extinction	The fact or process of a species, family, or other group of animals or plants becoming extinct. <i>A private debt <b>extinction</b> fund</i> .
<u>fade</u>	A golf shot that curves to the right for a right-handed golfer. <i>The sun can cause colour <b>fade</b></i> .
fading	Weakening in force or intensity.
fading away	Weakening in force or intensity.
fizzling out	A failure by a batter or runner to reach a base safely in baseball.
loss	Something that is lost. <b>Loss</b> of livestock left the rancher bankrupt.
melting away	The process whereby heat changes something from a solid to a liquid.
passing away	A play that involves one player throwing the ball to a teammate.
passing from sight	A bodily reaction of changing from one place or stage to another.
passing into oblivion Success in satisfying a test or requirement.	
petering out	A failure by a batter or runner to reach a base safely in baseball.
vanishing	A sudden disappearance from sight.
withering away	Any weakening or degeneration (especially through lack of use.

<u>cryptic</u>	Having a secret or hidden meaning. <i>He found his boss s utterances too <b>cryptic</b>.</i>
<u>disappear</u>	Get lost, as without warning or explanation. It is estimated that some 7000 people have been <b>disappear</b> ed by security forces.
disintegration	The spontaneous disintegration of a radioactive substance along with the emission of ionizing radiation. <i>A disintegration of personality.</i>
dissipate	Live a life of pleasure, especially with respect to alcoholic consumption. <i>He wanted to <b>dissipate</b> his anger.</i>
dissipation	Breaking up and scattering by dispersion. The <b>dissipation</b> of the mist.



<u>dissolution</u>	The termination of a meeting. Minerals susceptible to <b>dissolution</b> .
enigmatic	Resembling an oracle in obscurity of thought. Prophetic texts so <b>enigmatic</b> that their meaning has been disputed for centuries.
evaporation	The process of something abstract ceasing to exist. Thousands of employees witnessed the rapid <b>evaporation</b> of their retirement plans.
extravagance	A thing on which too much money has been spent or which has used up too many resources. Salmon trout is an unnecessary <b>extravagance</b> .
<u>fade</u>	A haircut in which the hair is left long on top of the head but cropped close to the sides and back with the length of hair gradually decreasing. <i>He skilfully fades the guitar lines up and down.</i>
incomprehensible	Not able to be understood; not intelligible. The most <b>incomprehensible</b> thing about the universe is that it is comprehensible.
<u>inexplicable</u>	Incapable of being explained or accounted for. <i>Inexplicable</i> errors.
inscrutable	Impossible to understand or interpret. <i>Guy looked blankly <b>inscrutable</b></i> .
looseness	The quality of movability by virtue of being free from attachment or other restraints. The flexibility and <b>looseness</b> of the materials from which mythology is made.
<u>miss</u>	Fail to see or have a meeting with (someone. <i>The arrow <b>miss</b>ed the target.</i>
mysterious	Of an obscure nature. A dark <b>mysterious</b> windowless building.
<u>obscurity</u>	The state of being indistinct or indefinite for lack of adequate illumination. He is too good a player to slide into <b>obscurity</b> .
<u>occult</u>	Supernatural forces and events and beings collectively. The beam of light <b>occult</b> s every so often.
<u>odd</u>	Separated from a usual pair or set and therefore out of place or mismatched. Invited 30 <b>odd</b> guests.



<u>puzzling</u>	Not clear to the understanding. Only one very <b>puzzling</b> question remains unanswered.
<u>scatter</u>	The scattering of light other electromagnetic radiation or particles. <i>Scatter cards across the table</i> .
sibylline	Resembling or characteristic of a prophet or prophecy. <i>His fascinating if sometimes</i> <b>sibylline</b> <i>meditations on the nation.</i>
sudden	Suddenly. A <b>sudden</b> storm.
unaccountable	Not to be accounted for or explained. A powerful and <b>unaccountable</b> institution.
uncanny	Surpassing the ordinary or normal – George Will. Stumps had <b>uncanny</b> shapes as of monstrous creatures.
<u>vanish</u>	Get lost, as without warning or explanation. The money <b>vanish</b> ed in las Vegas.
vaporize	Convert or be converted into vapour. Cold gasoline does not <b>vaporize</b> readily.
<u>wasteful</u>	Inefficient in use of time and effort and materials. A clumsy and <b>wasteful</b> process.
<u>weird</u>	Suggesting something supernatural; unearthly. <i>Weird</i> inhuman sounds.
