| <b>fighter</b>      | A high-speed military or naval airplane designed to destroy enemy aircraft in the air.<br><i>There ll be months of physiotherapy but medical staff say she s a <b>fighter</b>.</i>       |
| <b>invader</b>      | Someone who enters by force in order to conquer.<br><i>It is a country that has repelled all <b>invaders</b>.</i>  |
