- The revolutionary government in France 1795–9, comprising two councils and a fivemember executive. It maintained an aggressive foreign policy, but could not control events at home and was overthrown by Napoleon Bonaparte.
- A book of directions for the conduct of Christian worship, especially in Presbyterian and Roman Catholic Churches.
- A file which consists solely of a set of other files (which may themselves be directories).
- (computer science) a listing of the files stored in memory (usually on a hard disk.
- A listing of the files stored in memory (usually on a hard disk.
