Dimensions as a Noun

Definitions of "Dimensions" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “dimensions” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The magnitude of something in a particular direction (especially length or width or height).*
- *Magnitude or extent.*
- *A construct whereby objects or individuals can be distinguished.*
- *One of three Cartesian coordinates that determine a position in space.*



Synonyms of "Dimensions" as a noun (3 Words)

- attribute** An abstraction belonging to or characteristic of an entity.
*It was not until the end of the fifteenth century that the sandglass was depicted as the **attribute** of Father Time.*
- property** Shares or investments in property.
*The **property** of heat to expand metal at uniform rates.*
- proportion** Dimensions; size.
*The view of what constitutes perfect bodily **proportions** changes from one generation to the next.*



Associations of "Dimensions" (30 Words)

- breadth** The distance or measurement from side to side of something; width.
*A teacher must have a **breadth** of knowledge of the subject.*
- contiguity** The sequential occurrence or proximity of stimulus and response, causing their association in the mind.
*Nations bound together by geographical **contiguity**.*
- distance** Keep at a distance.
*I cycled the short **distance** home.*
- distribution** The action or process of supplying goods to retailers.
*The government released about 74 000 tonnes of rice for **distribution** among people affected by the cyclone.*
- extent** The size or scale of something.
*The vast **extent** of the desert.*
- fathom** Come to understand.
*The locals could not **fathom** out the reason behind his new found prosperity.*
- gap** Make an opening or gap in.
*The media were bridging the **gap** between government and people.*
- gill** An organ in an invertebrate animal with a similar function to gills in fish and amphibians.
- inch** Advance slowly as if by inches.
*The toy train is four **inches** long.*
- interlude** Perform an interlude.
*An orchestral **interlude**.*
- interval** A component of activity in interval training.
*They ran sprinted and jogged for four 15 minute **intervals** at two different times.*
- length** The length of a swimming pool as a measure of the distance swum.
*The delta is twenty kilometres in **length**.*
- magnitude** A number assigned to the ratio of two quantities two quantities are of the same order of magnitude if one is less than 10 times as large as the other the number of magnitudes that the quantities differ is specified to within a power 0.
*A range of a tenth of a **magnitude**.*
- matrix** Mold used in the production of phonograph records, type, or other relief surface.
*Such fossils will often be partly concealed by **matrix**.*

| range | Range or extend over occupy a certain area. <i>He answered a range of questions.</i> |
| ratio | The quantitative relation between two amounts showing the number of times one value contains or is contained within the other. <i>The ratio of average prices to average salaries is at its lowest number for years.</i> |
| room | A set of rooms typically rented in which a person couple or family live. <i>The whole room was cheering.</i> |
| scale | Measure by or as if by a scale. <i>A spray on chemical for removing welding scale and heat discoloration from stainless steel.</i> |
| scope | Set the scope of a projected undertaking. <i>Infrared night scopes.</i> |
| size | Sized. <i>She s a size 10.</i> |
| space | One of the areas between or below or above the lines of a musical staff. <i>Write your name in the space provided.</i> |
| spatial | Relating to or occupying space. <i>The spatial distribution of the population.</i> |
| symmetry | A law or operation where a physical property or process has an equivalence in two or more directions. <i>This series has a line of symmetry through its centre.</i> |
| thick | Spoken as if with a thick tongue. <i>Bread spread thick with butter.</i> |
