Definitions of "Disappear" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “disappear” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Become less intense and fade away gradually.*
- *Get lost, as without warning or explanation.*
- *Cease to exist or be in use.*
- *Cease to exist.*
- *Abduct or arrest and kill or detain (a person) for political reasons, without making their fate known.*
- *Be lost or go missing; become impossible to find.*
- *Cease to be visible.*
- *Become invisible or unnoticeable.*

be forgotten	Represent, as of a character on stage.
be left behind	Work in a specific place, with a specific subject, or in a specific function.
be lost to sight	Represent, as of a character on stage.
be lost to view	Work in a specific place, with a specific subject, or in a specific function.
be mislaid	Occupy a certain position or area.
be no more	Be priced at.
become extinct	Undergo a change or development.
cease to be	Put an end to a state or an activity.
cease to be visible	Put an end to a state or an activity.
cease to exist	Have an end, in a temporal, spatial, or quantitative sense; either spatial or metaphorical.

come to an end	Happen as a result.
die	Die one after another until few or none are left. <i>Three toasters have died on me.</i>
die out	To be on base at the end of an inning, of a player.
end	Be the end of be the last or concluding part of. <i>The surfaced road ends at the farm.</i>
evaporate	Lose or cause to lose moisture or solvent as vapour. <i>The water evaporated in front of our eyes.</i>
expire	(of a person) die. <i>My passports expired last month.</i>
fade	(of a racehorse, runner, etc.) lose strength and cease to perform well. <i>The ball faded toward an area left of the green.</i>
fade away	Lose freshness, vigor, or vitality.
fizzle out	Reveal (something) about somebody's identity or lifestyle.
get lost	Irritate.
go away	Stretch out over a distance, space, time, or scope; run or extend between two points or beyond a certain point.
go missing	Go through in search of something; search through someone's belongings in an unauthorized way.
leave no trace	Transmit (knowledge or skills).
melt	Become more relaxed, easygoing, or genial. <i>Melt butter.</i>
melt away	Become less clearly visible or distinguishable; disappear gradually or seemingly.
pass away	Move past.
pass from sight	Grant authorization or clearance for.
pass into oblivion	Go successfully through a test or a selection process.
perish	Be suffering from extreme cold. <i>An abandoned tyre whose rubber had perished.</i>
peter out	To state openly and publicly one's homosexuality.
recede from view	Retreat.
vanish	Pass away rapidly. <i>The environment is under threat hedgerows and woodlands are vanishing.</i>
vanish from sight	Get lost, as without warning or explanation.
wither away	Wither, as with a loss of moisture.

- *It is estimated that some 7000 people have been disappeared by security forces.*
- *The tension had completely disappeared.*

- *The sun had disappeared.*



Associations of "Disappear" (30 Words)

ablate	Wear away through erosion or vaporization. <i>Drying winds slowly ablate away the ice.</i>
concealed	Kept secret; hidden. <i>Concealed or hidden damage.</i>
<u>decease</u>	Pass from physical life and lose all bodily attributes and functions necessary to sustain life. <i>He deceased at his palace of Croydon.</i>
defunct	Having ceased to exist or live. <i>The will of a defunct aunt.</i>
die	Cut or shape with a die. <i>Martyrs may die every day for their faith.</i>
<u>disappearance</u>	Gradually ceasing to be visible. <i>The police were investigating her disappearance.</i>
<u>dispel</u>	To cause to separate and go in different directions. <i>Dispel doubts.</i>
dissipate	Waste or fritter away (money, energy, or resources). <i>He inherited but then dissipated his father's fortune.</i>
dryness	Moderation in or abstinence from alcohol or other drugs. <i>The sea retreated in periods of prolonged dryness.</i>
evaporate	Lose or cause to lose moisture or solvent as vapour. <i>The solution was evaporated to dryness.</i>
evaporation	The process of turning from liquid into vapour. <i>Thousands of employees witnessed the rapid evaporation of their retirement plans.</i>
expire	Pass from physical life and lose all bodily attributes and functions necessary to sustain life. <i>My passports expired last month.</i>
<u>extinct</u>	No longer in existence; lost or especially having died out leaving no living representatives. <i>Extinct laws and customs.</i>
<u>fade</u>	Disappear gradually. <i>When they get to the 18th the ideal shot is a fade.</i>
<u>gone</u>	Dead. <i>You were gone a long time.</i>

hide	Be or go into hiding; keep out of sight, as for protection and safety. <i>Herbert could hardly hide his dislike.</i>
<u>inconspicuous</u>	Not prominent or readily noticeable. <i>He pushed the string through an inconspicuous hole.</i>
<u>invisible</u>	Invisible exports and imports. <i>Invisible rays.</i>
moribund	(of a person) at the point of death. <i>A moribund patient.</i>
<u>obscure</u>	Make obscure or unclear. <i>The obscure light of dawn.</i>
<u>obscurity</u>	The state of being unknown, inconspicuous, or unimportant. <i>He worked in obscurity for many years.</i>
perish	Die, especially in a violent or sudden way. <i>An abandoned tyre whose rubber had perished.</i>
<u>scatter</u>	Sow by scattering. <i>Scatter seeds.</i>
subspecies	A taxonomic group that is a division of a species; usually arises as a consequence of geographical isolation within a species.
transpiration	The process of giving off or exhaling water vapor through the skin or mucous membranes. <i>Plants lose more than 90 per cent of their water through transpiration.</i>
<u>unnoticeable</u>	Not drawing attention. <i>An unnoticeable cigarette burn on the carpet.</i>
<u>unseen</u>	An unseen passage for translation. <i>Unseen problems.</i>
<u>vanish</u>	Decrease rapidly and disappear. <i>The effect vanished when day broke.</i>
vaporize	Decrease rapidly and disappear. <i>Cold gasoline does not vaporize readily.</i>
withdraw	Withdraw from active participation. <i>He failed to withdraw his remarks and apologize.</i>
