Definitions of "Disc" as a noun

- *Sound recording consisting of a disk with a continuous groove; used to reproduce music by rotating while a phonograph needle tracks in the groove.*
- *Something with a round shape resembling a flat circular plate.*
- *An object or part resembling a disc in shape or appearance.*
- *A memory device consisting of a flat disk covered with a magnetic coating on which information is stored.*
- *The central part of the flower of a daisy or other composite plant, consisting of a close-packed cluster of tubular florets.*
- *(computer science) a memory device consisting of a flat disk covered with a magnetic coating on which information is stored.*
- *A layer of cartilage separating adjacent vertebrae in the spine.*
- *A CD or record.*
- *A flat circular plate.*
- *A flat, thin circular object.*
- *One of the suits in some tarot packs, corresponding to coins in others.*

- An information storage device for a computer in the shape of a round flat plate which can be rotated to give access to all parts of the surface. The data may be stored either magnetically (in a magnetic disk) or optically (in an optical disk such as a CD-ROM).

album	One or more recordings issued together; originally released on 12-inch phonograph records (usually with attractive record covers) and later on cassette audiotape and compact disc. <i>The wedding pictures had pride of place in the family album.</i>
band	A range of frequencies or wavelengths in a spectrum. <i>A long narrow band of cloud.</i>
circle	Something approximating the shape of a circle. <i>They had excellent seats in the dress circle.</i>
circlet	A circular band, typically one made of precious metal, worn on the head as an ornament.

discus	An athletic competition in which a disk-shaped object is thrown as far as possible.
disk	A memory device consisting of a flat disk covered with a magnetic coating on which information is stored. <i>The moon s disk hung in a cloudless sky.</i>
gramophone record	An antique record player; the sound of the vibrating needle is amplified acoustically.
hoop	Horizontal circular metal hoop supporting a net through which players try to throw the basketball. <i>A woman in hoops and crinoline.</i>
lp	A long-playing phonograph record; designed to be played at 33.3 rpm.
phonograph record	Machine in which rotating records cause a stylus to vibrate and the vibrations are amplified acoustically or electronically.
phonograph recording	Machine in which rotating records cause a stylus to vibrate and the vibrations are amplified acoustically or electronically.
platter	A quantity of food served on a platter. <i>His son s fascination with a Jimi Hendrix collection prompted him to dig out some old platters.</i>
record	A piece or collection of music reproduced on a record or on another medium. <i>The lawyer has a good record.</i>
ring	The sound of a bell ringing E A Poe. <i>Through traffic is diverted along the outer ring.</i>
<u>round</u>	(sports) a division during which one team is on the offensive. <i>There was a round of applause.</i>
saucer	A small shallow dish for holding a cup at the table.
vinyl	A vinyl record. <i>Vinyl floor tiles.</i>

cardboard	A stiff moderately thick paper. <i>With its superficial cardboard characters the novel was typical of her work.</i>
crescent	Having the shape of a crescent. <i>A three mile crescent of golden sand.</i>
cubic	A cubic equation or a curve described by one. <i>A cubic room.</i>
cycloid	A curve (resembling a series of arches) traced by a point on a circle being rolled along a straight line.

discus	A small colourful South American freshwater fish with a rounded laterally compressed body, native to South America and popular in aquariums.
disk	A memory device consisting of a flat disk covered with a magnetic coating on which information is stored. <i>The moon s disk hung in a cloudless sky.</i>
even	Make or become even. <i>He enjoyed the evening light across the lake.</i>
flat	Of a key having a flat or flats in the signature. <i>Flat computer monitors.</i>
frame	The hard structure bones and cartilages that provides a frame for the body of an animal. <i>An utterance may mean the opposite of what it says if used within a frame of teasing.</i>
fretwork	Ornamental design in wood, typically openwork, done with a fretsaw.
hexagonal	Relating to or constituting a hexagon; having six straight sides and six angles. <i>Small hexagonal pockets of honeycomb.</i>
lattice	An interlaced structure or pattern resembling a lattice. <i>Honeysuckle was growing up a lattice round the door.</i>
latticed	Decorated with or in the form of a lattice. <i>A latticed screen.</i>
oblate	A lay person dedicated to religious work or the religious life.
octagon	An object or building with an octagonal plan or cross section.
pane	A panel or section of panels in a wall or door.
pentagram	A five-pointed star that is formed by drawing a continuous line in five straight segments, often used as a mystic and magical symbol.
pentavalent	Having a valence of five.
pulp	Remove the pulp from as from a fruit. <i>Pulp fruit.</i>
quadrate	(in the skull of a bird or reptile) a squarish bone with which the jaw articulates, thought to be homologous with the incus of the middle ear in mammals. <i>He had to make a creed which would quadrate with his immorality.</i>
record	Sound recording consisting of a disk with a continuous groove used to reproduce music by rotating while a phonograph needle tracks in the groove. <i>The coroner recorded a verdict of accidental death.</i>
saucer	Something with a round shape resembling a flat circular plate.
