- *The process of something ceasing to exist or be in use.*
- *The act of leaving secretly or without explanation.*

coming to an end	The moment of most intense pleasure in sexual intercourse.
death	The personification of death. <i>He seemed more content in death than he had ever been in life.</i>
disappearing	The act of leaving secretly or without explanation.
dying	The time when something ends. <i>A dying of old hopes.</i>
dying out	The time when something ends.
ending	The act of ending something. <i>The student has to choose the right plural endings.</i>
expiry	A coming to an end of a contract period. <i>The expiry of the patent.</i>

extinction	The fact or process of a species, family, or other group of animals or plants becoming extinct. <i>A private debt extinction fund.</i>
fade	A golf shot that curves to the right for a right-handed golfer. <i>The sun can cause colour fade.</i>
fading	Weakening in force or intensity.
fading away	Weakening in force or intensity.
fizzling out	A failure by a batter or runner to reach a base safely in baseball.
loss	Something that is lost. <i>Loss of livestock left the rancher bankrupt.</i>
melting away	The process whereby heat changes something from a solid to a liquid.
passing away	A play that involves one player throwing the ball to a teammate.
passing from sight	A bodily reaction of changing from one place or stage to another.
passing into oblivion	Success in satisfying a test or requirement.
petering out	A failure by a batter or runner to reach a base safely in baseball.
vanishing	A sudden disappearance from sight.
withering away	Any weakening or degeneration (especially through lack of use).

disintegration

The spontaneous disintegration of a radioactive substance along with the emission of ionizing radiation.
A disintegration of personality.

dissipate

Live a life of pleasure, especially with respect to alcoholic consumption.
He wanted to dissipate his anger.

dissipation

Breaking up and scattering by dispersion.
The dissipation of the mist.

dissolution	The termination of a meeting. <i>Minerals susceptible to dissolution.</i>
enigmatic	Resembling an oracle in obscurity of thought. <i>Prophetic texts so enigmatic that their meaning has been disputed for centuries.</i>
evaporation	The process of something abstract ceasing to exist. <i>Thousands of employees witnessed the rapid evaporation of their retirement plans.</i>
extravagance	A thing on which too much money has been spent or which has used up too many resources. <i>Salmon trout is an unnecessary extravagance.</i>
fade	A haircut in which the hair is left long on top of the head but cropped close to the sides and back with the length of hair gradually decreasing. <i>He skilfully fades the guitar lines up and down.</i>
incomprehensible	Not able to be understood; not intelligible. <i>The most incomprehensible thing about the universe is that it is comprehensible.</i>
inexplicable	Incapable of being explained or accounted for. <i>Inexplicable errors.</i>
inscrutable	Impossible to understand or interpret. <i>Guy looked blankly inscrutable.</i>
looseness	The quality of movability by virtue of being free from attachment or other restraints. <i>The flexibility and looseness of the materials from which mythology is made.</i>
miss	Fail to see or have a meeting with (someone). <i>The arrow missed the target.</i>
mysterious	Of an obscure nature. <i>A dark mysterious windowless building.</i>
obscurity	The state of being indistinct or indefinite for lack of adequate illumination. <i>He is too good a player to slide into obscurity.</i>
occult	Supernatural forces and events and beings collectively. <i>The beam of light occults every so often.</i>
odd	Separated from a usual pair or set and therefore out of place or mismatched. <i>Invited 30 odd guests.</i>

<u>puzzling</u>	Not clear to the understanding. <i>Only one very puzzling question remains unanswered.</i>
<u>scatter</u>	The scattering of light other electromagnetic radiation or particles. Scatter cards across the table.
sibylline	Resembling or characteristic of a prophet or prophecy. <i>His fascinating if sometimes sibylline meditations on the nation.</i>
sudden	Suddenly. A sudden storm.
unaccountable	Not to be accounted for or explained. <i>A powerful and unaccountable institution.</i>
uncanny	Surpassing the ordinary or normal - George Will. <i>Stumps had uncanny shapes as of monstrous creatures.</i>
<u>vanish</u>	Get lost, as without warning or explanation. <i>The money vanished in las Vegas.</i>
vaporize	Convert or be converted into vapour. <i>Cold gasoline does not vaporize readily.</i>
<u>wasteful</u>	Inefficient in use of time and effort and materials. <i>A clumsy and wasteful process.</i>
<u>weird</u>	Suggesting something supernatural; unearthly. Weird inhuman sounds.
