abhorrent	Inspiring disgust and loathing; repugnant. <i>An abhorrent deed.</i>
adverse	Preventing success or development; harmful; unfavourable. <i>Adverse currents.</i>
antisocial	Relating to or having an antisocial personality disorder. <i>He s not antisocial just shy.</i>
aversion	A person or thing that arouses strong feelings of dislike. <i>My dog s pet aversion is visitors particularly males.</i>
bigot	A person who is obstinately or unreasonably attached to a belief, opinion, or faction, especially one who is prejudiced against or antagonistic towards a person or people on the basis of their membership of a particular group. <i>A racist bigot.</i>
comparison	Qualities that are comparable. <i>They made a comparison of noise levels.</i>
detestation	Intense dislike. <i>He is the detestation of the neighbourhood.</i>
disaffected	Dissatisfied, especially with people in authority or a system of control. <i>A military plot by disaffected elements in the army.</i>
discriminatory	Containing or implying a slight or showing prejudice. <i>Discriminatory employment practices.</i>
disfavor	Put at a disadvantage; hinder, harm. <i>He is in disfavor with the king.</i>
dislike	Have or feel a dislike or distaste for. <i>They had taken a dislike to each other.</i>
grievance	A resentment strong enough to justify retaliation. <i>Three pilots have filed grievances against the company.</i>

hate	Intense dislike. <i>Two separate polls confirmed he is hated by the public.</i>
hatred	The emotion of intense dislike; a feeling of dislike so strong that it demands action. <i>His murderous hatred of his brother.</i>
hostile	Unsolicited and resisted by the management of the target company (used of attempts to buy or take control of a business. <i>A hostile audience.</i>
inhospitable	Not hospitable. <i>The inhospitable landscape.</i>
injustice	Lack of fairness or justice. <i>Brooding over life s injustices.</i>
intolerant	Narrow-minded about cherished opinions. <i>Some people are intolerant of aspirin.</i>
invidious	Containing or implying a slight or showing prejudice. <i>Invidious comparisons.</i>
jaundiced	Affected by jaundice which causes yellowing of skin etc. <i>Takes a jaundiced view of societies and clubs.</i>
misogynist	Relating to or characteristic of a misogynist. <i>A bachelor and renowned misogynist.</i>
misogyny	Dislike of, contempt for, or ingrained prejudice against women. <i>She felt she was struggling against thinly disguised misogyny.</i>
negative	A negative photographic image made on film or specially prepared glass from which positive prints may be made. <i>Minus or negative factors.</i>
overtly	Without concealment or secrecy; openly. <i>Some of the narrative is overtly sexual.</i>
prejudiced	Having or showing a dislike or distrust that is derived from prejudice; bigoted. <i>A prejudiced judge.</i>
racist	Discriminatory especially on the basis of race or religion. <i>We are investigating complaints about racist abuse.</i>
repelling	Highly offensive; arousing aversion or disgust.
repugnant	In conflict or incompatible with. <i>Cannibalism seems repugnant to us.</i>
sexist	A person with sexist views. <i>Sexists have no place in our modern political campaigns.</i>
