## Disappear as a Verb

### Definitions of "Disappear" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “disappear” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Become less intense and fade away gradually.*
- *Get lost, as without warning or explanation.*
- *Cease to exist or be in use.*
- *Cease to exist.*
- *Abduct or arrest and kill or detain (a person) for political reasons, without making their fate known.*
- *Be lost or go missing; become impossible to find.*
- *Cease to be visible.*
- *Become invisible or unnoticeable.*



## Synonyms of "Disappear" as a verb (34 Words)

<b>be forgotten</b>	Represent, as of a character on stage.
<b>be left behind</b>	Work in a specific place, with a specific subject, or in a specific function.
<b>be lost to sight</b>	Represent, as of a character on stage.
<b>be lost to view</b>	Work in a specific place, with a specific subject, or in a specific function.
<b>be mislaid</b>	Occupy a certain position or area.
<b>be no more</b>	Be priced at.
<b>become extinct</b>	Undergo a change or development.
<b>cease to be</b>	Put an end to a state or an activity.
<b>cease to be visible</b>	Put an end to a state or an activity.
<b>cease to exist</b>	Have an end, in a temporal, spatial, or quantitative sense; either spatial or metaphorical.

<b>come to an end</b>	Happen as a result.
<b>die</b>	Die one after another until few or none are left. <i>Three toasters have <b>died</b> on me.</i>
<b>die out</b>	To be on base at the end of an inning, of a player.
<b>end</b>	Be the end of be the last or concluding part of. <i>The surfaced road <b>ends</b> at the farm.</i>
<b>evaporate</b>	Lose or cause to lose moisture or solvent as vapour. <i>The water <b>evaporated</b> in front of our eyes.</i>
<b>expire</b>	(of a person) die. <i>My passports <b>expired</b> last month.</i>
<b><u>fade</u></b>	(of a racehorse, runner, etc.) lose strength and cease to perform well. <i>The ball <b>faded</b> toward an area left of the green.</i>
<b>fade away</b>	Lose freshness, vigor, or vitality.
<b>fizzle out</b>	Reveal (something) about somebody's identity or lifestyle.
<b>get lost</b>	Irritate.
<b>go away</b>	Stretch out over a distance, space, time, or scope; run or extend between two points or beyond a certain point.
<b>go missing</b>	Go through in search of something; search through someone's belongings in an unauthorized way.
<b>leave no trace</b>	Transmit (knowledge or skills).
<b><u>melt</u></b>	Become more relaxed, easygoing, or genial. <i><b>Melt</b> butter.</i>
<b>melt away</b>	Become less clearly visible or distinguishable; disappear gradually or seemingly.
<b>pass away</b>	Move past.
<b>pass from sight</b>	Grant authorization or clearance for.
<b>pass into oblivion</b>	Go successfully through a test or a selection process.
<b>perish</b>	Be suffering from extreme cold. <i>An abandoned tyre whose rubber had <b>perished</b>.</i>
<b>peter out</b>	To state openly and publicly one's homosexuality.
<b>recede from view</b>	Retreat.
<b><u>vanish</u></b>	Pass away rapidly. <i>The environment is under threat hedgerows and woodlands are <b>vanishing</b>.</i>
<b>vanish from sight</b>	Get lost, as without warning or explanation.
<b>wither away</b>	Wither, as with a loss of moisture.



## Usage Examples of "Disappear" as a verb

- *He disappeared into the trees.*
- *It is estimated that some 7000 people have been disappeared by security forces.*
- *The tension had completely disappeared.*
- *He disappeared without a trace.*
- *My wallet seems to have disappeared.*
- *The sun had disappeared.*

<b>ablate</b>	Wear away through erosion or vaporization. <i>Drying winds slowly <b>ablate</b> away the ice.</i>
<b>concealed</b>	Kept secret; hidden. <i><b>Concealed</b> or hidden damage.</i>
<u><b>decease</b></u>	Pass from physical life and lose all bodily attributes and functions necessary to sustain life. <i>He <b>deceased</b> at his palace of Croydon.</i>
<b>defunct</b>	Having ceased to exist or live. <i>The will of a <b>defunct</b> aunt.</i>
<b>die</b>	Cut or shape with a die. <i>Martyrs may <b>die</b> every day for their faith.</i>
<u><b>disappearance</b></u>	Gradually ceasing to be visible. <i>The police were investigating her <b>disappearance</b>.</i>
<u><b>dispel</b></u>	To cause to separate and go in different directions. <i><b>Dispel</b> doubts.</i>
<b>dissipate</b>	Waste or fritter away (money, energy, or resources). <i>He inherited but then <b>dissipated</b> his father's fortune.</i>
<b>dryness</b>	Moderation in or abstinence from alcohol or other drugs. <i>The sea retreated in periods of prolonged <b>dryness</b>.</i>
<b>evaporate</b>	Lose or cause to lose moisture or solvent as vapour. <i>The solution was <b>evaporated</b> to dryness.</i>
<b>evaporation</b>	The process of turning from liquid into vapour. <i>Thousands of employees witnessed the rapid <b>evaporation</b> of their retirement plans.</i>
<b>expire</b>	Pass from physical life and lose all bodily attributes and functions necessary to sustain life. <i>My passports <b>expired</b> last month.</i>
<u><b>extinct</b></u>	No longer in existence; lost or especially having died out leaving no living representatives. <i><b>Extinct</b> laws and customs.</i>
<u><b>fade</b></u>	Disappear gradually. <i>When they get to the 18th the ideal shot is a <b>fade</b>.</i>
<u><b>gone</b></u>	Dead. <i>You were <b>gone</b> a long time.</i>

<b>hide</b>	Be or go into hiding; keep out of sight, as for protection and safety. <i>Herbert could hardly <b>hide</b> his dislike.</i>
<b><u>inconspicuous</u></b>	Not prominent or readily noticeable. <i>He pushed the string through an <b>inconspicuous</b> hole.</i>
<b><u>invisible</u></b>	Invisible exports and imports. <i><b>Invisible</b> rays.</i>
<b>moribund</b>	(of a person) at the point of death. <i>A <b>moribund</b> patient.</i>
<b><u>obscure</u></b>	Make obscure or unclear. <i>The <b>obscure</b> light of dawn.</i>
<b><u>obscurity</u></b>	The state of being unknown, inconspicuous, or unimportant. <i>He worked in <b>obscurity</b> for many years.</i>
<b>perish</b>	Die, especially in a violent or sudden way. <i>An abandoned tyre whose rubber had <b>perished</b>.</i>
<b><u>scatter</u></b>	Sow by scattering. <i><b>Scatter</b> seeds.</i>
<b>subspecies</b>	A taxonomic group that is a division of a species; usually arises as a consequence of geographical isolation within a species.
<b>transpiration</b>	The process of giving off or exhaling water vapor through the skin or mucous membranes. <i>Plants lose more than 90 per cent of their water through <b>transpiration</b>.</i>
<b><u>unnoticeable</u></b>	Not drawing attention. <i>An <b>unnoticeable</b> cigarette burn on the carpet.</i>
<b><u>unseen</u></b>	An unseen passage for translation. <i><b>Unseen</b> problems.</i>
<b><u>vanish</u></b>	Decrease rapidly and disappear. <i>The effect <b>vanished</b> when day broke.</i>
<b>vaporize</b>	Decrease rapidly and disappear. <i>Cold gasoline does not <b>vaporize</b> readily.</i>
<b>withdraw</b>	Withdraw from active participation. <i>He failed to <b>withdraw</b> his remarks and apologize.</i>
