- A formal evening meal, typically one in honour of a person or event.
- A party of people assembled to have dinner together.

evening meal A later concluding time period.

main meal Any very large body of (salt) water.

repast A meal.

A sumptuous **repast**.

A light evening meal; served in early evening if dinner is at midday or

supper served late in the evening at bedtime.

We had a delicious cold **supper**.
