accusative	The accusative case. <i>Accusative endings.</i>
beeline	A straight line between two places. <i>He made a beeline for the bathroom.</i>
bluff	The act of bluffing in poker deception by a false show of confidence in the strength of your cards. <i>There s no point in trying to bluff it out.</i>
currently	At the present time. <i>The EC is currently attempting greater economic integration.</i>
directly	With nothing or no one in between. <i>The security forces were directly responsible for the massacre.</i>
directness	The quality of proceeding in a straight line without deflection. <i>He was renowned for the clarity and directness of his sermons.</i>
<u>firsthand</u>	Received directly from a source. <i>I heard this story firsthand.</i>
<u>honest</u>	Free of deceit; truthful and sincere. <i>You ll like it when you get there honest.</i>
immediately	In direct or very close relation. <i>They would be the states most immediately affected by any such action.</i>
<u>instantly</u>	Without any delay. <i>She fell asleep almost instantly.</i>
<u>instinct</u>	A natural or intuitive way of acting or thinking. <i>His instinct for making the most of his chances.</i>
intuition	The ability to understand something instinctively, without the need for conscious reasoning. <i>He had an intuition that something had gone wrong.</i>

intuitive	(chiefly of computer software) easy to use and understand. <i>His intuitive understanding of the readers real needs.</i>
lineal	In a straight unbroken line of descent from parent to child. <i>Lineal heirs.</i>
lineation	The action or process of drawing lines or marking with lines. <i>Magnetic lineations.</i>
<u>nonstop</u>	Without stopping. <i>A nonstop flight to Atlanta.</i>
now	Indicates a change of subject or activity. <i>The now aging dictator.</i>
prescriptive	Attempting to impose rules of correct usage on the users of a language. <i>A prescriptive grammar book.</i>
presently	In the near future. <i>She will arrive presently.</i>
<u>psychic</u>	The study of psychic phenomena. <i>The field of psychics.</i>
<u>shortcut</u>	A route shorter than the usual one. <i>They were taking a shortcut to town.</i>
<u>soon</u>	In the near future. <i>I d sooner stay where I am.</i>
squarely	Directly and without evasion; not roundabout. <i>The responsibility lies squarely with them.</i>
<u>straight</u>	A straight segment of a roadway or racecourse. <i>A straight answer.</i>
straightness	Freedom from crooks or curves or bends or angles.
<u>target</u>	The location of the target that is to be hit. <i>A military target.</i>
<u>today</u>	The present period of time. <i>The world of today.</i>
<u>unilateral</u>	Relating to or affecting only one side of an organ, the body, or another structure. <i>Unilateral cerebral lesions.</i>
<u>verbatim</u>	In exactly the same words as were used originally. <i>A verbatim account.</i>
vocative	A word in the vocative case. <i>Vocative verb endings.</i>
