Dinner as a Noun

Definitions of "Dinner" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “dinner” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The main meal of the day, taken either around midday or in the evening.*
- *The main meal of the day served in the evening or at midday.*
- *A formal evening meal, typically one in honour of a person or event.*
- *A party of people assembled to have dinner together.*



Synonyms of "Dinner" as a noun (5 Words)

dinner party The main meal of the day served in the evening or at midday.

evening meal A later concluding time period.

main meal Any very large body of (salt) water.

repast A meal.
*A sumptuous **repast**.*

supper A light evening meal; served in early evening if dinner is at midday or served late in the evening at bedtime.
*We had a delicious cold **supper**.*



Usage Examples of "Dinner" as a noun

- *Brown heard the phone ring during dinner.*
- *A dinner in honour of his homecoming.*
- *A candlelit dinner for two.*
- *What's for dinner?*
- *Eric sits next to Beth at the dinner table.*
- *On Sundays they had a large dinner when they returned from church.*
- *Guests should never be late to a dinner party.*
- *Dinner will be at 8.*
- *The annual graduation dinner.*



Associations of "Dinner" (30 Words)

- afternoon** In the afternoon every afternoon.
*I telephoned this **afternoon**.*
- breakfast** Provide breakfast for.
*We **breakfast** at seven.*
- brunch** A late morning meal eaten instead of breakfast and lunch.
*Breakfast was served so late as almost to constitute **brunch**.*
- buffet** A meal set out on a buffet at which guests help themselves.
*Winds **buffeted** the tent.*
- cafeteria** A restaurant where you serve yourself and pay a cashier.
*Employers who offer **cafeteria** plans and other flexible programs.*
- daybreak** The first light of day.
*She set off at **daybreak**.*

dine	Eat dinner in a restaurant. <i>We often dine with friends in this restaurant.</i>
diner	A person who is eating, typically a customer in a restaurant.
eating	The act of consuming food.
evening	In the evening every evening. <i>The evening meal.</i>
lunch	Eat lunch. <i>At what time are you lunching.</i>
luncheon	A midday meal. <i>A ladies luncheon was taking place.</i>
lunchtime	The time in the middle of the day when lunch is eaten. <i>At lunchtime they pulled into a lay by for a picnic.</i>
meal	The food eaten during a meal. <i>The evening meal.</i>
mealtime	The time at which a meal is eaten. <i>Family life seemed to revolve around mealtimes.</i>
menu	An agenda of things to do. <i>Politics and sport are on the menu tonight.</i>
midday	The middle of the day; noon. <i>He awoke at midday.</i>
midnight	Twelve o'clock at night. <i>The midnight hours.</i>
morning	Every morning. <i>They talked until morning.</i>
noon	The middle of the day. <i>The service starts at twelve noon.</i>
overnight	Done happening or for use overnight. <i>An overnight bag.</i>
plate	A main course served on a plate. <i>He recommended the roast beef plate.</i>
potluck	Whatever happens to be available especially when offered to an unexpected guest or when brought by guests and shared by all. <i>Having arrived unannounced we had to take potluck.</i>
pub	Frequent pubs. <i>Let s go to the pub.</i>
restaurant	A building where people go to eat.

- sleeper** A passenger car that has berths for sleeping.
*A KGB plot to uncover his **sleepers**.*
- snack** Eat a snack.
*It ll be a **snack**.*
- supper** An evening meal, typically a light or informal one.
*Her **suppers** often included celebrities.*
- tonight** On the present or approaching evening or night.
***Tonight** is a night to remember.*
- twilight** Lighted by or as if by twilight Henry Fielding.
*He loved the **twilight**.*
