<b>accusative</b>	The accusative case. <i><b>Accusative</b> endings.</i>
<b>beeline</b>	A straight line between two places. <i>He made a <b>beeline</b> for the bathroom.</i>
<b>bluff</b>	The act of bluffing in poker deception by a false show of confidence in the strength of your cards. <i>There s no point in trying to <b>bluff</b> it out.</i>
<b>currently</b>	At the present time. <i>The EC is <b>currently</b> attempting greater economic integration.</i>
<b>directly</b>	With nothing or no one in between. <i>The security forces were <b>directly</b> responsible for the massacre.</i>
<b>directness</b>	The quality of proceeding in a straight line without deflection. <i>He was renowned for the clarity and <b>directness</b> of his sermons.</i>
<b><u>firsthand</u></b>	Received directly from a source. <i>I heard this story <b>firsthand</b>.</i>
<b><u>honest</u></b>	Free of deceit; truthful and sincere. <i>You ll like it when you get there <b>honest</b>.</i>
<b>immediately</b>	In direct or very close relation. <i>They would be the states most <b>immediately</b> affected by any such action.</i>
<b><u>instantly</u></b>	Without any delay. <i>She fell asleep almost <b>instantly</b>.</i>
<b><u>instinct</u></b>	A natural or intuitive way of acting or thinking. <i>His <b>instinct</b> for making the most of his chances.</i>
<b>intuition</b>	The ability to understand something instinctively, without the need for conscious reasoning. <i>He had an <b>intuition</b> that something had gone wrong.</i>

<b>intuitive</b>	(chiefly of computer software) easy to use and understand. <i>His <b>intuitive</b> understanding of the readers real needs.</i>
<b>lineal</b>	In a straight unbroken line of descent from parent to child. <i><b>Lineal</b> heirs.</i>
<b>lineation</b>	The action or process of drawing lines or marking with lines. <i>Magnetic <b>lineations</b>.</i>
<b><u>nonstop</u></b>	Without stopping. <i>A <b>nonstop</b> flight to Atlanta.</i>
<b>now</b>	Indicates a change of subject or activity. <i>The <b>now</b> aging dictator.</i>
<b>prescriptive</b>	Attempting to impose rules of correct usage on the users of a language. <i>A <b>prescriptive</b> grammar book.</i>
<b>presently</b>	In the near future. <i>She will arrive <b>presently</b>.</i>
<b><u>psychic</u></b>	The study of psychic phenomena. <i>The field of <b>psychics</b>.</i>
<b><u>shortcut</u></b>	A route shorter than the usual one. <i>They were taking a <b>shortcut</b> to town.</i>
<b><u>soon</u></b>	In the near future. <i>I d <b>sooner</b> stay where I am.</i>
<b>squarely</b>	Directly and without evasion; not roundabout. <i>The responsibility lies <b>squarely</b> with them.</i>
<b><u>straight</u></b>	A straight segment of a roadway or racecourse. <i>A <b>straight</b> answer.</i>
<b>straightness</b>	Freedom from crooks or curves or bends or angles.
<b><u>target</u></b>	The location of the target that is to be hit. <i>A military <b>target</b>.</i>
<b><u>today</u></b>	The present period of time. <i>The world of <b>today</b>.</i>
<b><u>unilateral</u></b>	Relating to or affecting only one side of an organ, the body, or another structure. <i><b>Unilateral</b> cerebral lesions.</i>
<b><u>verbatim</u></b>	In exactly the same words as were used originally. <i>A <b>verbatim</b> account.</i>
<b>vocative</b>	A word in the vocative case. <i><b>Vocative</b> verb endings.</i>
