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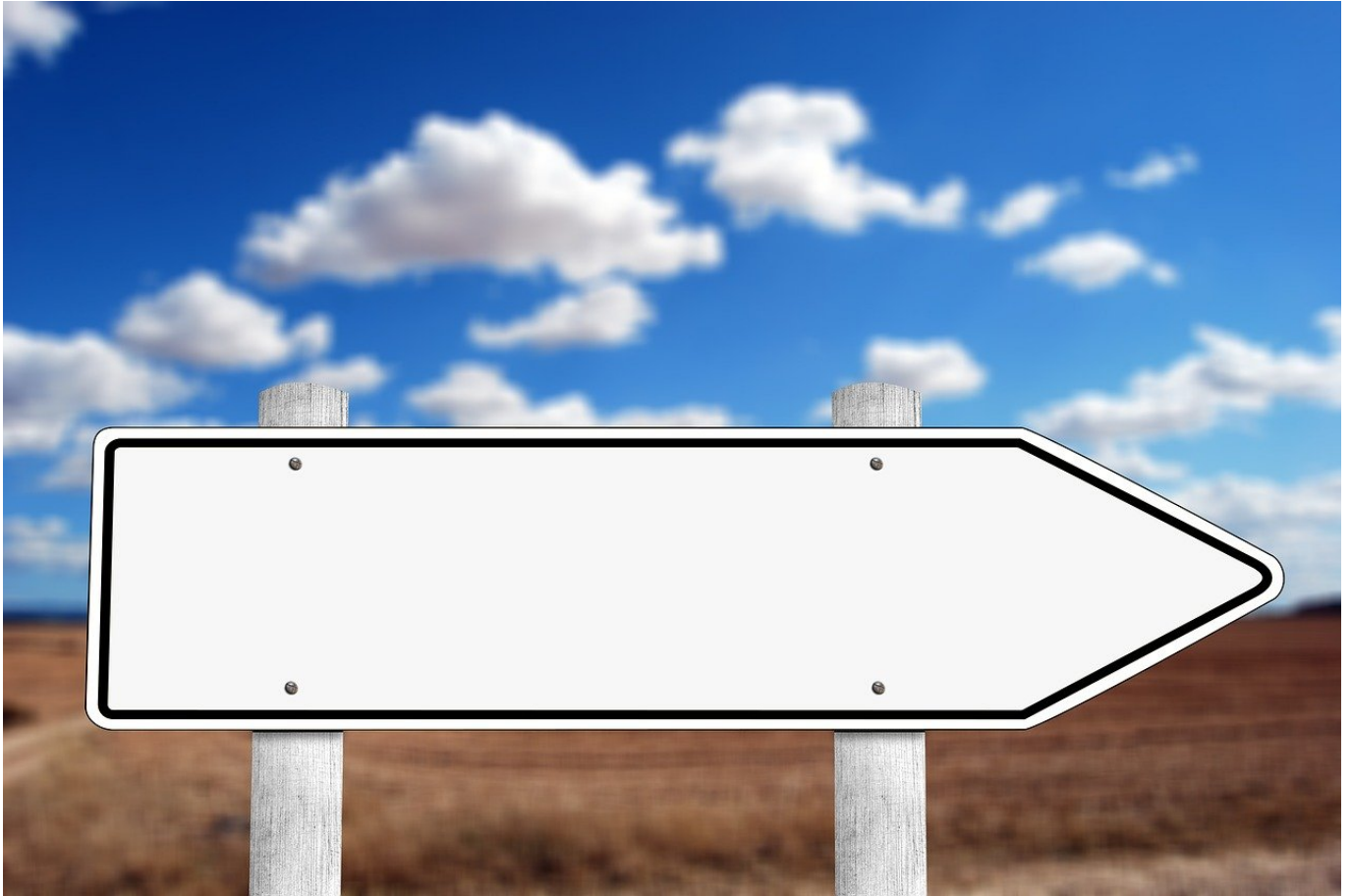

Directory as a Noun

Definitions of "Directory" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “directory” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A book or website listing individuals or organizations alphabetically or thematically with details such as names, addresses, and phone numbers.*
- *A board in an organization or large store listing names and locations of departments, individuals, etc.*
- *An alphabetical list of names and addresses.*
- *The revolutionary government in France 1795–9, comprising two councils and a five-member executive. It maintained an aggressive foreign policy, but could not control events at home and was overthrown by Napoleon Bonaparte.*
- *A book of directions for the conduct of Christian worship, especially in Presbyterian and Roman Catholic Churches.*
- *A file which consists solely of a set of other files (which may themselves be directories).*
- *(computer science) a listing of the files stored in memory (usually on a hard disk.*
- *A listing of the files stored in memory (usually on a hard disk.*

Associations of "Directory" (30 Words)

<u>annotate</u>	Provide interlinear explanations for words or phrases. <i>The scholar annotated the early edition of a famous novel.</i>
<u>bookmark</u>	A marker (a piece of paper or ribbon) placed between the pages of a book to mark the reader's place. <i>Fans will want to bookmark this site.</i>
brochure	A small book or magazine containing pictures and information about a product or service. <i>A holiday brochure.</i>
<u>checklist</u>	A list of items required, things to be done, or points to be considered, used as a reminder.
<u>compile</u>	Accumulate (a specified score). <i>The local authority must compile a list of the names and addresses of taxpayers.</i>
<u>data</u>	Things known or assumed as facts, making the basis of reasoning or calculation. <i>There is very little data available.</i>
datum	A fixed starting point of a scale or operation. <i>An accurate datum is formed by which other machining operations can be carried out.</i>
<u>descriptive</u>	Serving to describe or inform or characterized by description. <i>The text contains some good descriptive passages.</i>
desktop	The working area of a computer screen regarded as a representation of a notional desktop and containing icons representing items such as files. <i>You can now have multiple overlapping windows on the desktop.</i>
disk	Sound recording consisting of a disk with a continuous groove used to reproduce music by rotating while a phonograph needle tracks in the groove. <i>The moon s disk hung in a cloudless sky.</i>
<u>dossier</u>	A collection of papers containing detailed information about a particular person or subject (usually a person's record). <i>We have a dossier on him.</i>
edition	A particular version of a text maintained by regular revision. <i>He read it in yesterday s edition of the Times.</i>
<u>file</u>	File a formal charge against. <i>File for divorce.</i>
folder	A folded leaflet or a booklet made of folded sheets of paper.

guide	Use as a guide. <i>They had the lights to guide on.</i>
handbook	A concise reference book providing specific information about a subject or location. <i>A handbook of poisonous plants.</i>
<u>index</u>	Link the value of prices wages or other payments automatically to the value of a price index. <i>The Supreme Soviet passed legislation indexing wages to prices.</i>
information	In information theory a mathematical quantity expressing the probability of occurrence of a particular sequence of symbols impulses etc as against that of alternative sequences. <i>Genetically transmitted information.</i>
instructions	A manual usually accompanying a technical device and explaining how to install or operate it.
item	Also Philip Guedalla used when listing or enumerating items. <i>An item of clothing.</i>
leaflet	Distribute leaflets to people or an area. <i>Tourists visiting the area are being leafleted.</i>
listing	A database containing an ordered array of items (names or topics).
pamphlet	Distribute pamphlets to. <i>He published a spate of pamphlets on the subjects about which he felt strongly.</i>
peruse	Examine carefully or at length. <i>Laura perused a Caravaggio.</i>
prospectus	A formal written offer to sell securities (filed with the SEC) that sets forth a plan for a (proposed) business enterprise. <i>A prospectus should contain the facts that an investor needs to make an informed decision.</i>
<u>register</u>	A cashbox with an adding machine to register transactions used in shops to add up the bill. <i>At the store s bridal registry single people can register for gifts even if they are not getting married.</i>
sampling	Measurement at regular intervals of the amplitude of a varying waveform (in order to convert it to digital form). <i>Routine river sampling is carried out according to a schedule.</i>
studying	Reading carefully with intent to remember.
<u>text</u>	A textbook. <i>Too much concentration on set texts can turn pupils against reading.</i>

Arrange (a piece of music) for a different instrument, voice, or group of these.

Polymerases **transcribe** it into a long RNA molecule.
