- Marked by deprivation especially of the necessities of life or healthful environmental influences.
- (of a person or area) in unfavourable circumstances, especially with regard to financial or social opportunities.





## Synonyms of "Disadvantaged" as an adjective (7 Words)

depressed	(of a person) in a state of unhappiness or despondency. <b>Depressed</b> by the loss of his job.
<u>deprived</u>	(of a person) lacking a specified benefit that is considered important. <i>The charity cares for destitute and <b>deprived</b> children.</i>
in distress	Directed or bound inward.
in need	Currently fashionable.
in want	Holding office.
<u>needy</u>	Demanding or needing attention, affection, or reassurance to an excessive degree. The provision of humanitarian assistance to the <b>needy</b> .
<u>underprivileged</u>	(of a person) not enjoying the same standard of living or rights as the majority of people in a society. <i>The plight of the <b>underprivileged</b>.</i>

- Disadvantaged groups such as the unemployed.





# Associations of "Disadvantaged" (30 Words)

Involving calamity; catastrophic or disastrous. A <b>calamitous</b> defeat.
Suffering a severe and damaging lack of basic material and cultural benefits. Boys from a <b>deprived</b> environment wherein the family life revealed a pattern of neglect moral degradation and disregard for law.
Highly unsuccessful. The battle was a <b>disastrous</b> end to a <b>disastrous</b> campaign.
Disappointed in someone or something that one discovers to be less good than one had believed. <i>The minority groups were completely</i> <b>disillusioned</b> <i>with the party.</i>
Having far-reaching and often disastrous consequences or implications. That <b>fateful</b> meeting of the UN when it declared war on North Korea.
A feeling of evil to come. With a sense of <b>foreboding</b> she read the note.
(especially of a person) unfortunate. A <b>hapless</b> victim.
Not conducive to success; unpromising. My words with <b>inauspicious</b> thunderings shook heaven.
Marked by or producing unhappiness- American Guide Series. <i>Infelicitous</i> phrasing.
Of low or inferior quality. <i>Her social and intellectual <b>inferior</b>s.</i>
An unfortunate incident; a mishap. The petty misdemeanours and <b>misadventure</b> s of childhood.
An unpredictable outcome that is unfortunate. Innumerable <b>mischance</b> s might ruin the enterprise.
Of very poor quality or condition. Their happiness made Anne feel even more <b>miserable</b> .
An unlucky accident. The event passed without <b>mishap</b> .
A state of extreme poverty. <i>He recognized her <b>neediness</b> but had no time to respond to it.</i>
Presaging ill fortune. A dead and <b>ominous</b> silence prevailed.



<u>pathetic</u>	Arousing pity, especially through vulnerability or sadness. <i>His ball control was <b>pathetic</b></i> .
penury	A state of extreme poverty or destitution. <i>He couldn t face another year of <b>penury</b>.</i>
piteous	Deserving or inciting pity- Galsworthy. A <b>piteous</b> cry.
pitiable	Deserving or inciting pity. <i>Pitiable</i> homeless children.
<u>pitiful</u>	Inspiring mixed contempt and pity. A <b>pitiful</b> fate.
poverty	The state of being inferior in quality or insufficient in amount. The <b>poverty</b> of her imagination.
<u>underprivileged</u>	(of a person) not enjoying the same standard of living or rights as the majority of people in a society. <i>The plight of the <b>underprivileged</b>.</i>
<u>unfortunate</u>	Not auspicious; boding ill. An <b>unfortunate</b> speech.
unfulfilled	Not carried out or brought to completion. It was his <b>unfulfilled</b> ambition to write.
unhappy	Causing discomfort. <i>After the argument they lapsed into an</i> <b>unhappy</b> silence.
unlucky	Having, bringing, or resulting from bad luck. An <b>unlucky</b> defeat.
unpropitious	Not propitious. <i>His reports were submitted at a financially</i> <b>unpropitious</b> <i>time.</i>
<u>unsuccessful</u>	Failing to accomplish an intended result. An <b>unsuccessful</b> attempt to enter Parliament.
wretched	Deserving or inciting pity. She disliked the <b>wretched</b> man intensely.
