
## **Directing as an Adjective**

#### Definitions of "Directing" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "directing" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Moving from west to east on the celestial sphere; or-for planets-around the sun in the same direction as the Earth.
- Lacking compromising or mitigating elements; exact.
- Straightforward in means or manner or behavior or language or action.
- Being an immediate result or consequence.
- Showing the way by conducting or leading; imposing direction on.
- Direct in spatial dimensions; proceeding without deviation or interruption; straight and short.
- In precisely the same words used by a writer or speaker.
- Similar in nature or effect or relation to another quantity.
- In a straight unbroken line of descent from parent to child.
- Having no intervening persons, agents, conditions.
- Flowing in one direction only.






#### Synonyms of "Directing" as an adjective (3 Words)

Relating to or indicating the direction in which someone or something is **directional** situated or moving.

The **directional** role of science on industrial progress.

- **directive** Showing the way by conducting or leading; imposing direction on. *The authority is seeking a directive role in energy policy.*
- **guiding** Exerting control or influence. A **guiding** principle.








### Usage Examples of "Directing" as an adjective

# Associations of "Directing" (30 Words)

accusative	A word in the accusative case. <i>Accusative</i> endings.
beeline	A straight line between two places. <i>He made a <b>beeline</b> for the bathroom.</i>
bluff	The act of bluffing in poker deception by a false show of confidence in the strength of your cards. <i>The offer was denounced as a <b>bluff</b>.</i>
currently	At the present time. <i>Currently</i> they live in Connecticut.



directly	Without changing direction or stopping. <i>He didn t answer <b>directly</b>.</i>
directness	The quality of being plain and straightforward. Despite the <b>directness</b> of the route the old road was terribly difficult.
<u>firsthand</u>	Received directly from a source. I heard this story <b>firsthand</b> .
<u>honest</u>	Gained or earned without cheating or stealing. My <b>honest</b> opinion.
immediately	At once; instantly. I rang <b>immediately</b> for an ambulance.
<u>instantly</u>	At once; immediately. She fell asleep almost <b>instantly</b> .
<u>instinct</u>	An innate, typically fixed pattern of behaviour in animals in response to certain stimuli. <i>Altruistic instincts in social animals.</i>
intuition	Instinctive knowing (without the use of rational processes. Your insights and <b>intuition</b> s as a native speaker are positively sought.
intuitive	(chiefly of computer software) easy to use and understand. <i>An <b>intuitive</b> revulsion.</i>
lineal	Arranged in a line. A <b>lineal</b> descendant.
lineation	A line or linear marking; an arrangement or group of lines. <i>Magnetic lineations</i> .
<u>nonstop</u>	A flight made without intermediate stops between source and destination. <i>How many <b>nonstop</b>s are there to Dallas.</i>
now	Used to preface a command or reproof or request. Let me see <b>now</b> oh yes I remember.
prescriptive	(of a right, title, or institution) having become legally established or accepted by long usage or the passage of time. A <b>prescriptive</b> grammar book.
presently	In the near future. There are <b>presently</b> 1 128 people on the waiting list.
<u>psychic</u>	A person considered or claiming to have psychic powers a medium. <i>Psychic energy.</i>
<u>shortcut</u>	An accelerated way of doing or achieving something. They were taking a <b>shortcut</b> to town.



<u>soon</u>	In or after a short time. I d just as <b>soon</b> Tim did it.	
squarely	With firmness and conviction; without compromise- C.G.Bowers. <i>The bat met the ball <b>squarely</b>.</i>	
<u>straight</u>	A straight segment of a roadway or racecourse. I m so tired I can hardly think <b>straight</b> .	
straightness Lack of a tendency to curl.		
<u>target</u>	The location of the target that is to be hit. The airport terminal was the <b>target</b> of a bomb.	
<u>today</u>	On or in the course of this present day. Did you see <b>today</b> s newspaper.	
<u>unilateral</u>	(of an action or decision) performed by or affecting only one person, group, or country involved in a situation, without the agreement of another or the others. A <b>unilateral</b> decision.	
<u>verbatim</u>	In exactly the same words as were used originally. <i>Repeated their dialog verbatim</i> .	
vocative	The vocative case. <i>Vocative</i> verb endings.
